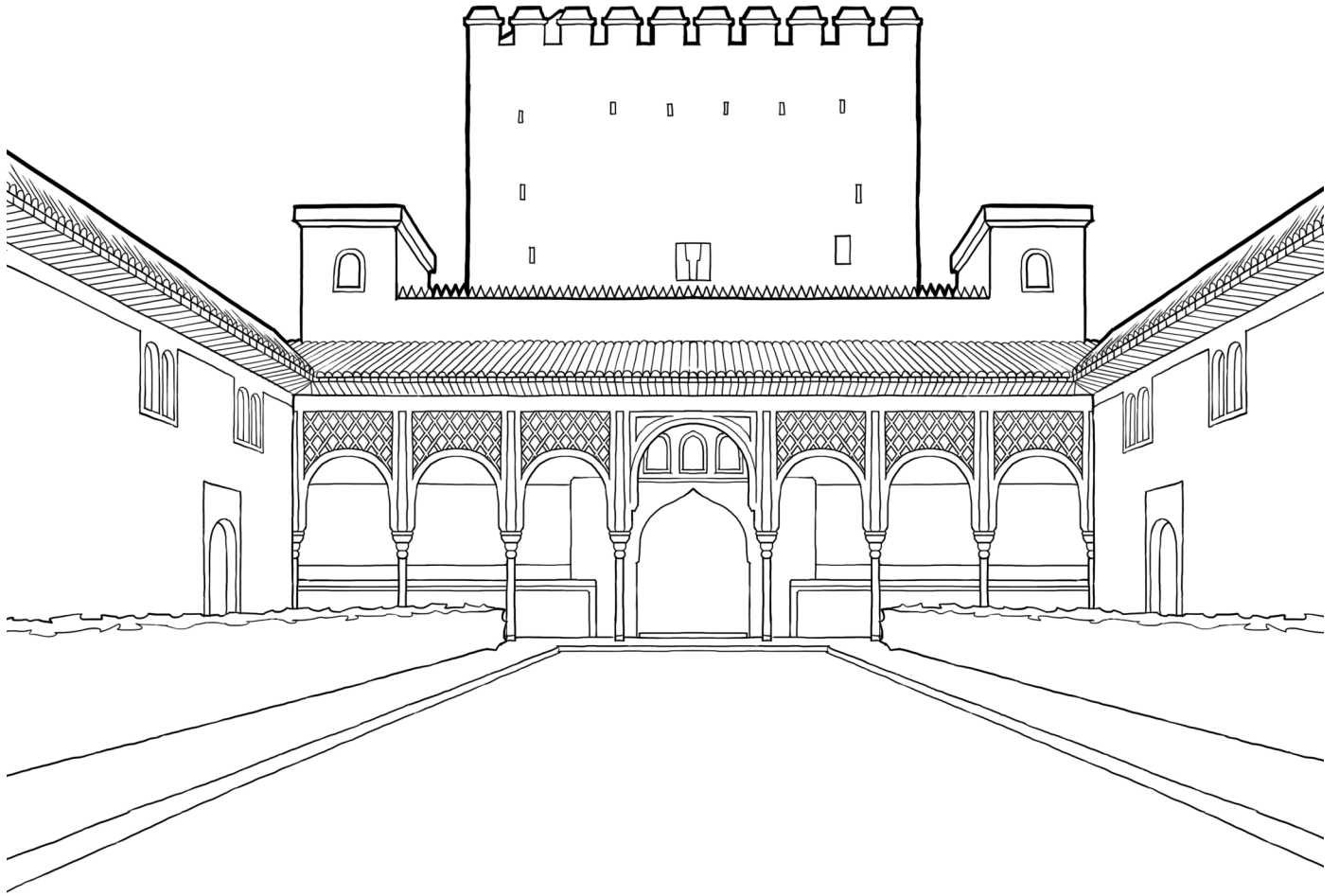


Acropolis

Alhambra

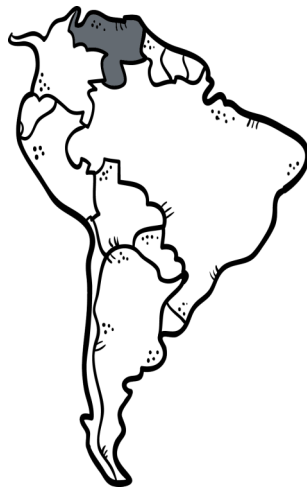
The Alhambra was

and Isabella in 1492.

