Richard, Duke of York

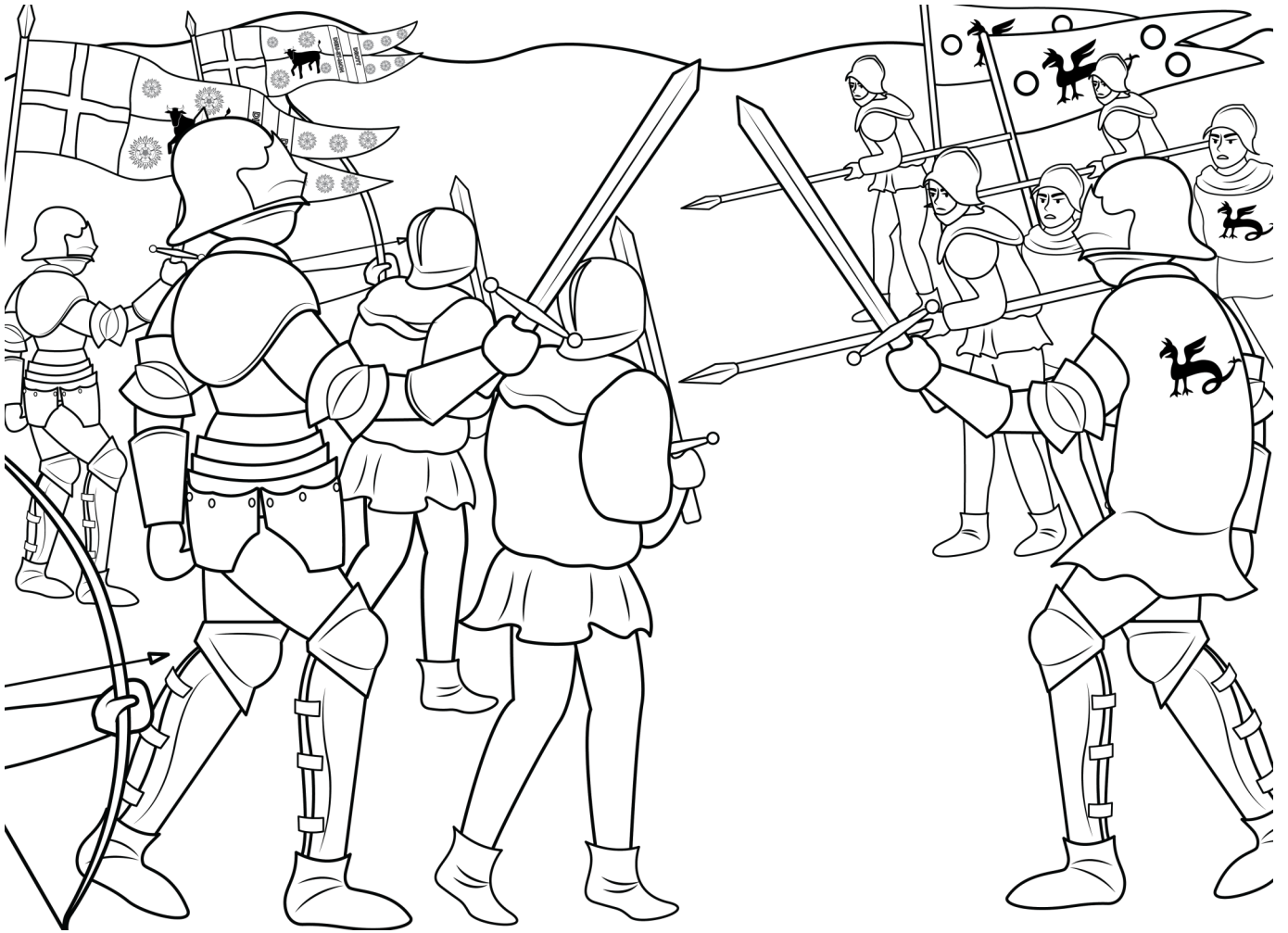
Richard, Duke of York

