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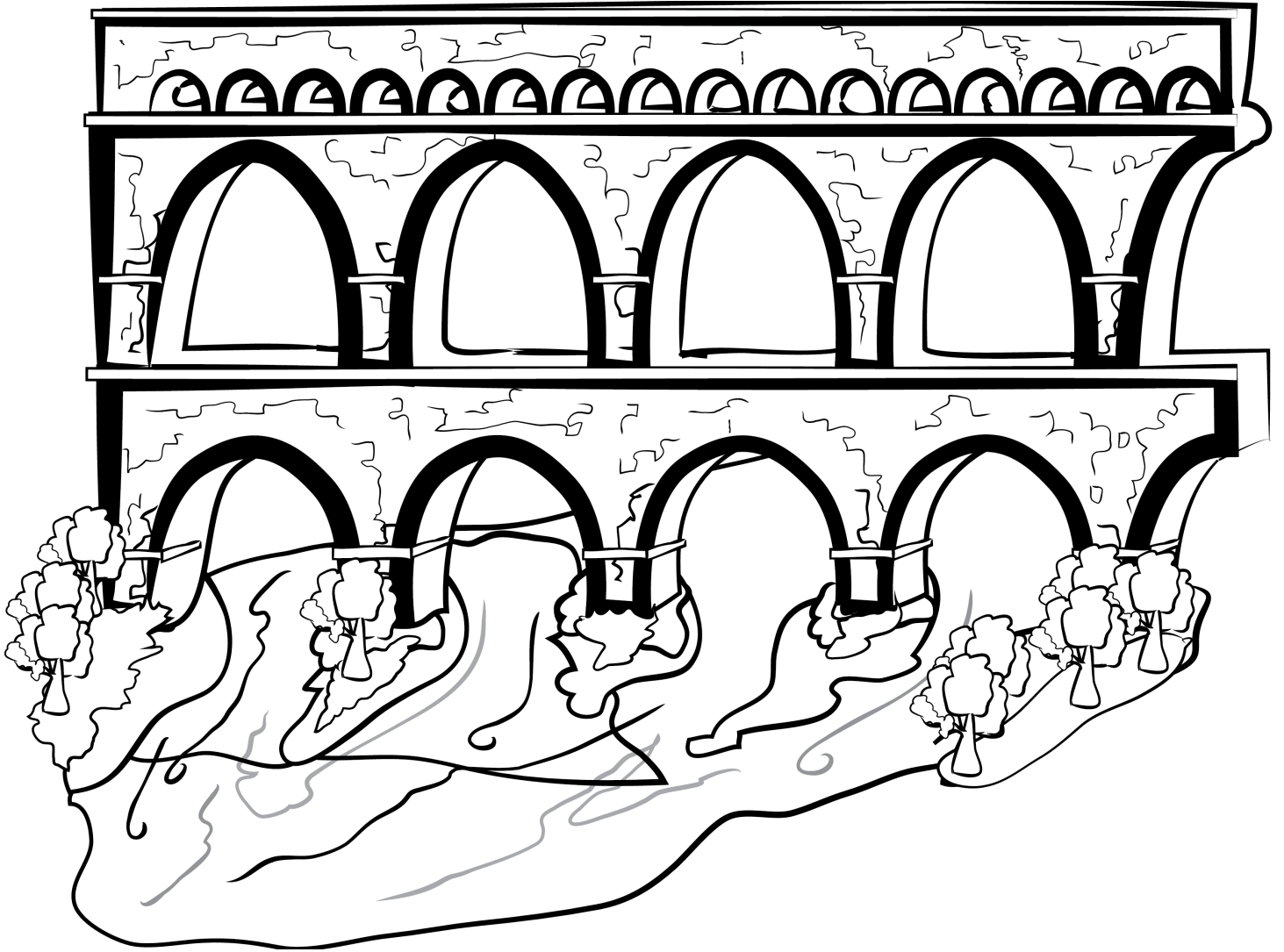

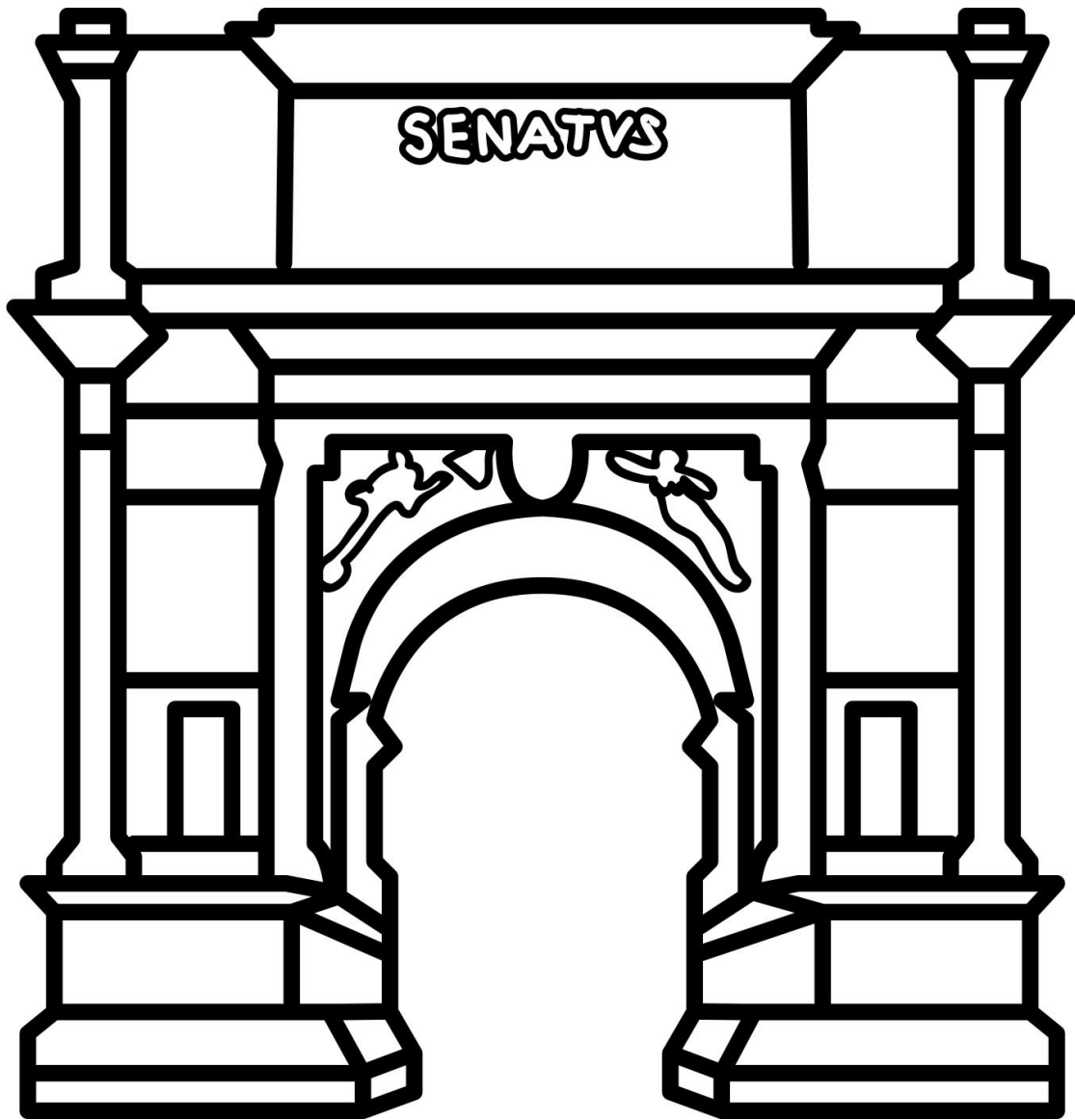
Romans

with the Jewish people.