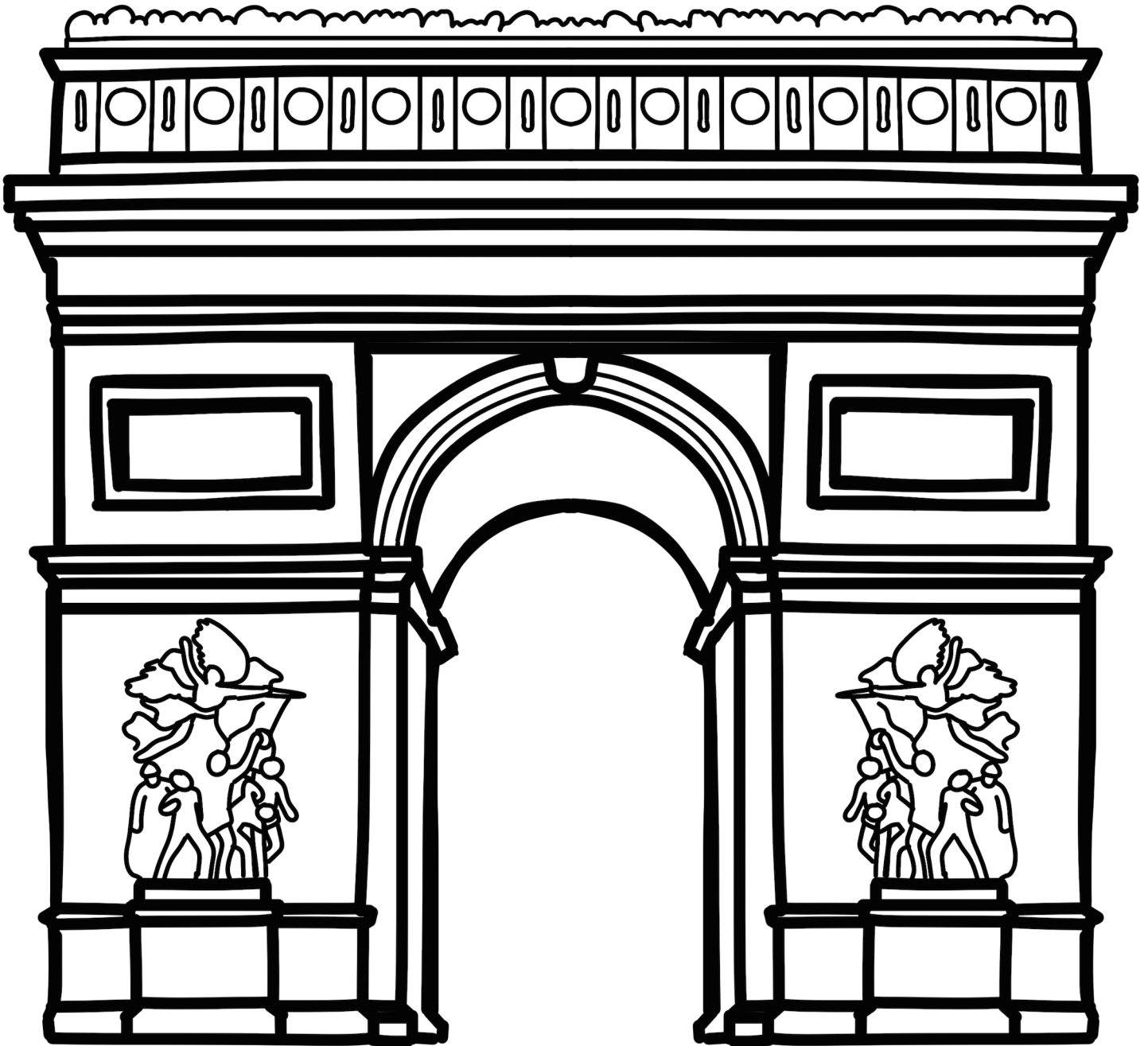




Angel Falls

Angel Falls is a natural landmark in Venezuela. With a total height of 3,212 feet (979 meters), it is the highest waterfall in the world.

