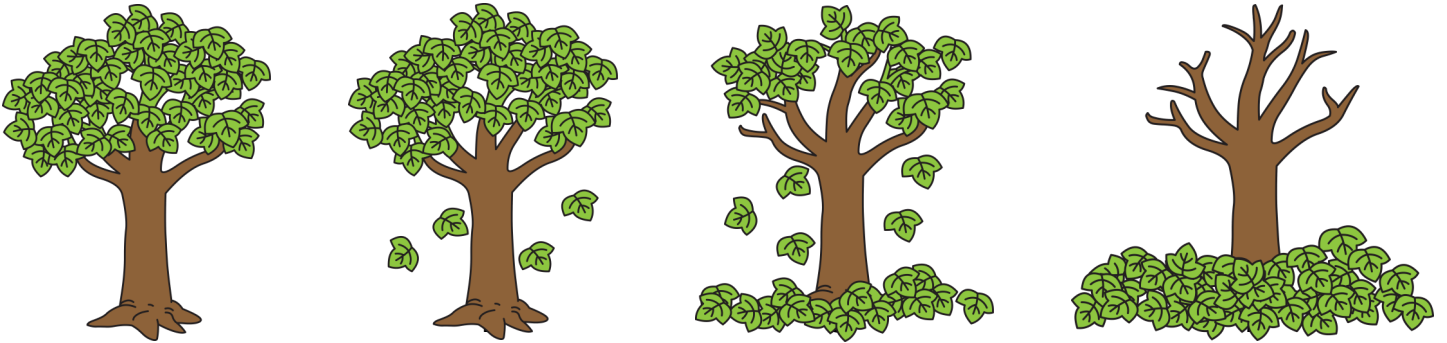

Changes Over Time

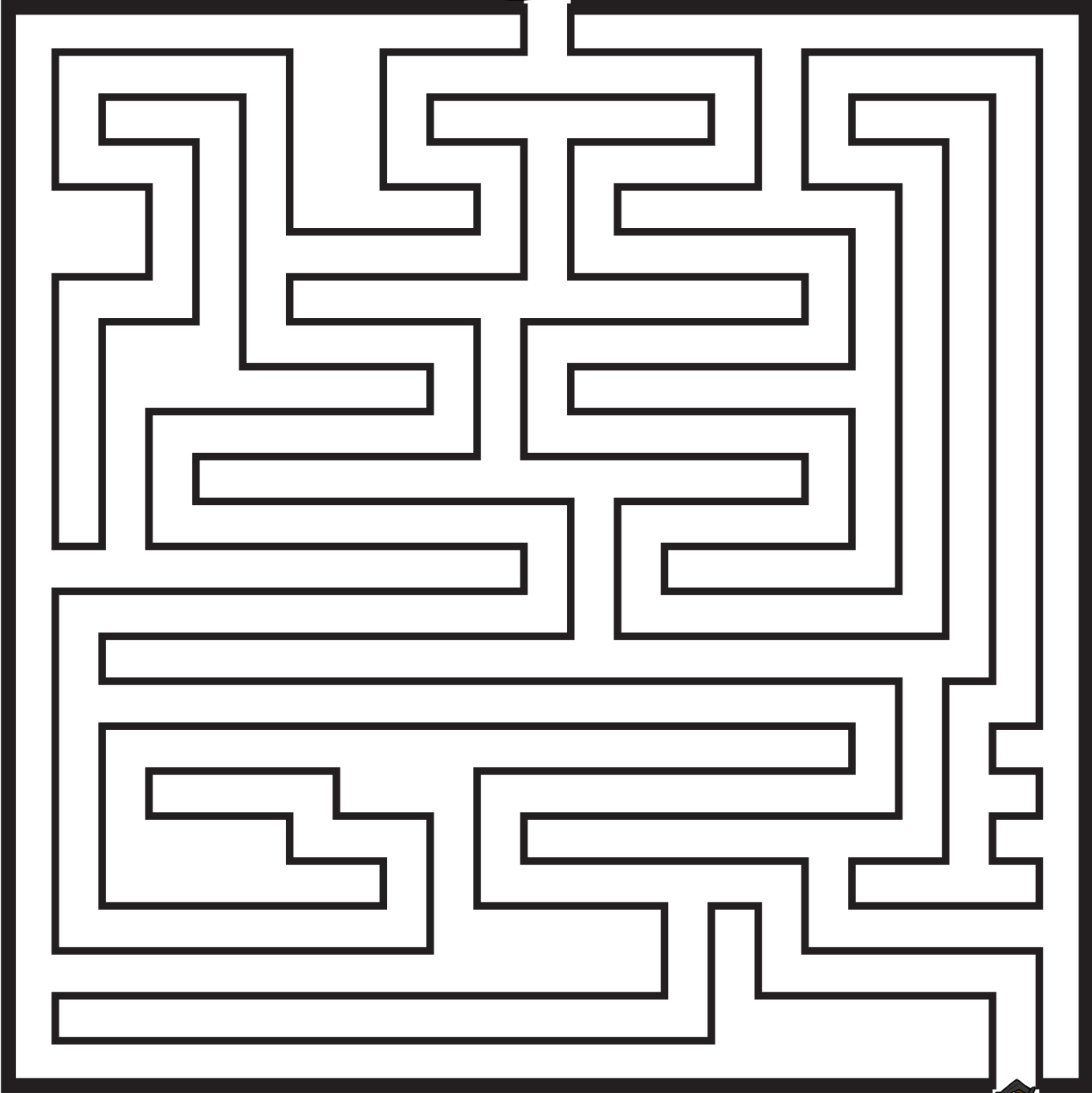
Sometimes we can tell time is passing when we see how things change. For example, look at the pictures of the tree below. As time passes, the tree loses its leaves.