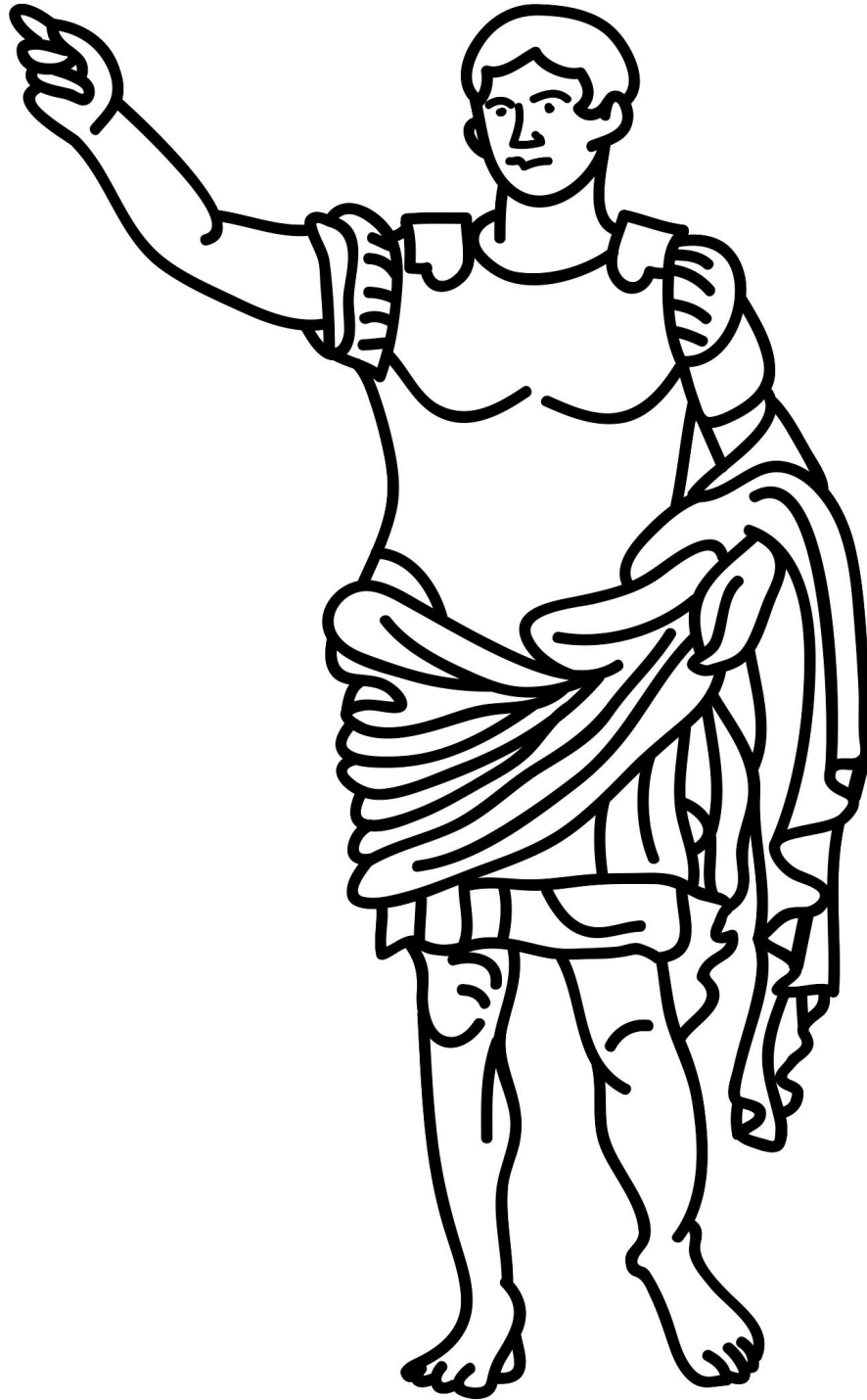


Julius Caesar was elected

as consul in 59 B.C. He

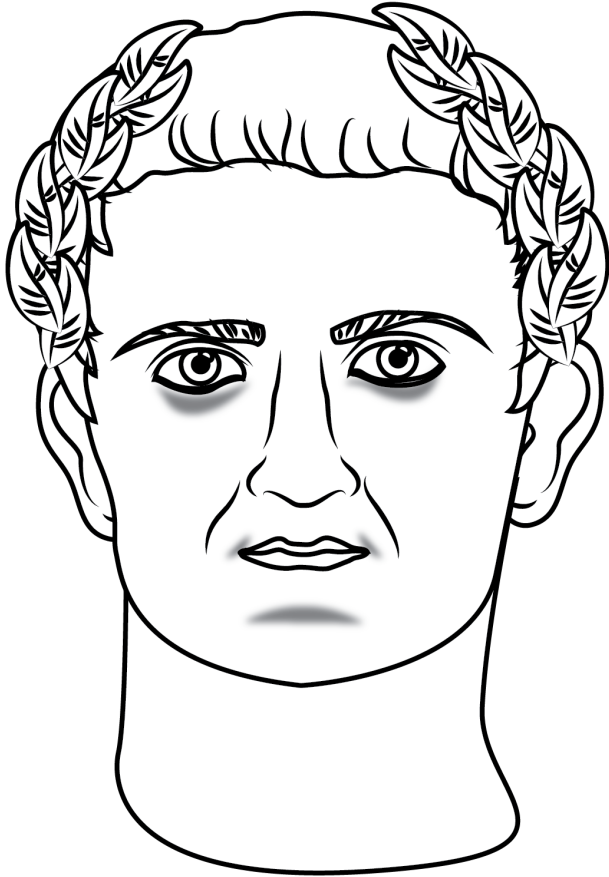
became very powerful but

was not truly an emperor.

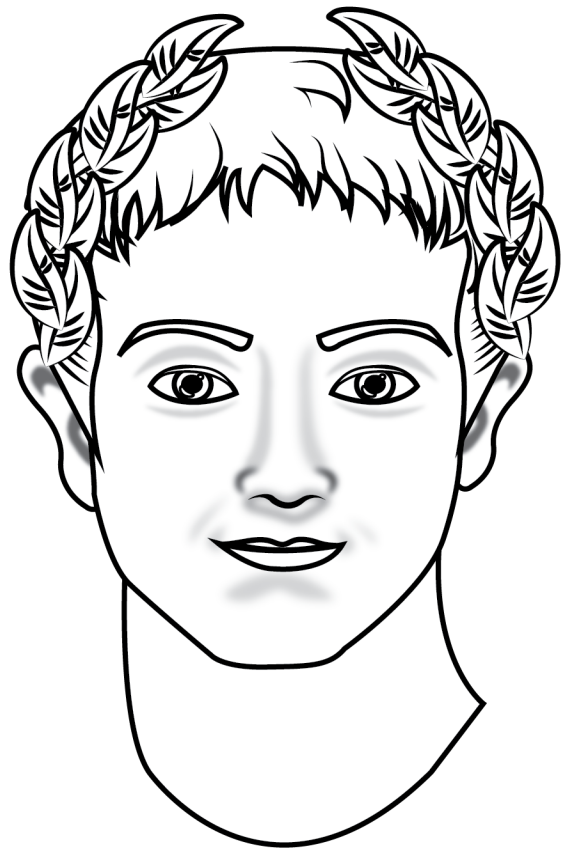


Augustus was the first

Claudio,



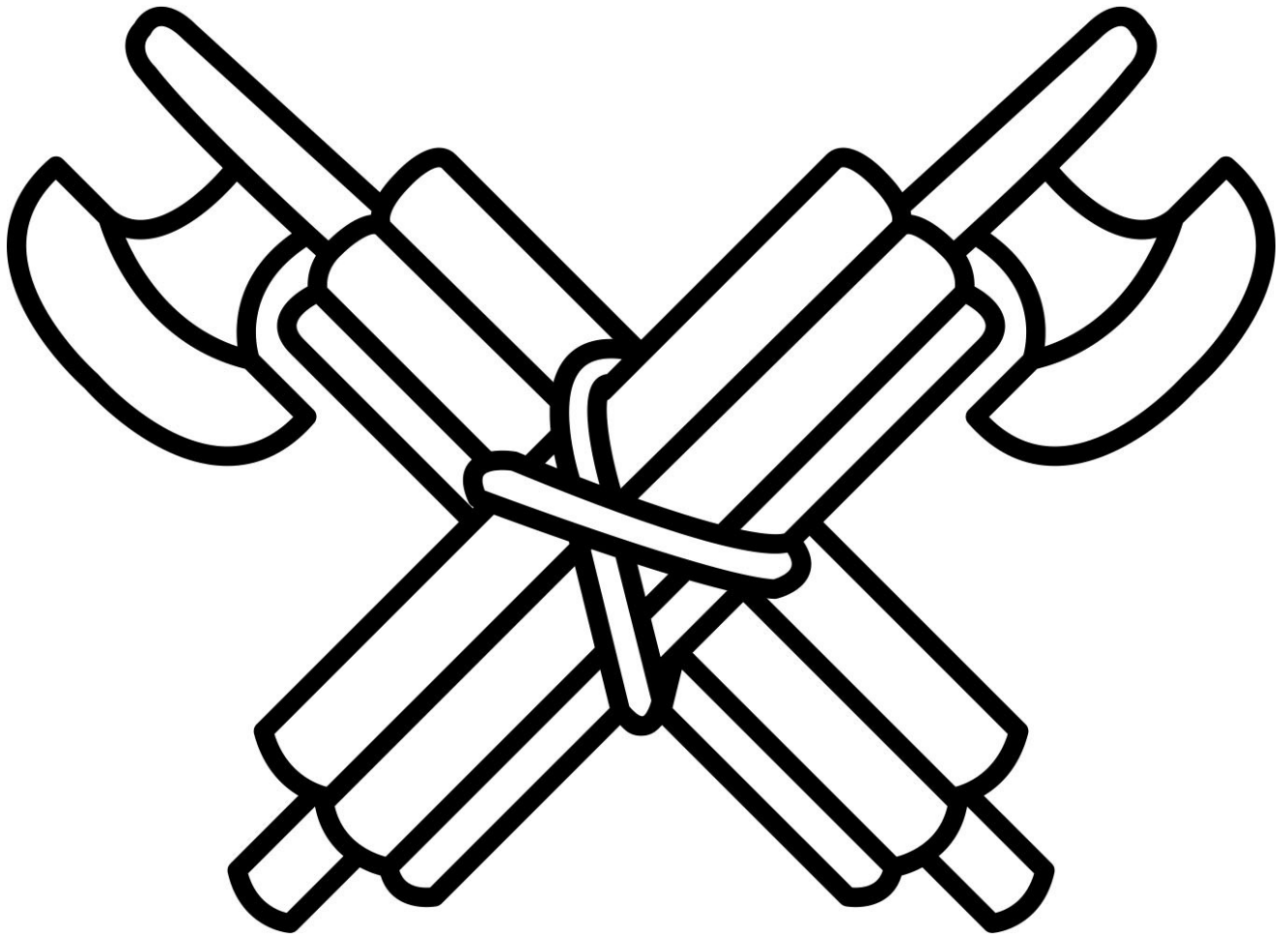

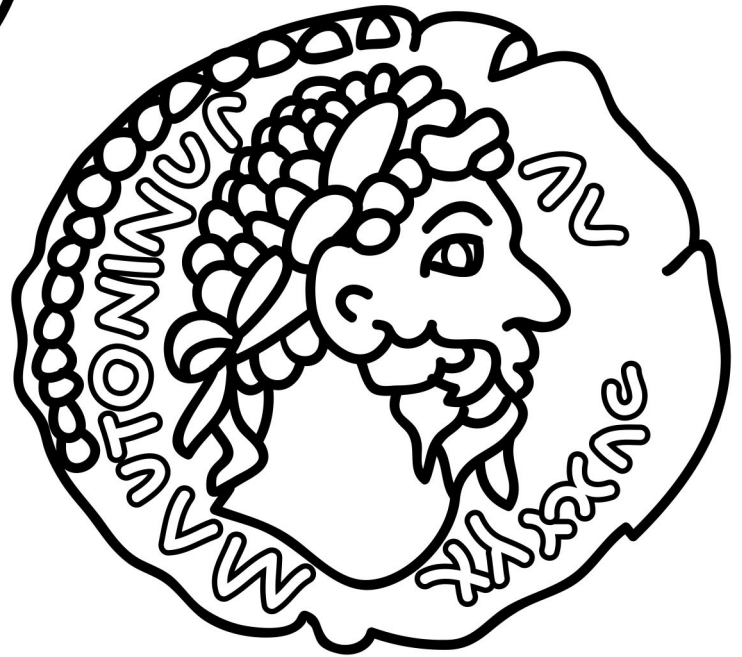
The fasces was a symbol
of official authority.