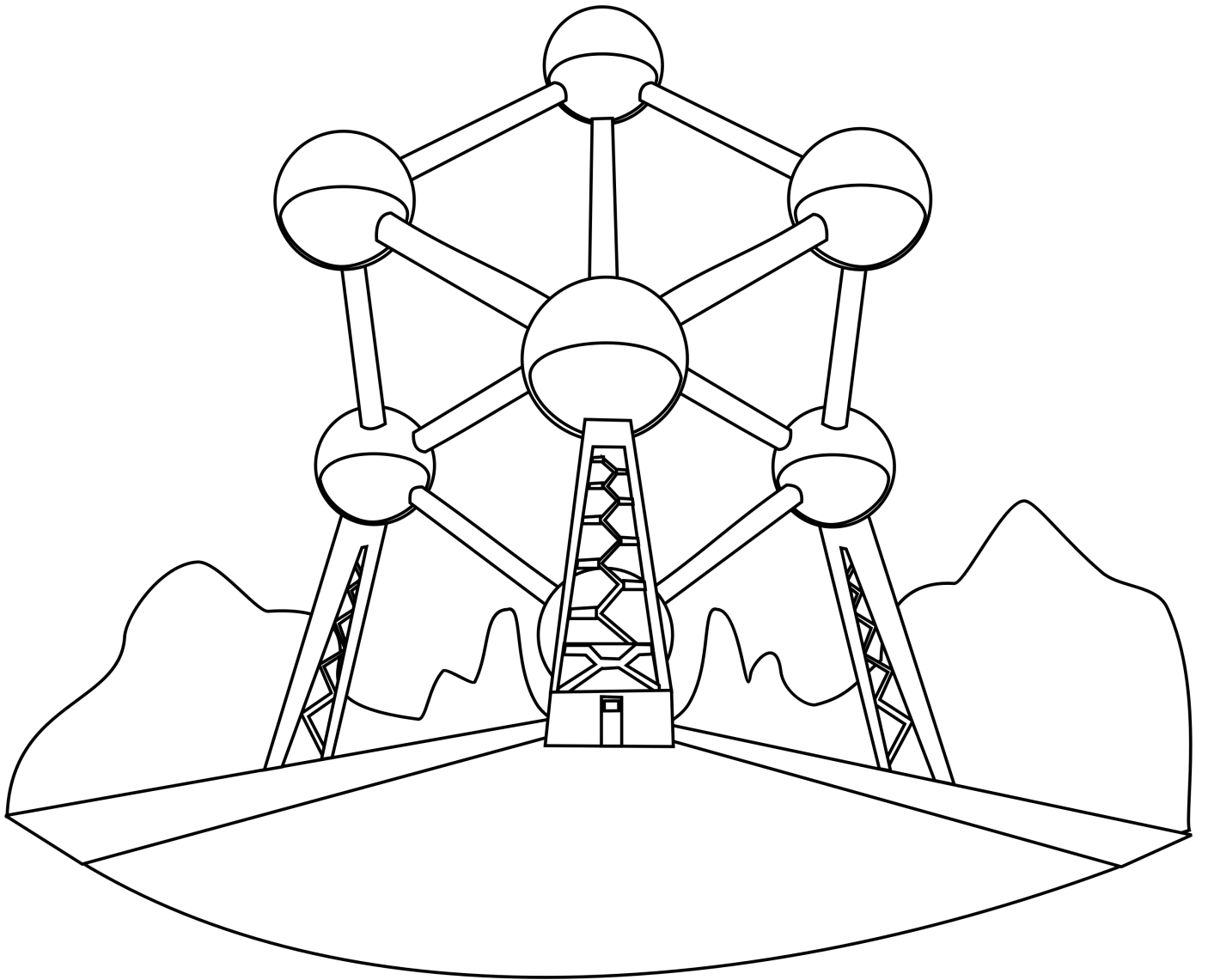




Arc de Triomphe

the arch.

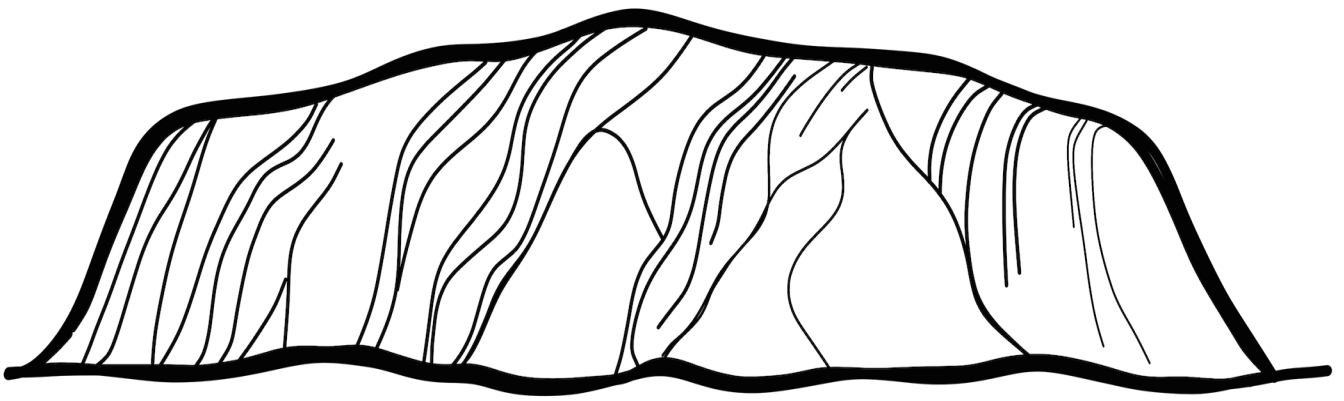




Atomium

allowed to explore.

