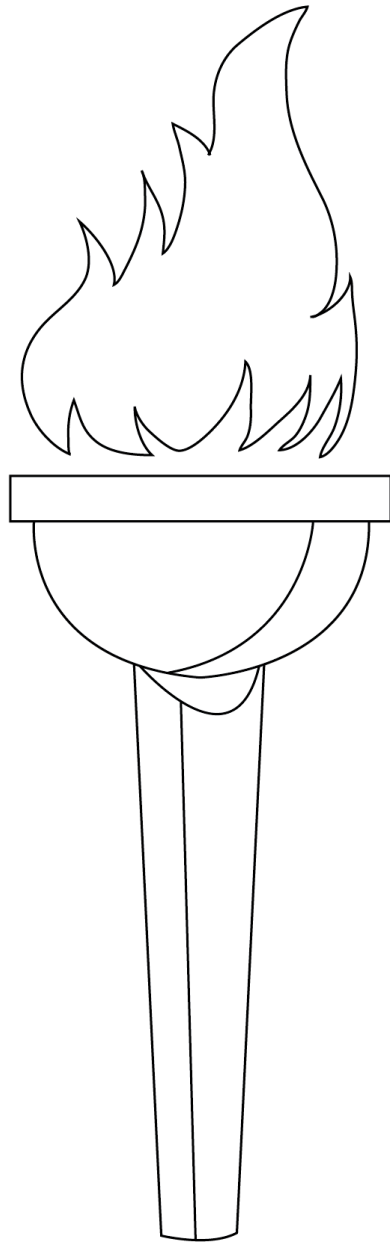
Olives were a very

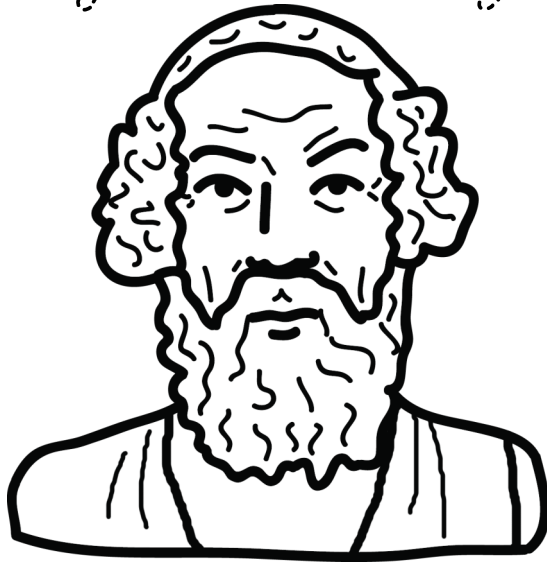
People used scrolls

Ancient Greek dramatists

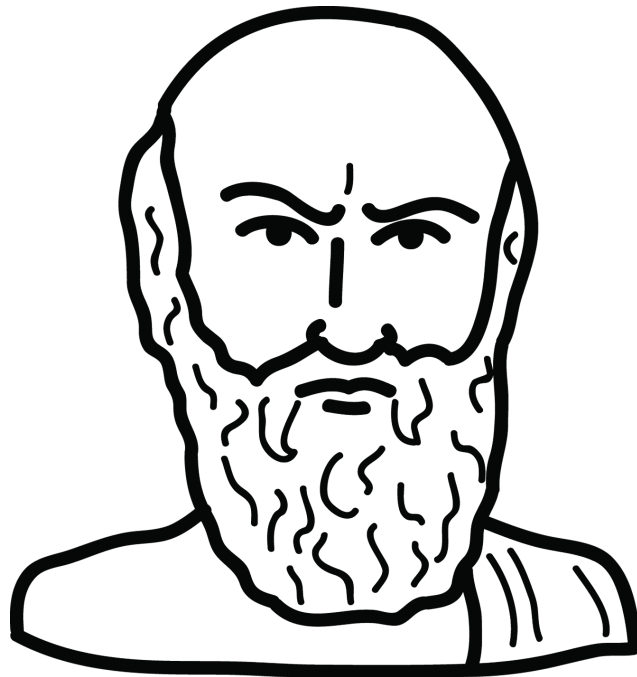
wrote poetry to be

Aeschylus.

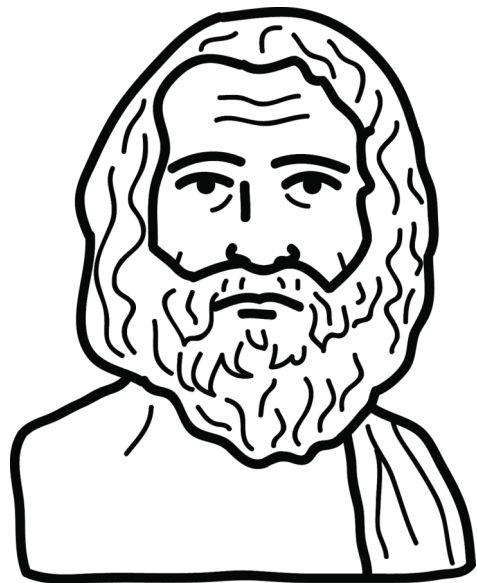

Sophocles and



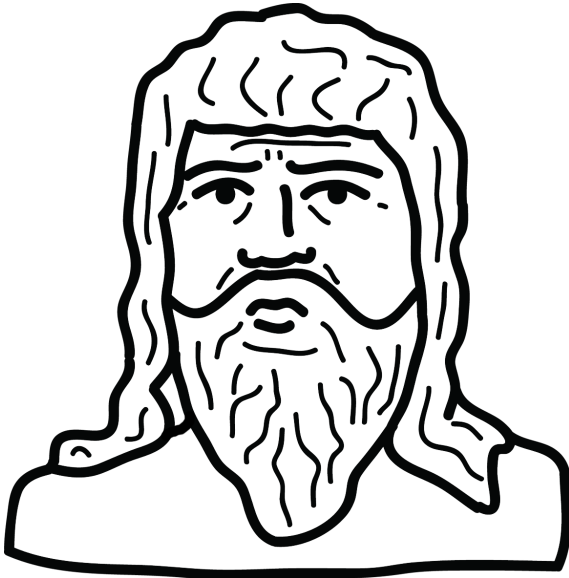