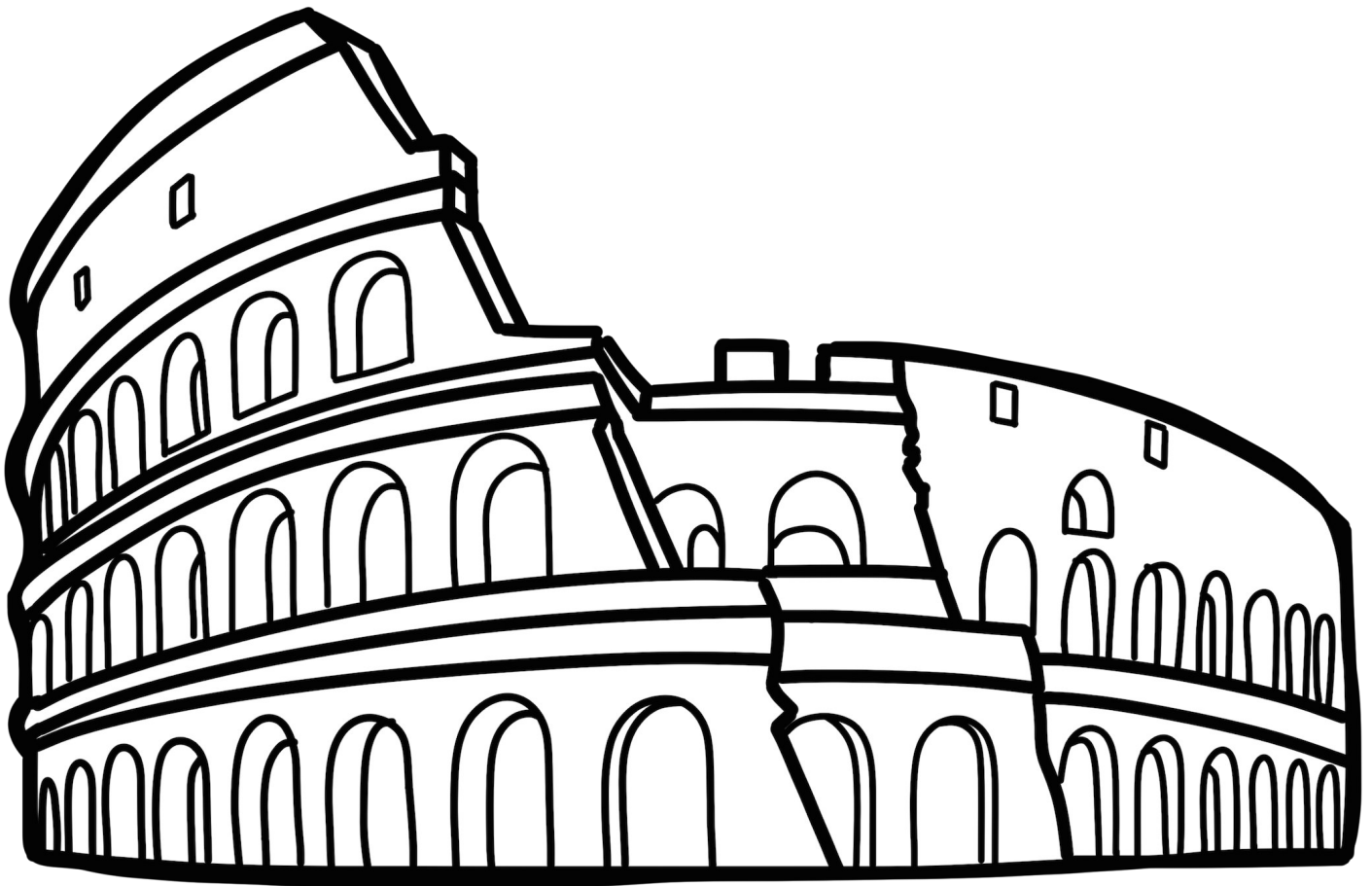
Chariot racing was

children do today.



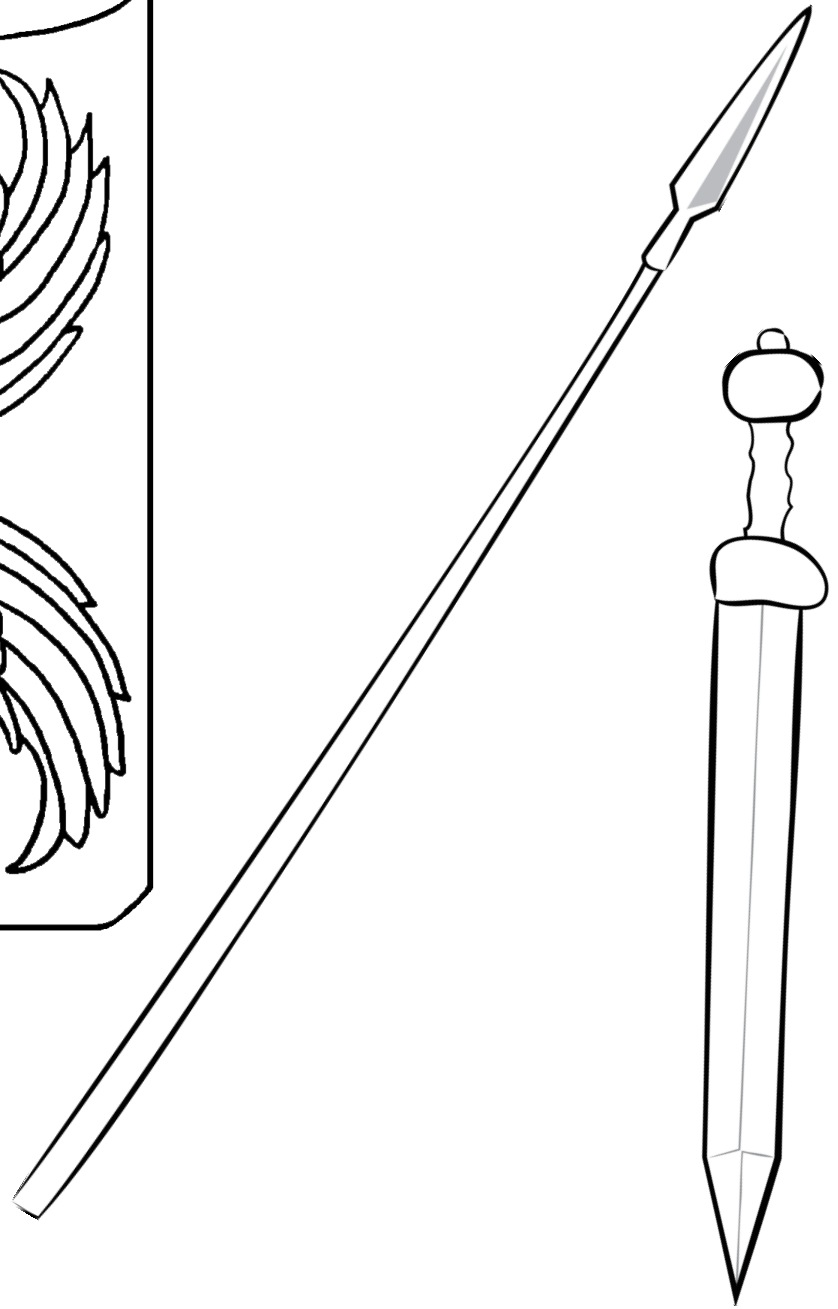
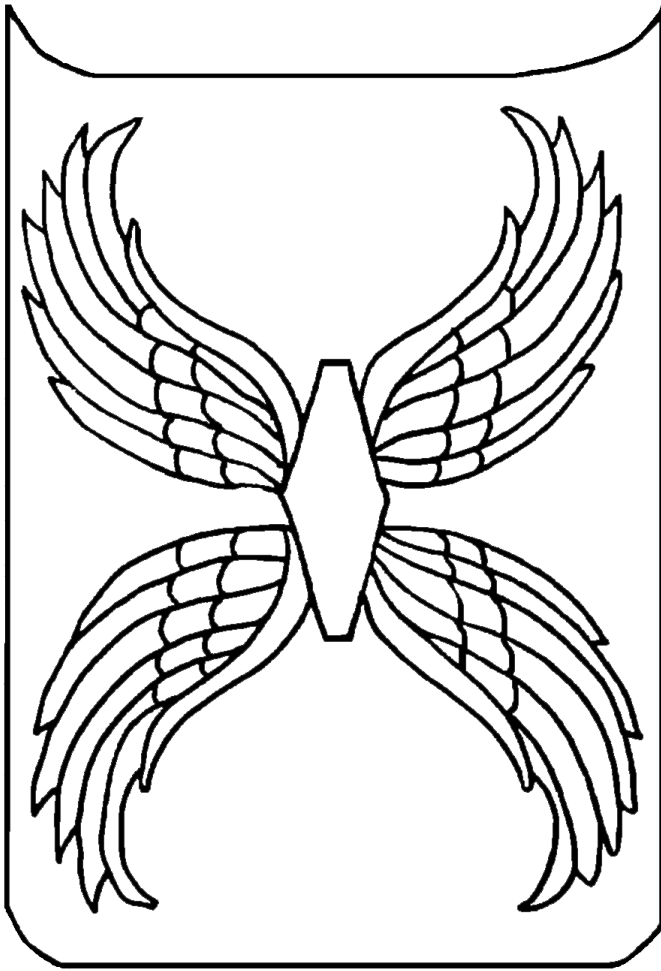
Romans used many

at the Colosseum.