cousin. He thought he had

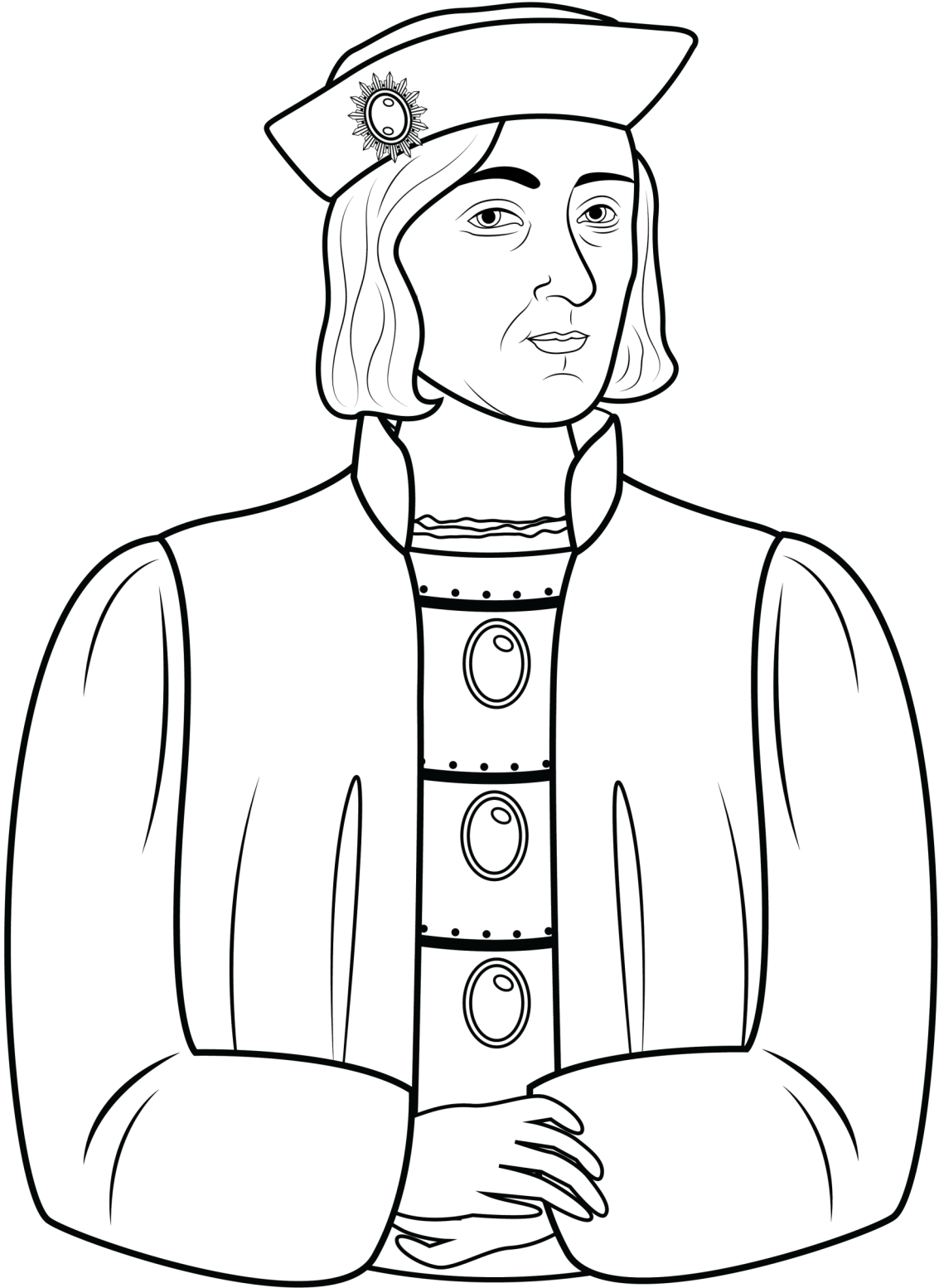
a right to be king of