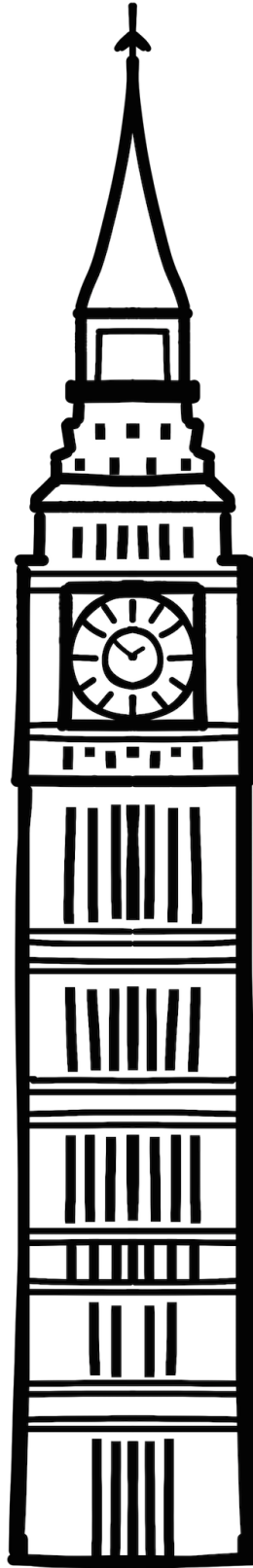




Ayers Rock

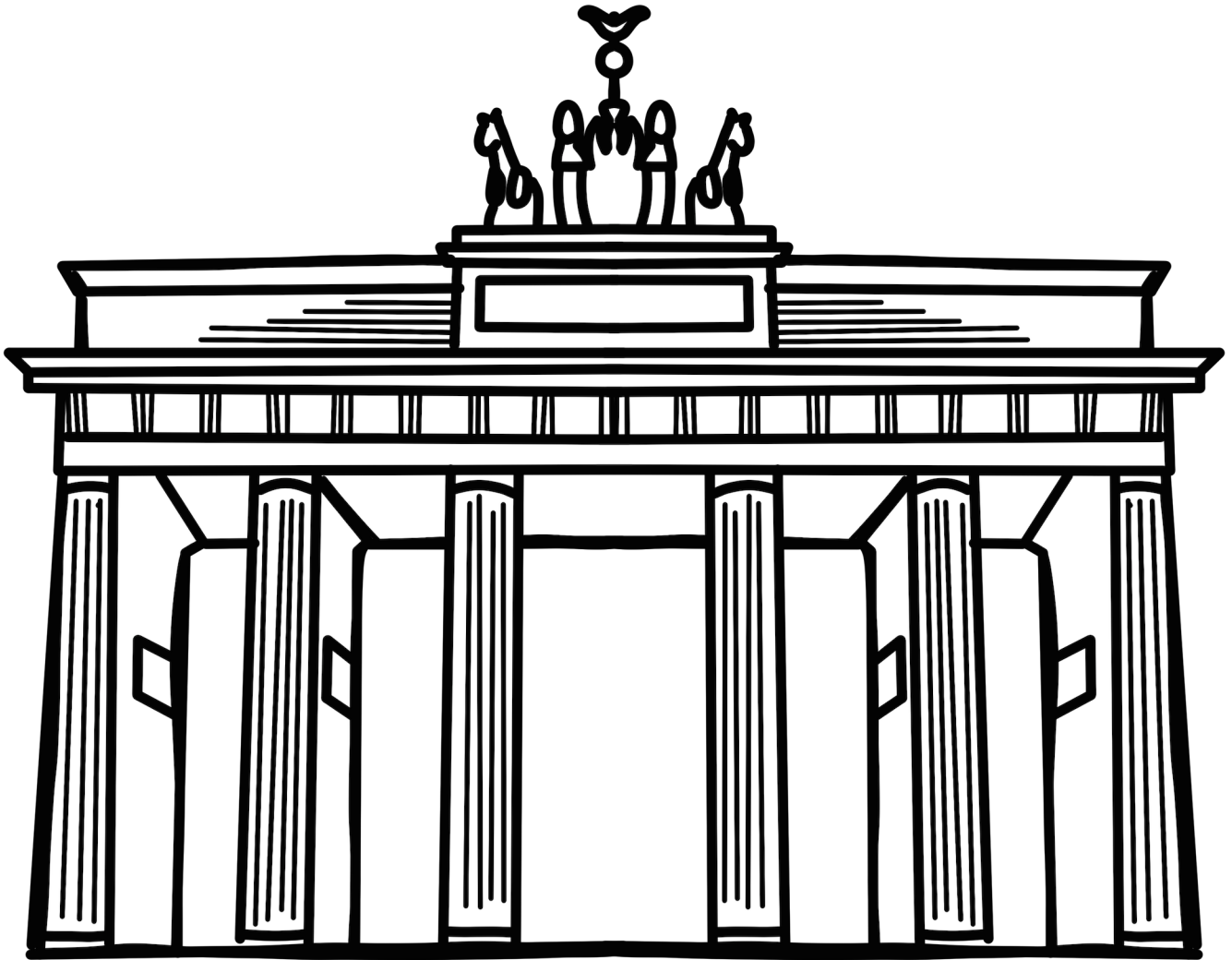




Big Ben

in 1859.

