Aircraft Decoding

During a war, the airmen of the Air Force will often receive their orders in code. They have to be able to understand the code to complete their mission. If you were a radio operator on a plane and somehow intercepted a message that the enemy was sending, you would have to send it to the correct department to have it decoded.

Try to decode the following names of a few of the aircraft used throughout history by the Air Force (formerly the Air Corps and Army Air Corps). Use the following information to help you discover what the code is to decipher the names of the aircraft.

If you look at an alphabet, it has 26 letters, from a -z. You would normally number a as 1 through z as 26. In this code, each letter has a different number. A may be 2; it could be 5; or it could be 20. The codes are uniform, so if a is 2, then b is 3, and so on. It is also possible that the puzzle is numbered backward. See if you can break the code, then using the decoded letter and number key, decide what letter each number is and then decode the puzzle.