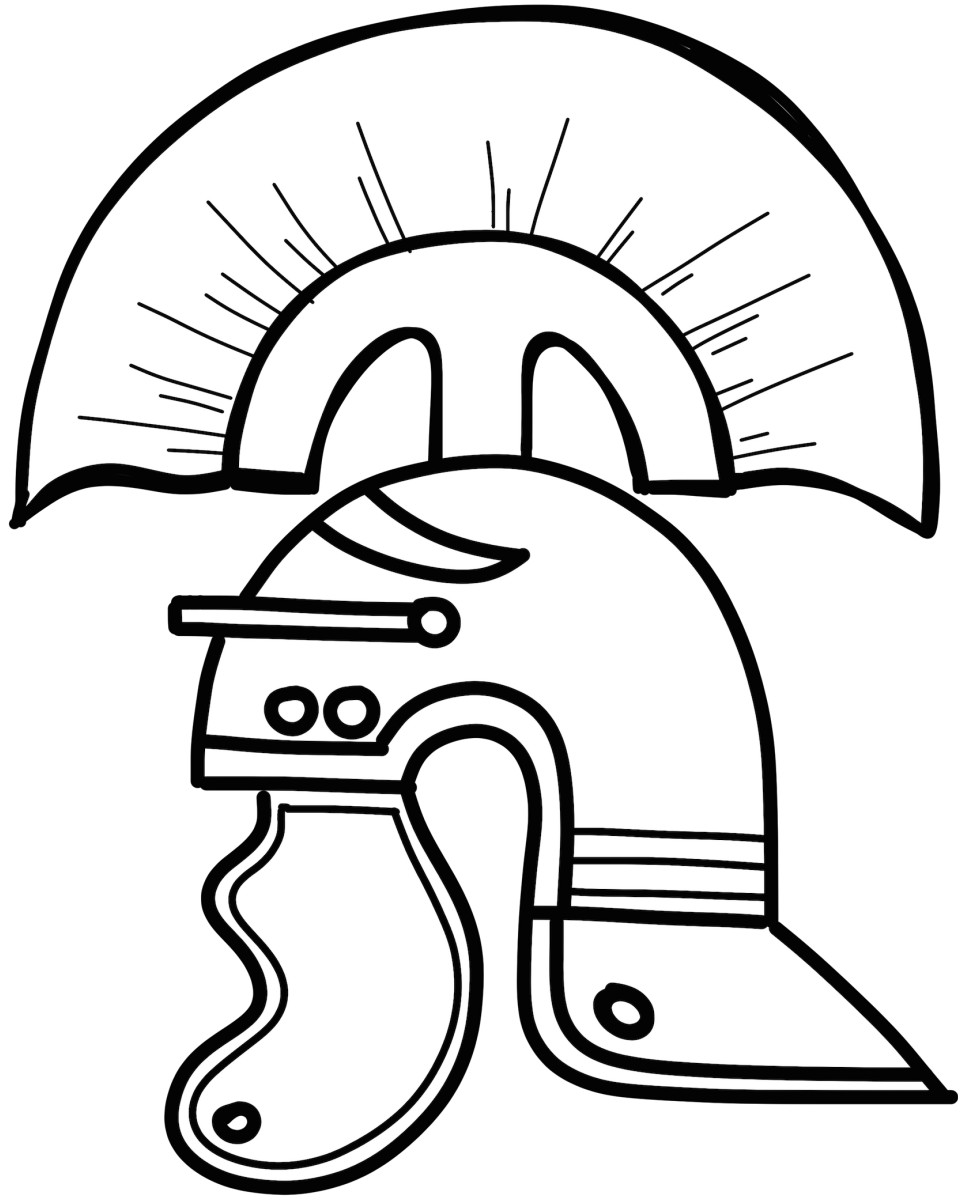
The name "gladiator"

word for swordsman.



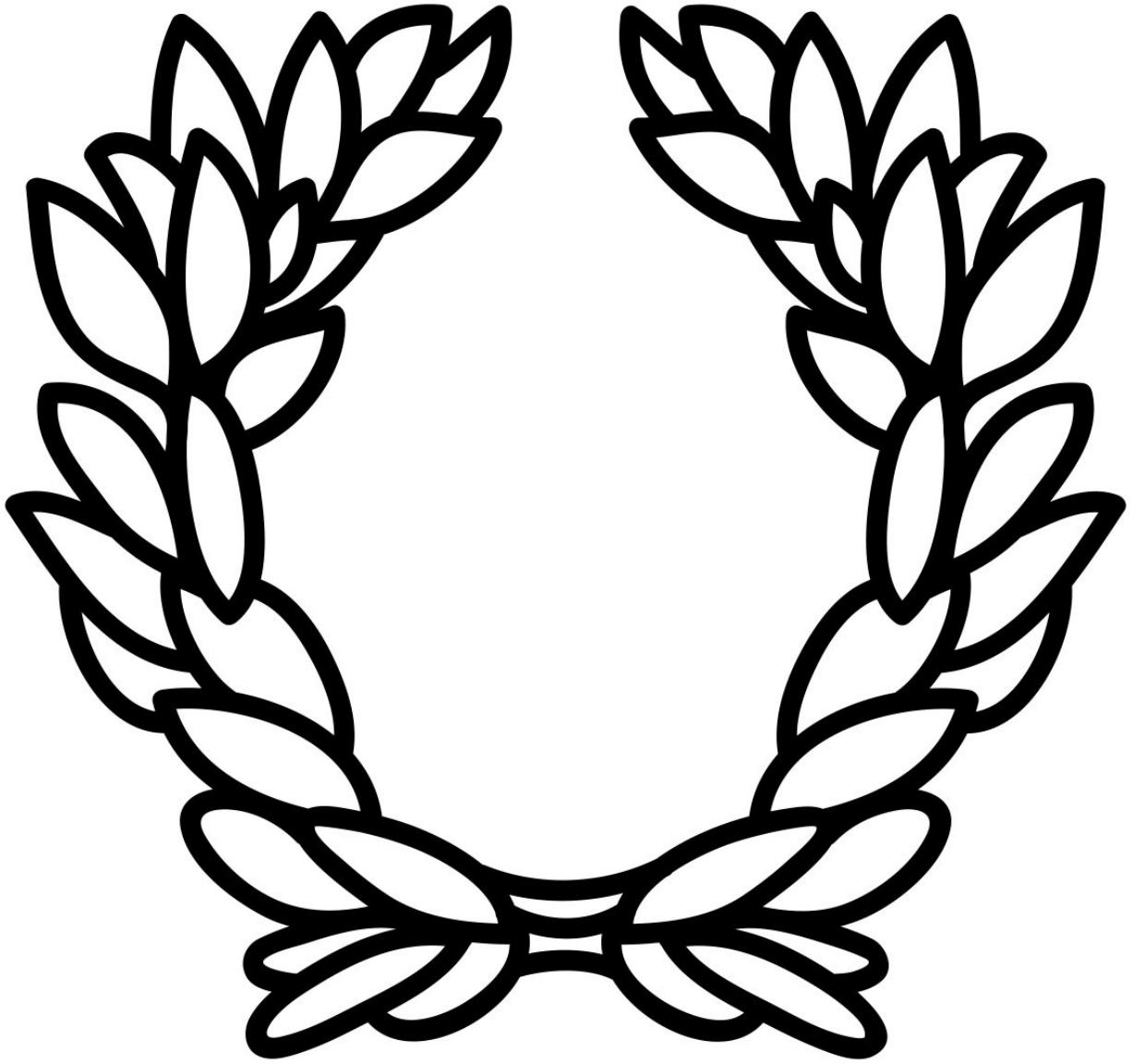
Shields, spears, and

swords were used

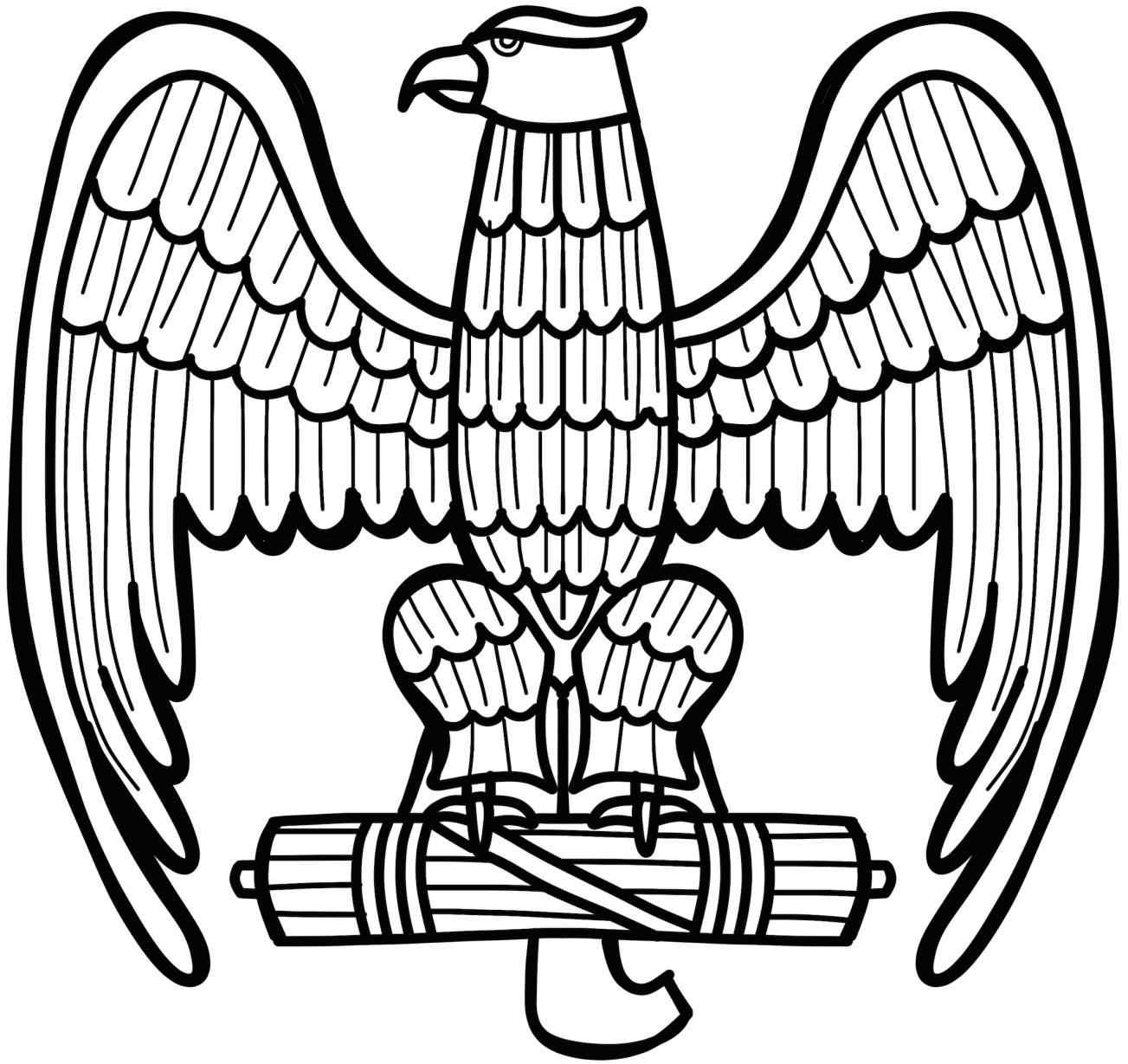
in battle.