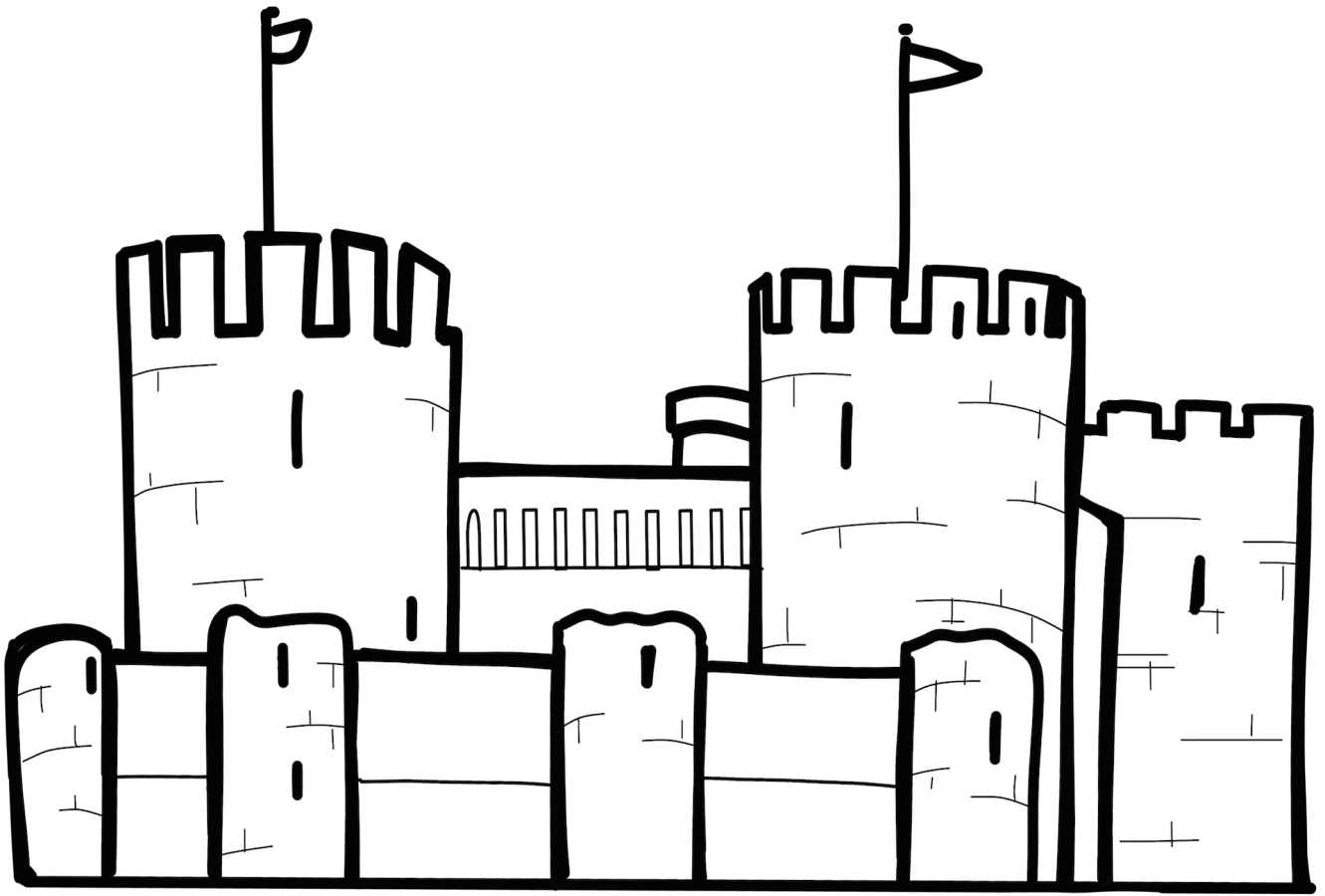




Brandenburg Gate

was built near the

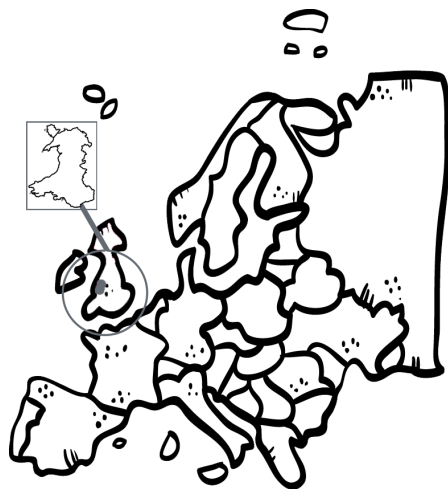