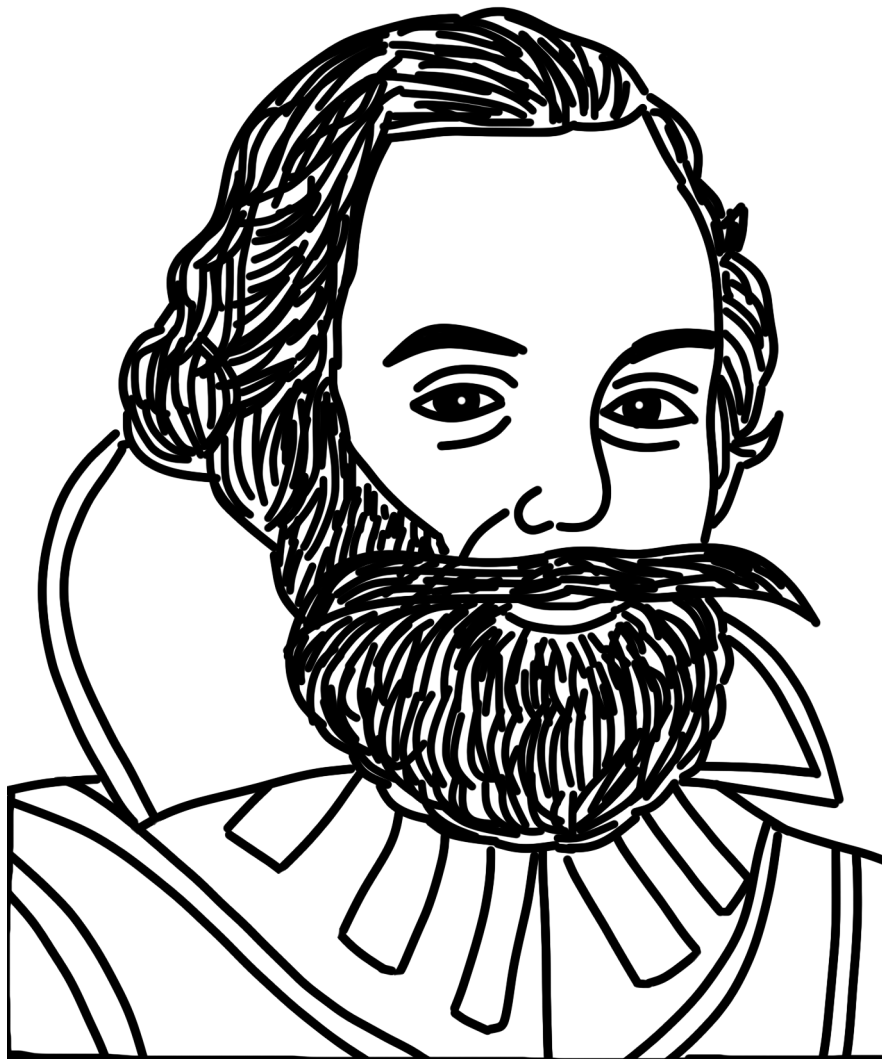
Help Columbus find his way.



John Smith

John Smith was born in England. When he grew up, he became a soldier. He decided to go with people who wanted to start an English colony in the New World. He traveled with them to a place they named Virginia. In 1607, they started Jamestown, a colony they named after King James of England. Many of the settlers in the Jamestown colony did not want to work, but Captain John Smith made them work because he knew it was the only way they could stay alive. The Native Americans were afraid of Captain John Smith, so they tried to live in peace with the settlers. The Native Americans did not like the settlers, and when John Smith got hurt and went back to England, the Native Americans attacked the settlers many times. The settlers also had trouble because they did not want to work to grow food after John Smith left, and they almost starved. The colony almost did not survive.

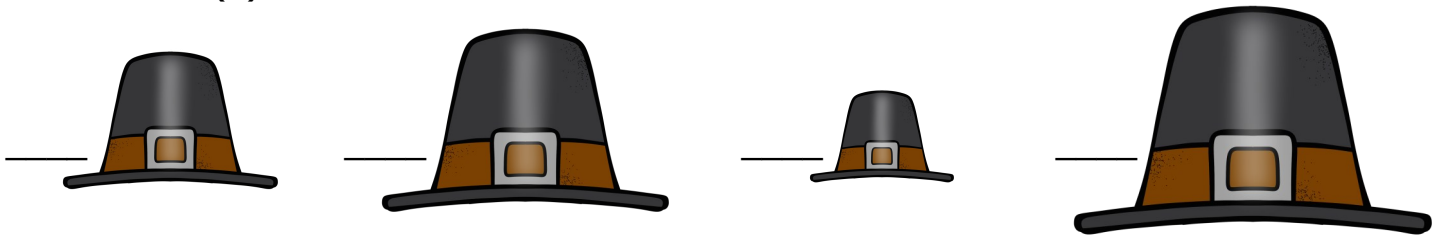
Pilgrims, Squanto, William Bradford, and Miles Standish
