## **February Holiday Matching Tic Tac Toe**

This version is for very young children.



- \* Choose the holiday you wish to play (Groundhog Day, Valentine's Day, or President's Day).
- \* Print the tic tac toe game board, the page of 12 picture-only cards, and the x and o markers at the end (or you can use your own markers).
- \* Cut apart the picture-only cards. Mix them up and place them face down on the table.
- \* The first player draws one card and then places one of his markers on a corresponding picture on the tic tac toe board. Lay the card off to the side.
- \* Turn continues with the next person.
- \* If a picture-only card is drawn and there are no remaining matching squares on the tic tac toe board, the player lays the card off to the side and does not get to play a marker.
- \* Game ends when someone gets tic tac toe. If all the spaces on the tic tac toe board are covered and no one has a tic tac toe, the game ends in a tie (or the winner can be declared as the one who has covered the most spaces).

## **February Holiday Trivia Tic Tac Toe**

This version is for young children.

- \* Choose the holiday you wish to play (Groundhog Day, Valentine's Day, or President's Day).
- \* Print the tic tac toe game board, the page of trivia questions, the blank page of cards (if you wish to add your own questions to the game), and the x and o markers at the end (or you can use your own markers).
- \* Cut apart the trivia cards. Shuffle them and set them beside the game board.
- \* The first player draws a card and asks the second player the question. If the second player gets the answer correct, he can place his marker on a space on the game board whose picture corresponds with one of the two pictures on the trivia card. If the player gets the answer incorrect, he does not play. Play continues by asking the next player a question.
- \* Game ends when someone gets tic tac toe. If all the spaces on the tic tac toe board are covered and no one has a tic tac toe, the game ends in a tie (or the winner can be declared as the one who has covered the most spaces).
