

WORLD EXPLORERS AND TRAVELERS GAME

What do you know about world explorers and travelers? In this game, you and your opponents will take turns answering questions about men and women from Pytheas to Neil Armstrong and beyond. Each time you get an answer correct, move the amount you rolled on the die. But wait—there is a catch. As you move around the board, you may have to travel around a continent to do some of your own exploring.



Preparing the Game:

1. Attach two file folders together by overlapping one side so you have three parts to glue the game board to. Attach the game board to the three parts of the file folders, putting the middle piece on last so you can overlap the first space on either side of the middle piece of the game board with the corresponding space on the first and last pieces of the game board.
2. Cut out the question cards and the direction cards. If they are printed on cardstock or printed on paper and laminated, they will hold up longer, but they can be used just as easily if printed on regular copy paper.
3. Each player must have a token to use to move around the board. It can be from another game, you can use beans or buttons. Each player must be able to identify their own token as they move around the board.

Playing the Game:

1. Decide which player will be first. This can be done by age, roll of a die, or whatever means you decide.
2. Mix the question cards completely and place in a stack beside the game board.
3. Mix the direction cards completely and place them in a separate stack beside the game board.
4. The first player rolls the die. Before they move, they must answer a question. The player to their left draws a card and asks the question, giving the three choices for the answer. If they answer the question correctly, they can move the amount rolled on the die. If they do not answer the question correctly, they must stay where they are and wait for their next turn.
5. The question card is then placed face down in a discard pile beside the game board. Play passes to the next player.
6. If a player, at any time, lands on a gray space, they must draw a card from the stack of direction cards and follow the directions given on their next relevant turn. The instructions on the direction card have priority over the directions on the game board or any other card or space.
7. If a player, at any time during the game, lands on a blue space that has an arrow on it, they must go in the direction the arrow points on their next turn. This may mean they have to travel around a continent.
8. The game continues until one player has traveled completely around the board (the world).
9. The first player to completely travel around the board (the world) wins.
