

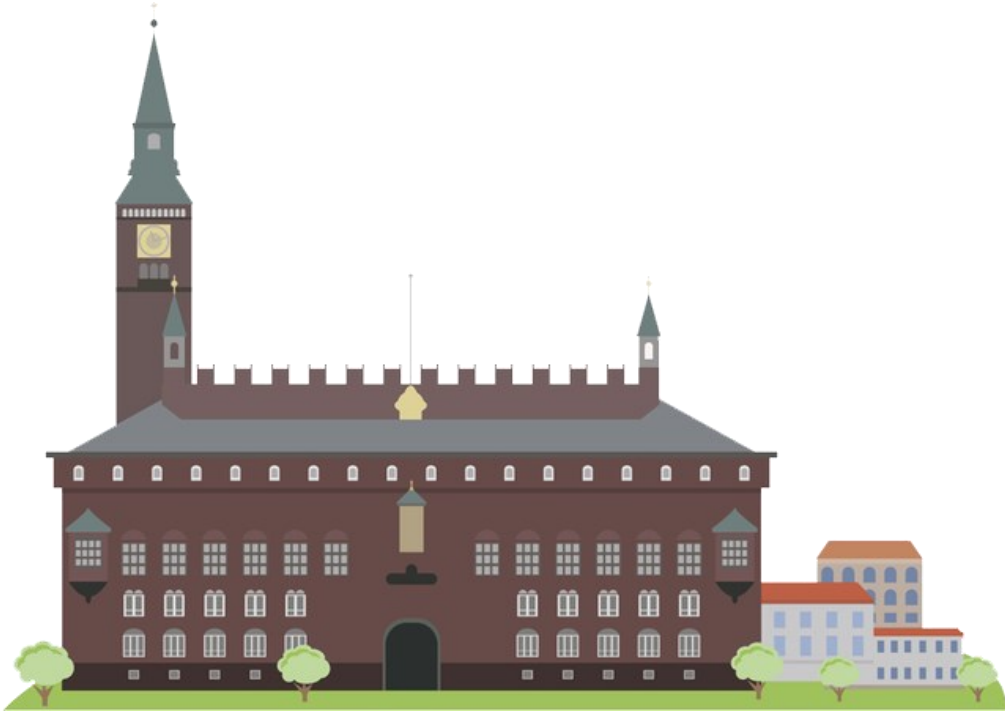


Denmark

Denmark is a country with a lot of pieces! Most of the country is on the peninsula of Jutland in western Europe, but the country also includes more than 400 islands that are close by. Copenhagen, Denmark's capital, is on the biggest of these islands. The only other country that Denmark touches is Germany. All the rest of the country is surrounded by water. Sometimes people use the term Scandinavia

to mean Denmark, Norway, and Sweden, two of its neighbors across the water. The Vikings of long ago came from Scandinavia and the island of Iceland.

Today, more than five million Danish people live in Denmark. The country is a constitutional monarchy and is ruled by a queen. It first became independent around the year A.D. 965. It became a constitutional monarchy in 1849.