west end of the

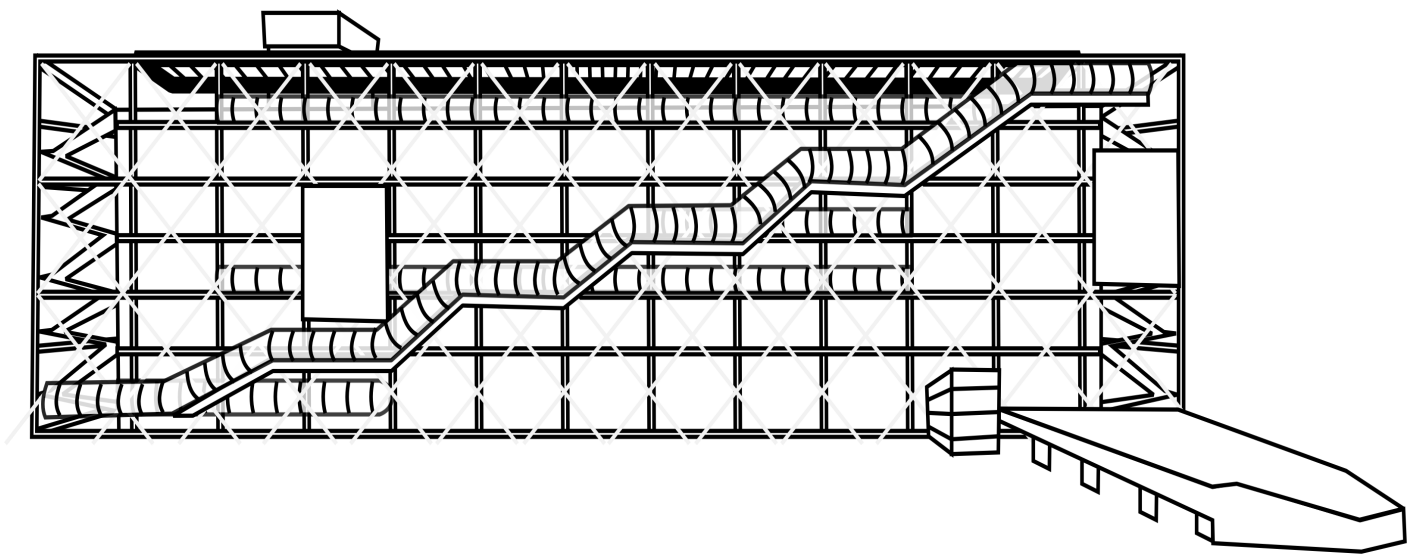
Menai Strait in

1284 by Edward I.