King Edward IV

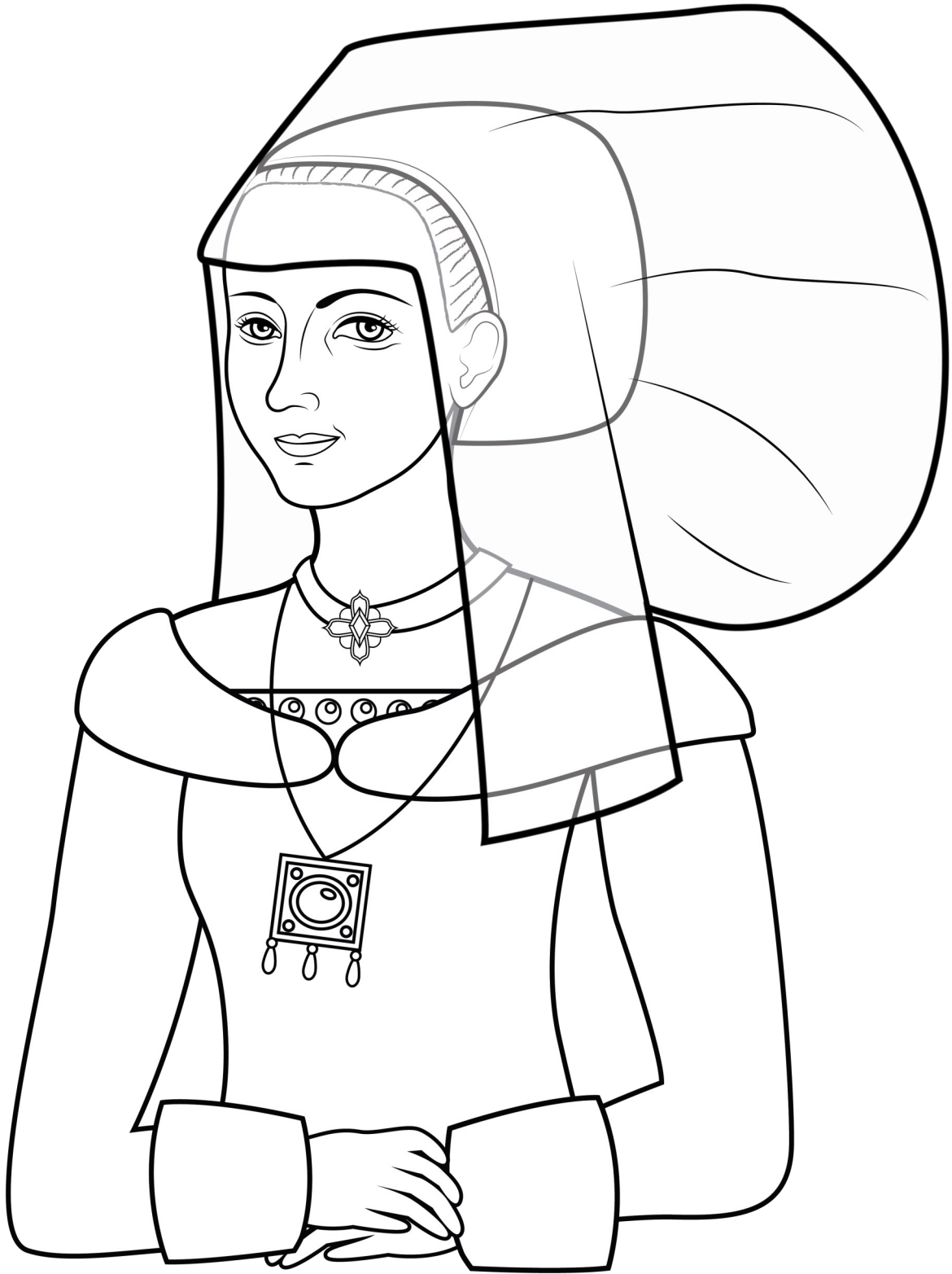
Edward was the son of

Henry VII.