gold laurel wreaths.



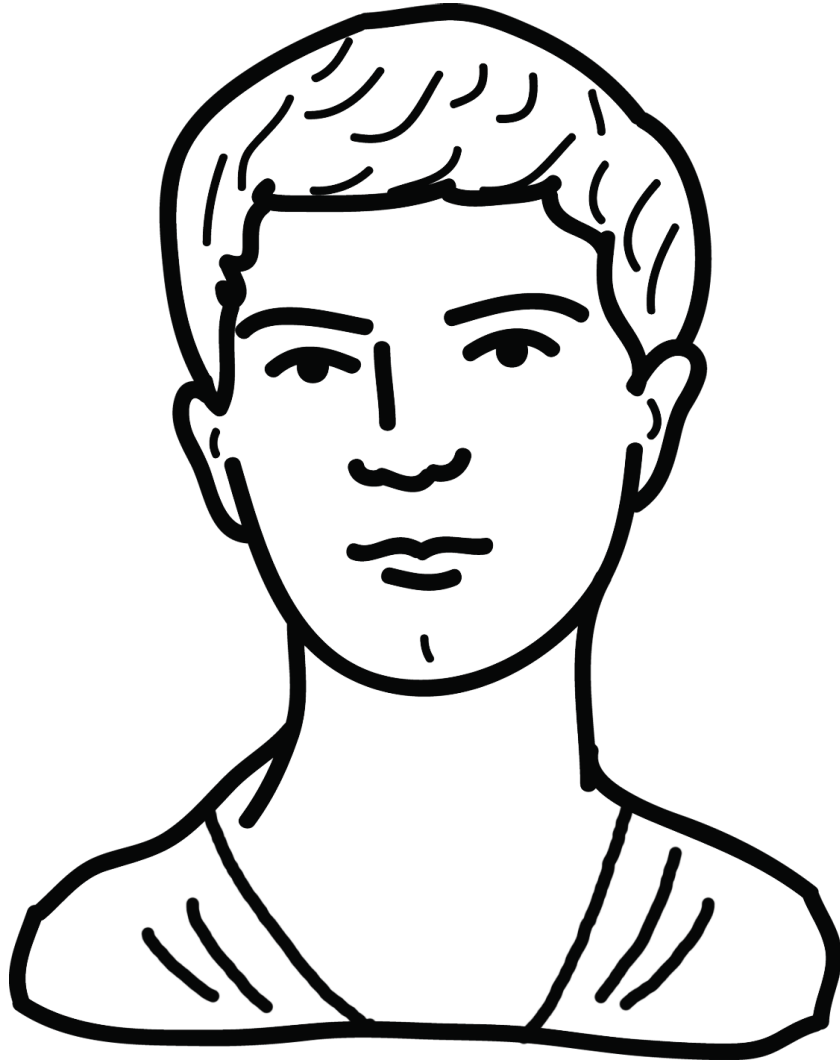
The eagle was a

Roman troops used.



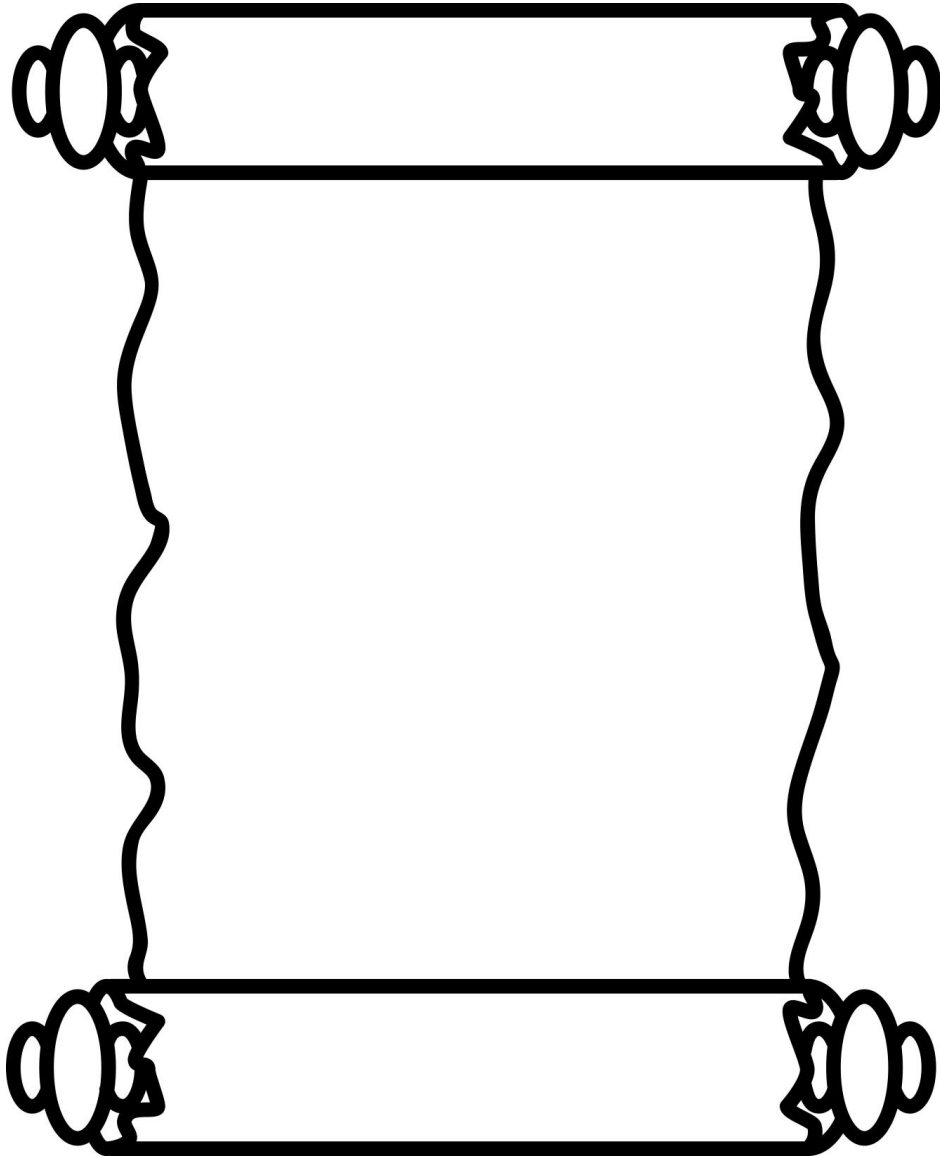
Horace was a Roman poet.

of Horace.