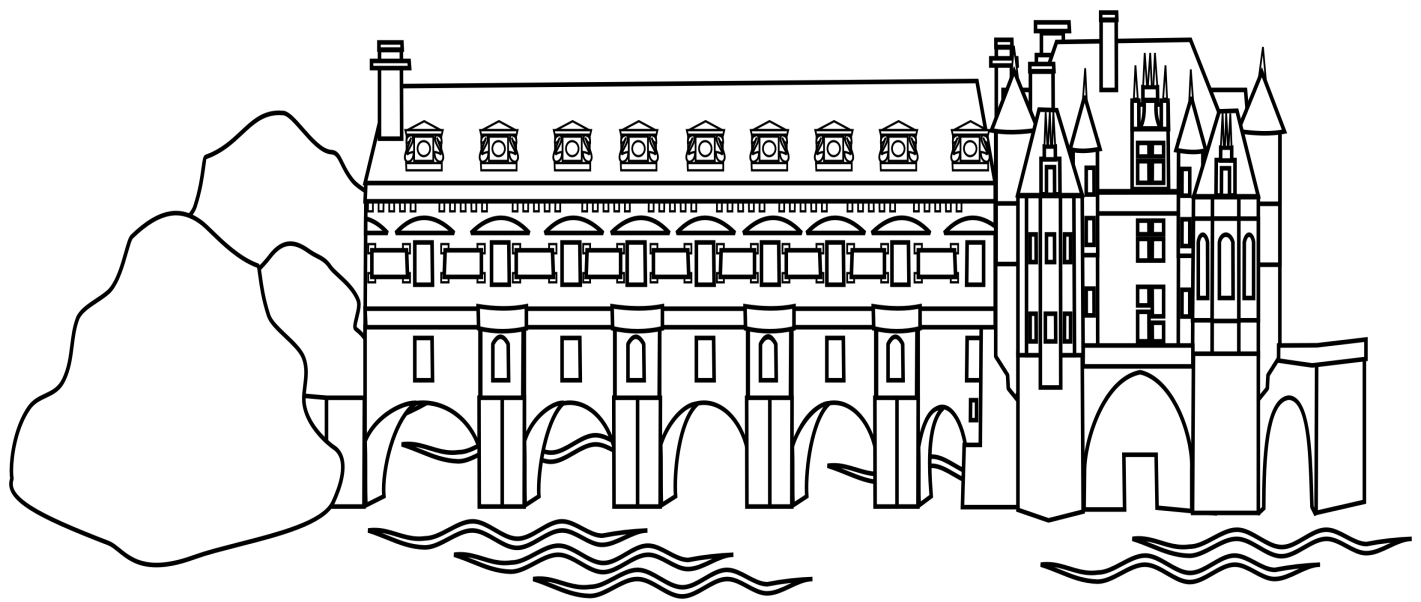




Centre Pompidou

Georges Pompidou.



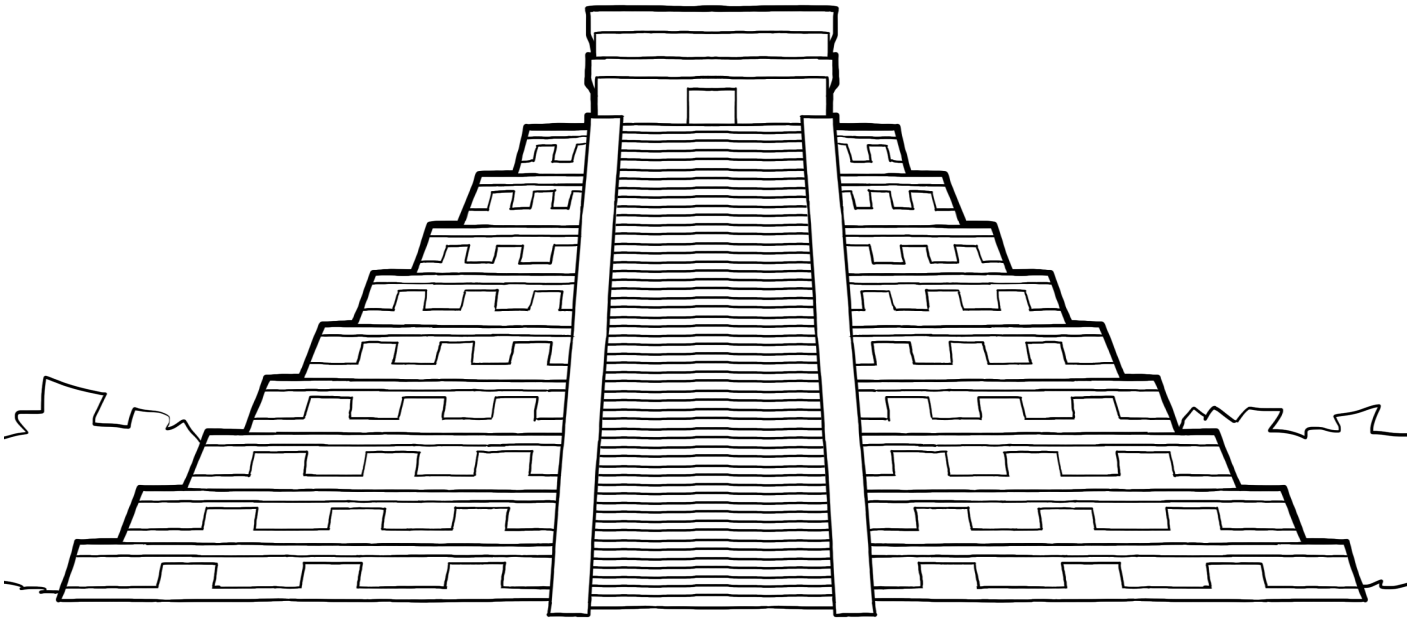


Chateau de

tourist attraction.