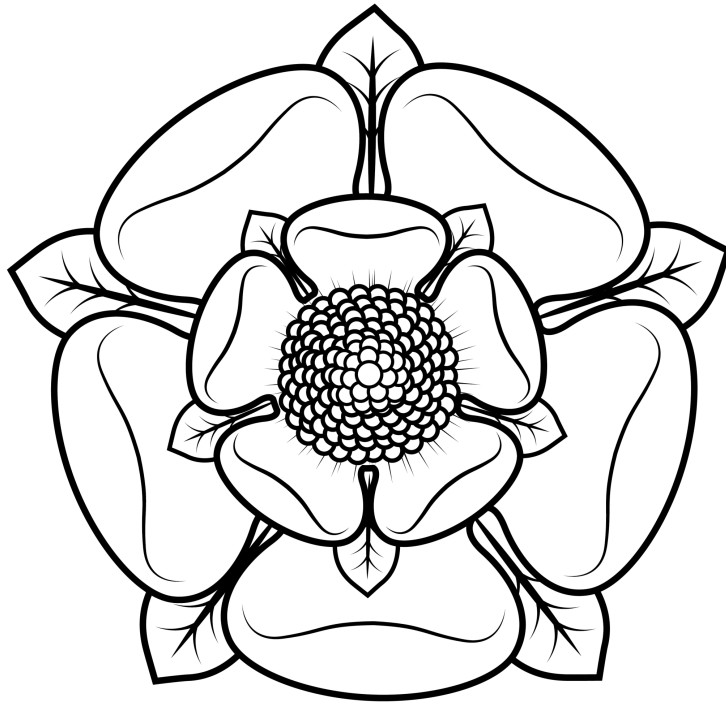


Henry Tudor became

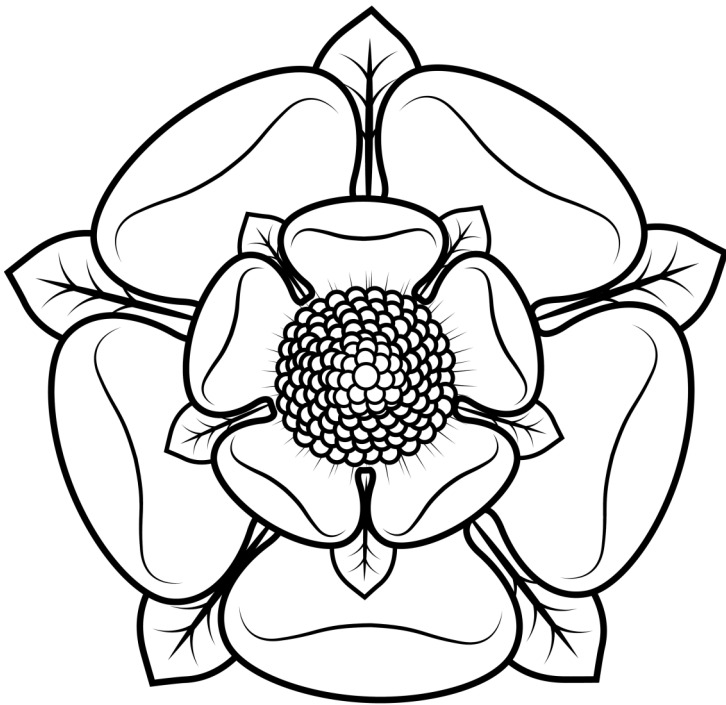