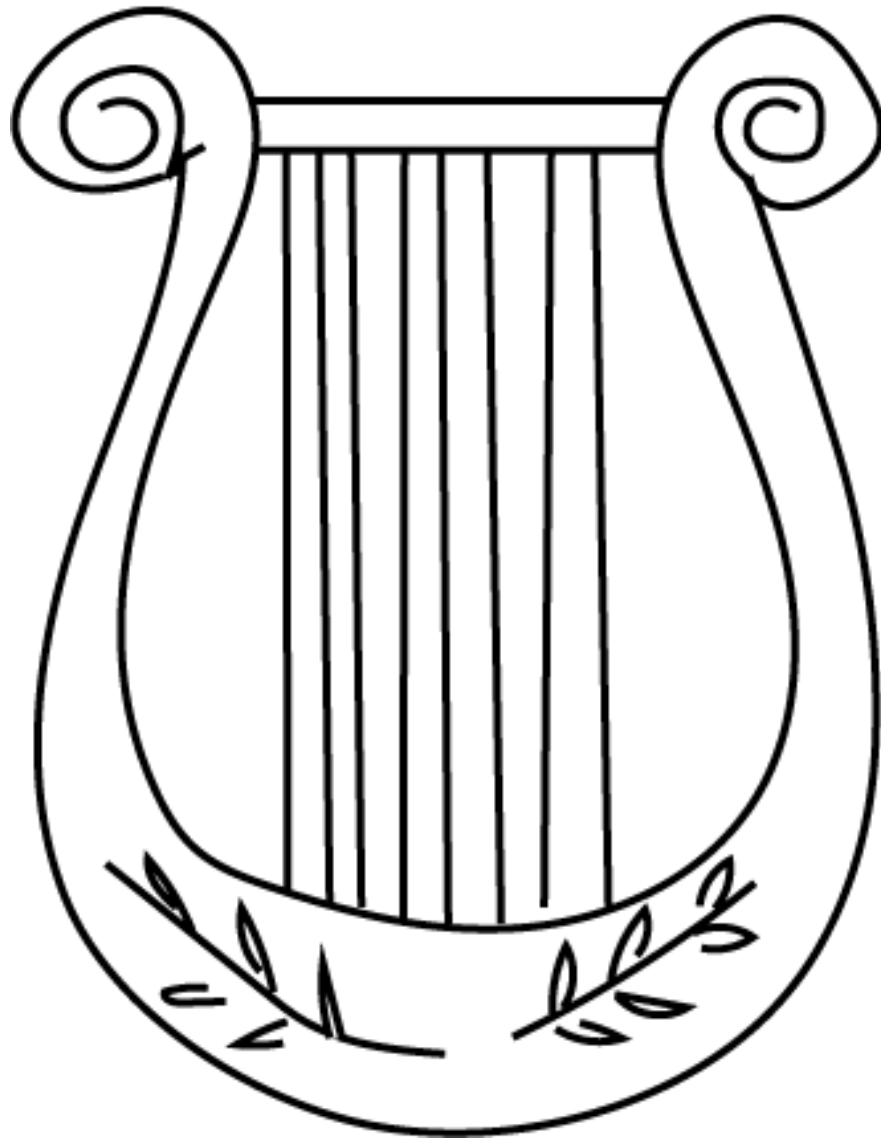
Virgil was a Roman poet

parchment were popular

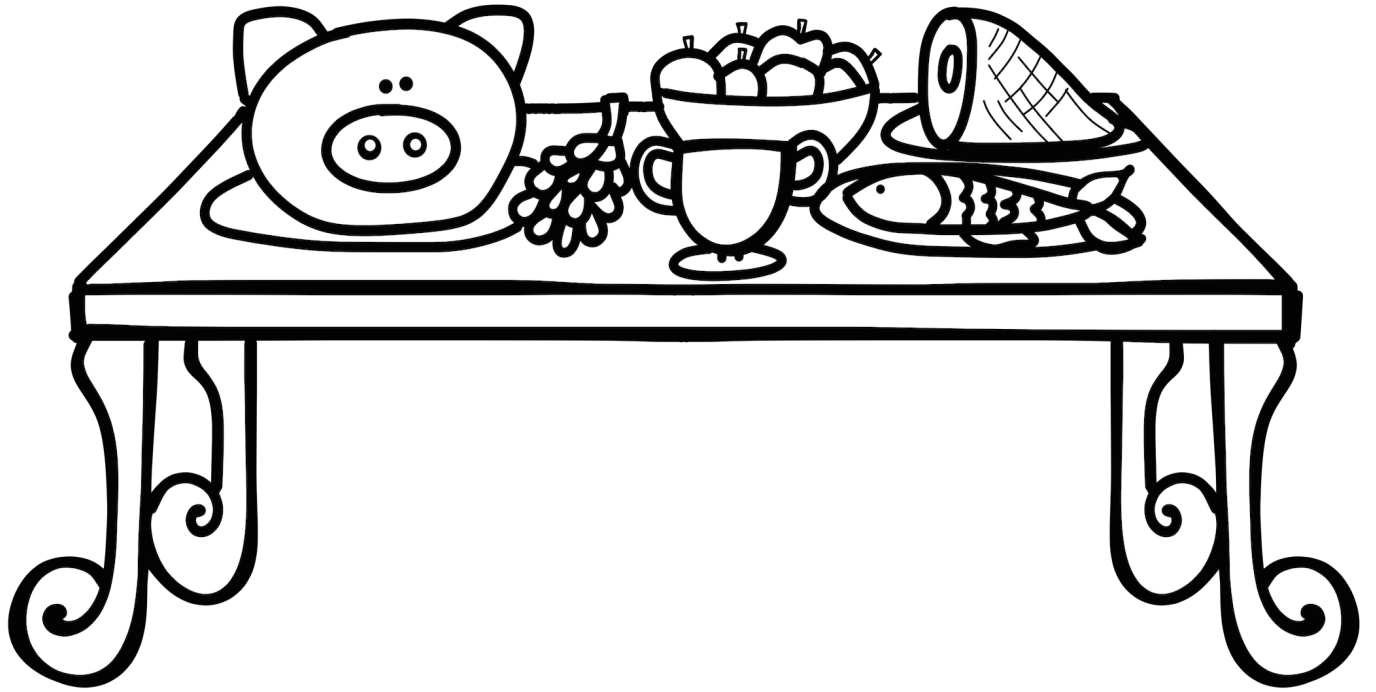
for writing on.



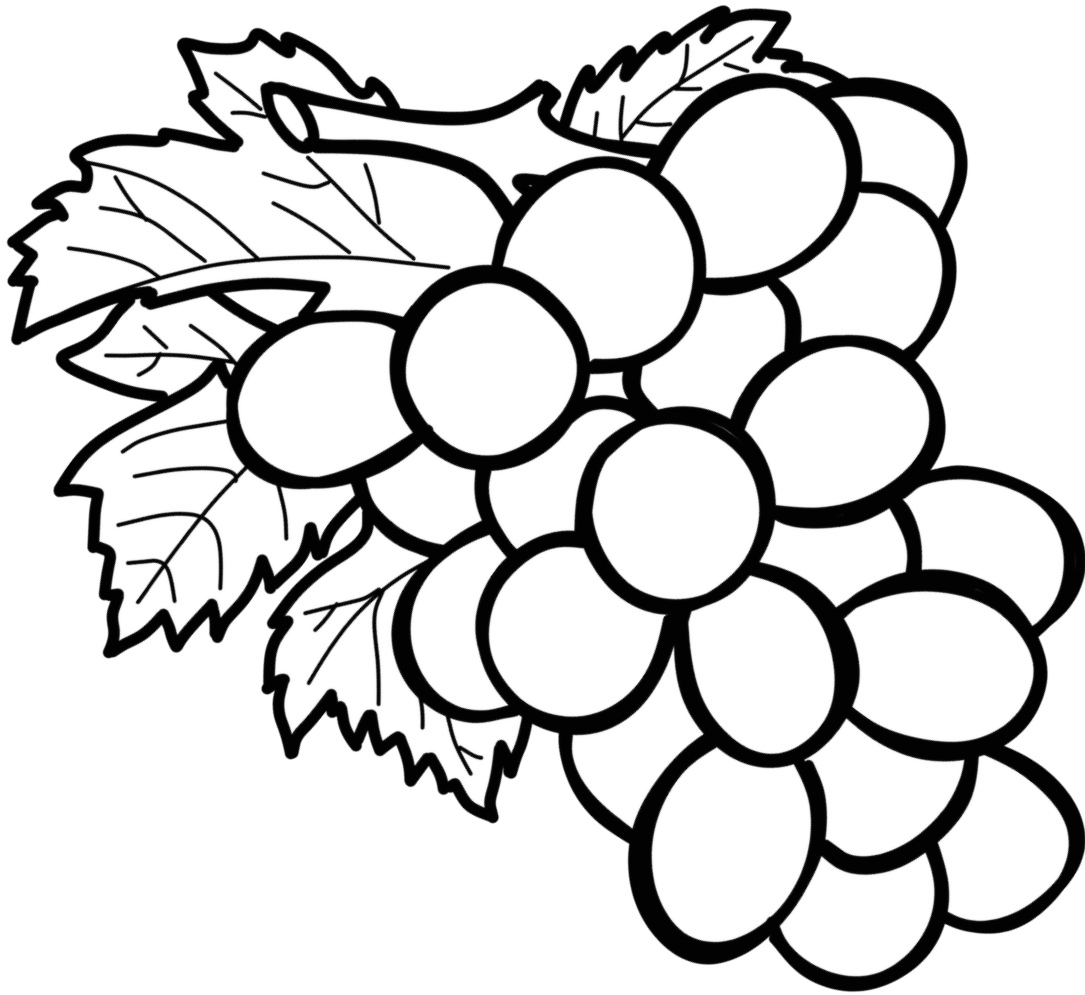
The harp was a

musical instrument.



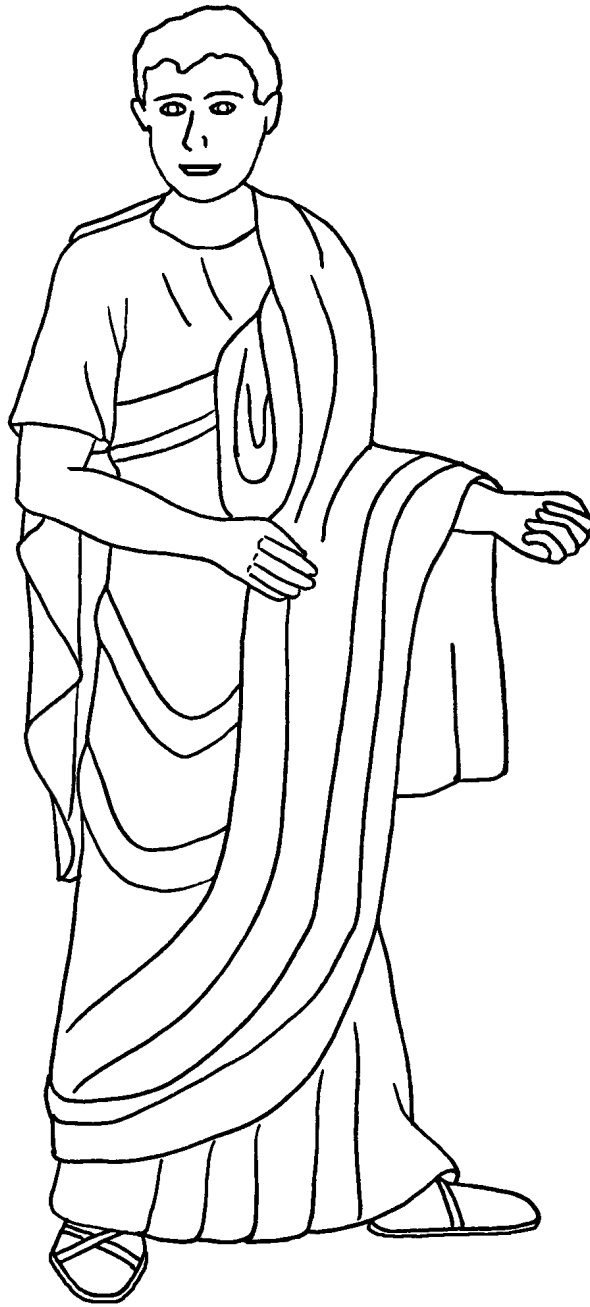
Rich Romans

people couldn't afford.



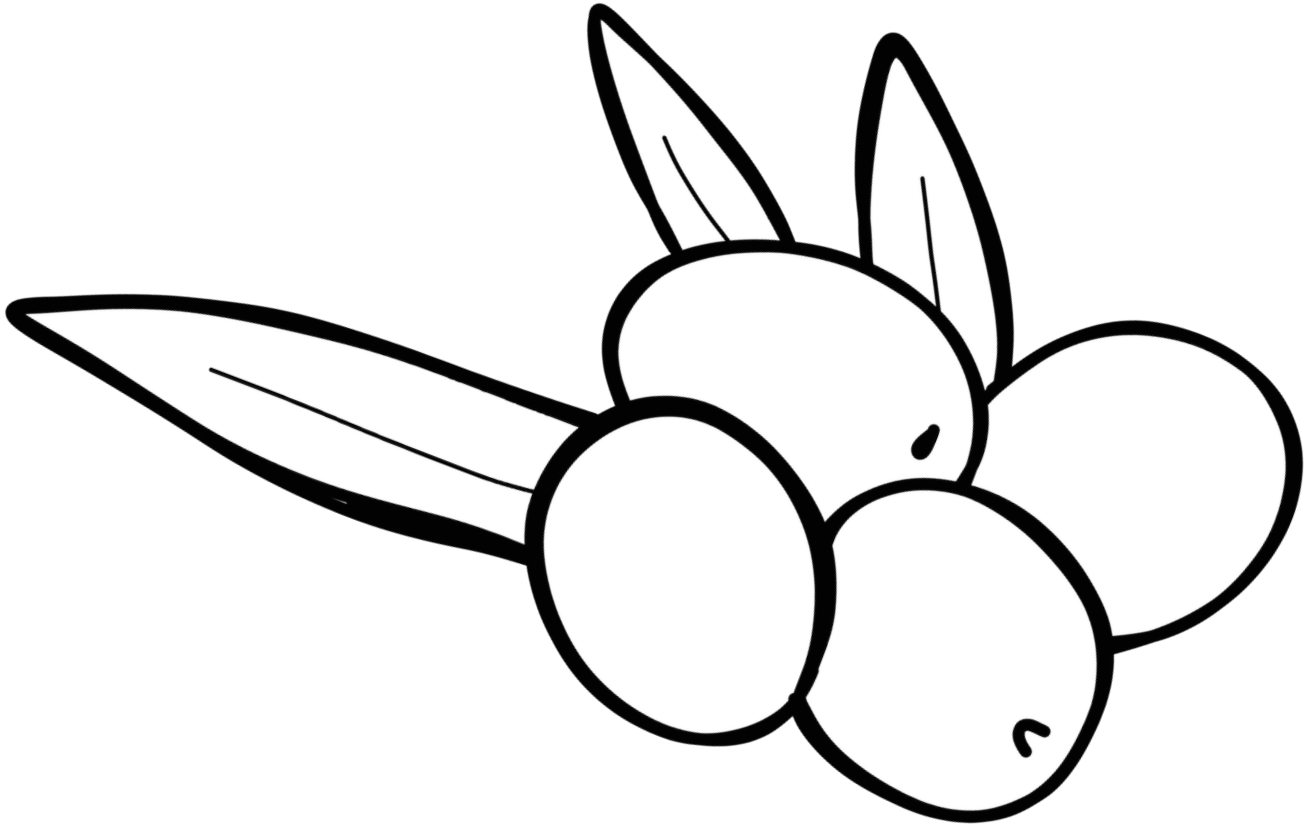
Grapes were a

of the Roman Empire.



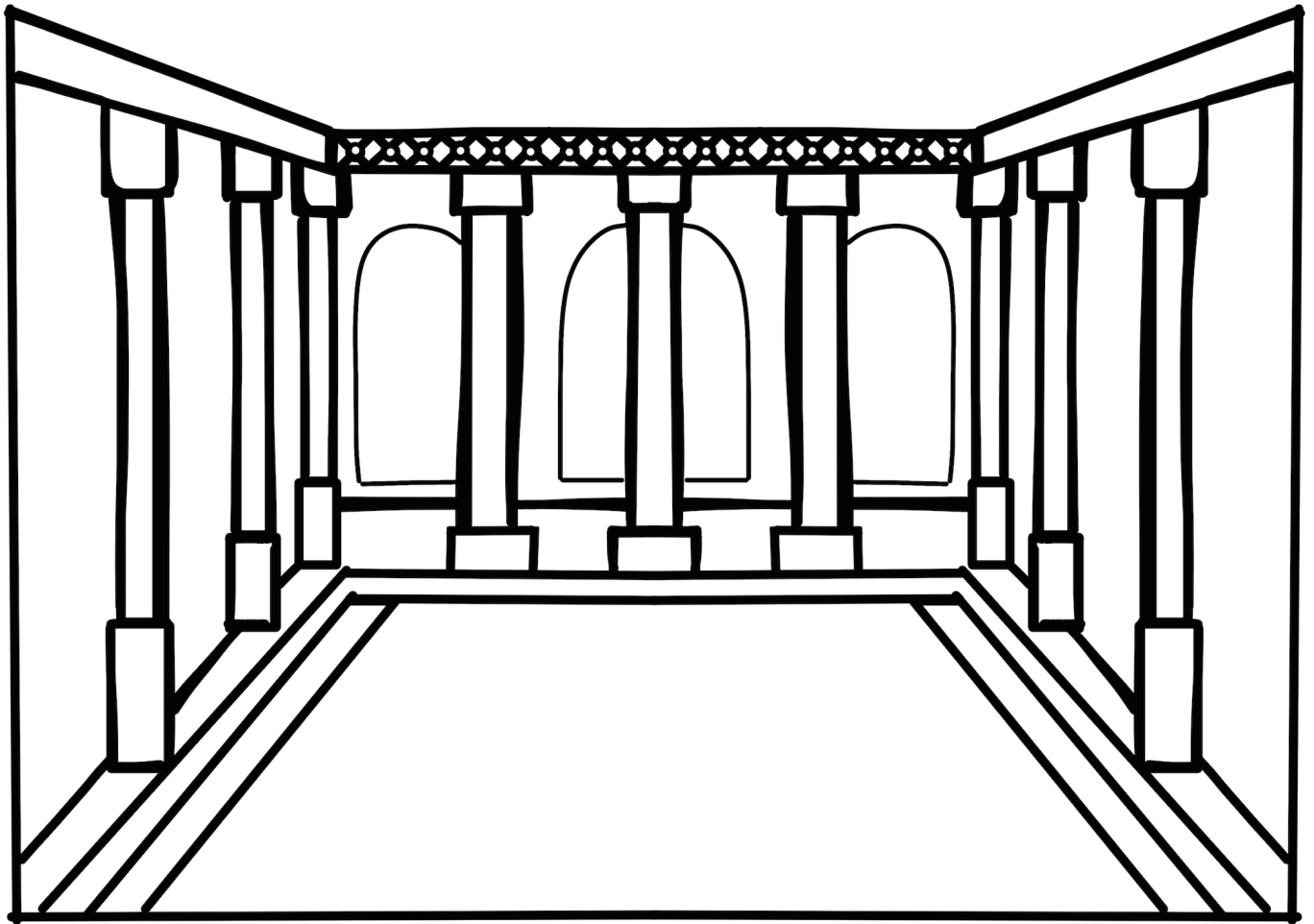
Pottery was used for

citizen they belonged to.