King Henry VII

The red rose was the

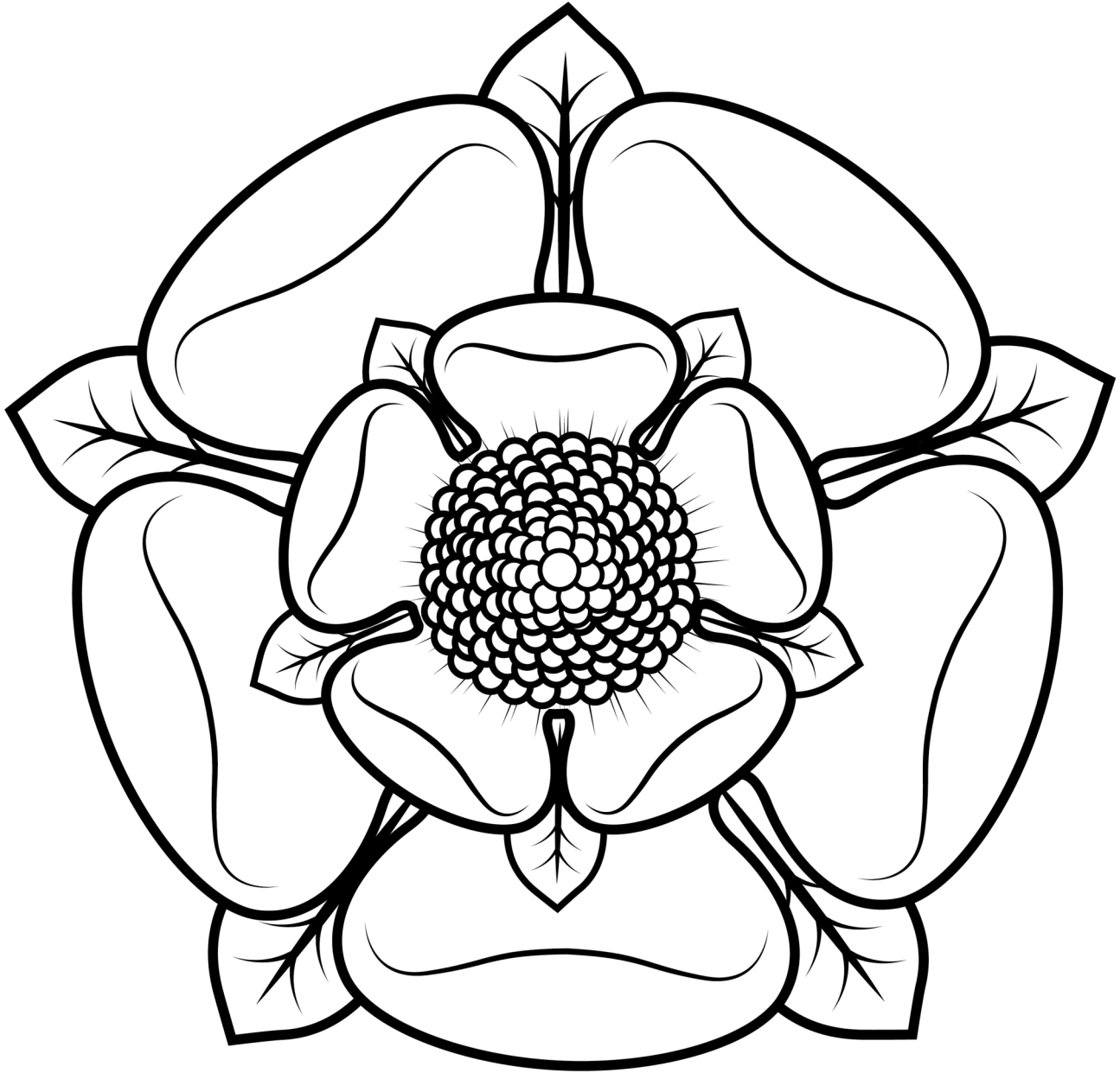
symbol of the House of