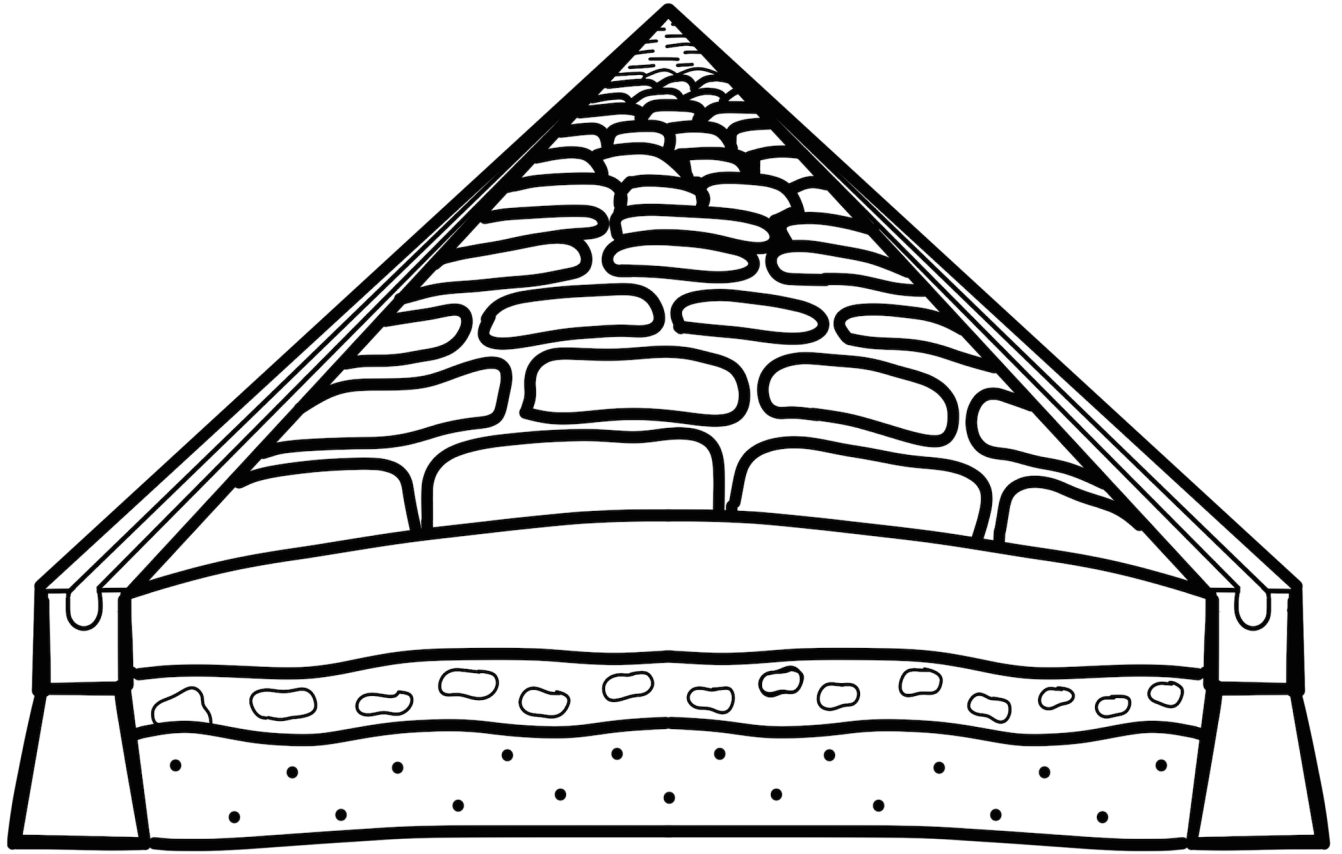


Oil from olives was used

cooking and medicine.

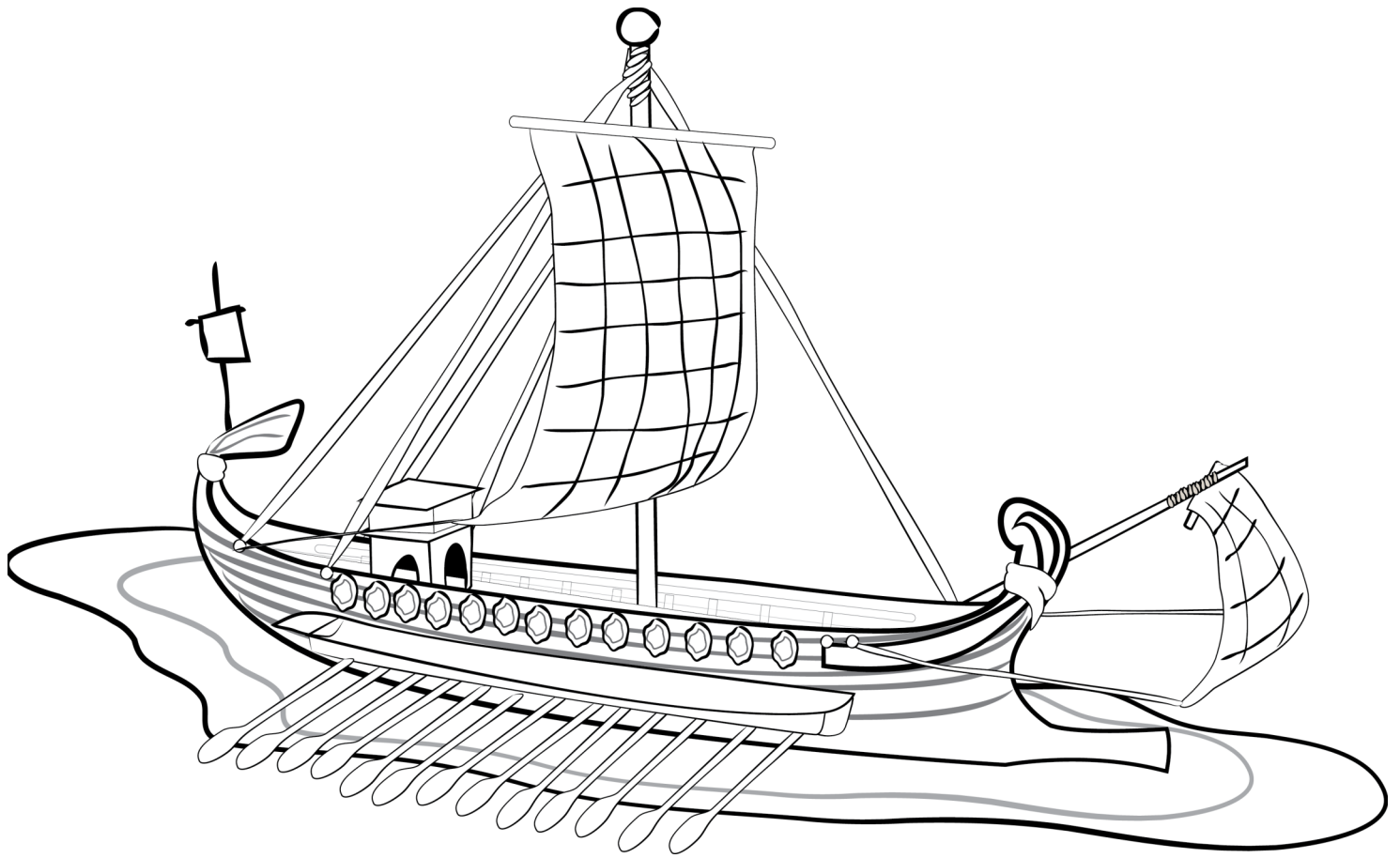


Roman baths were

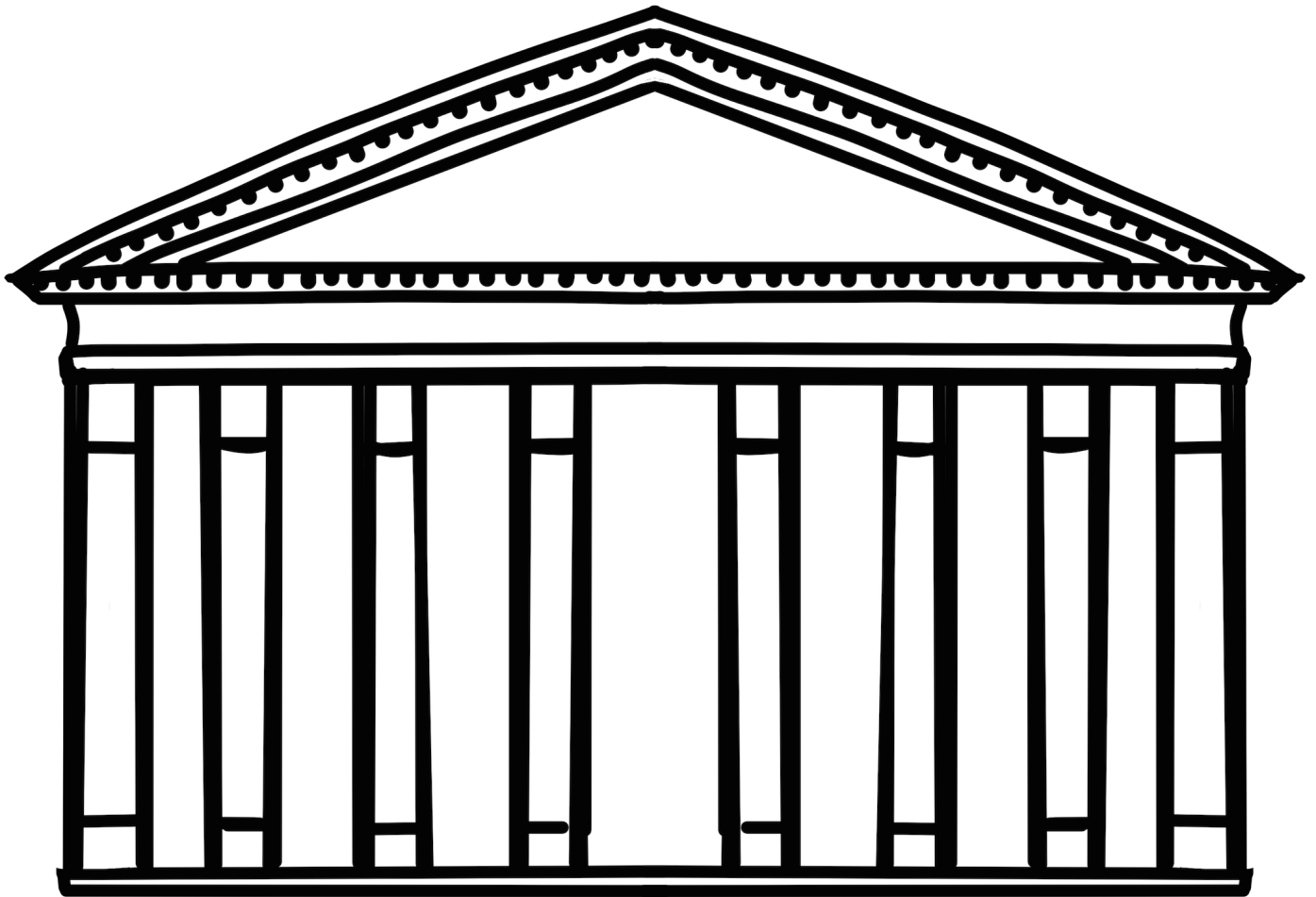
public meeting places.