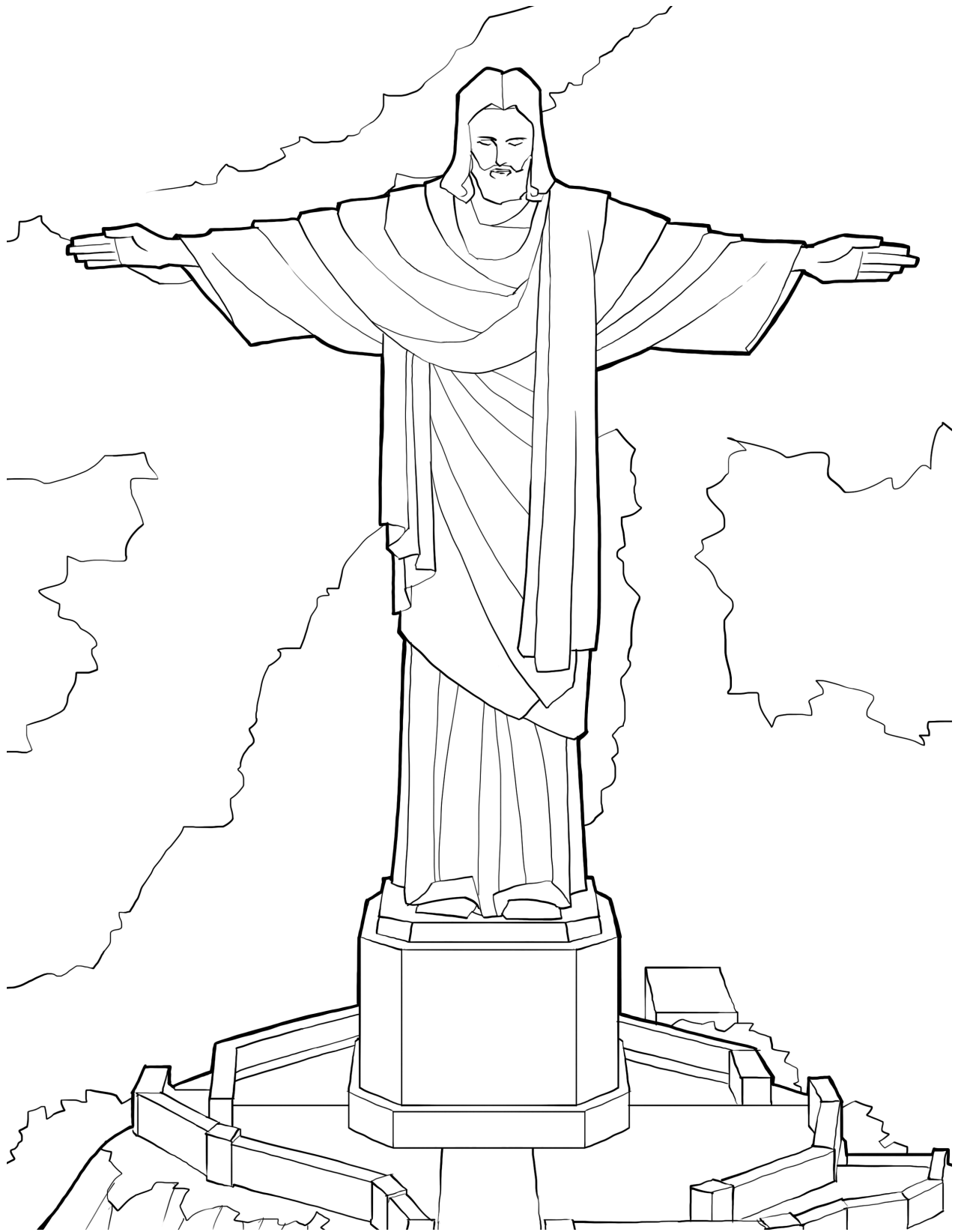




Chichen Itza

trade.

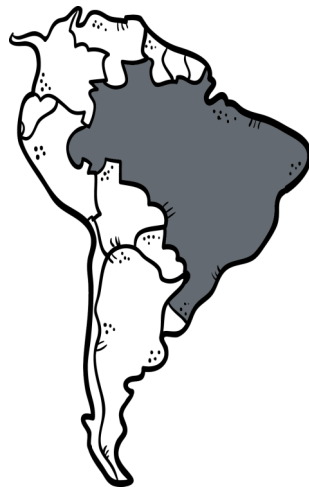


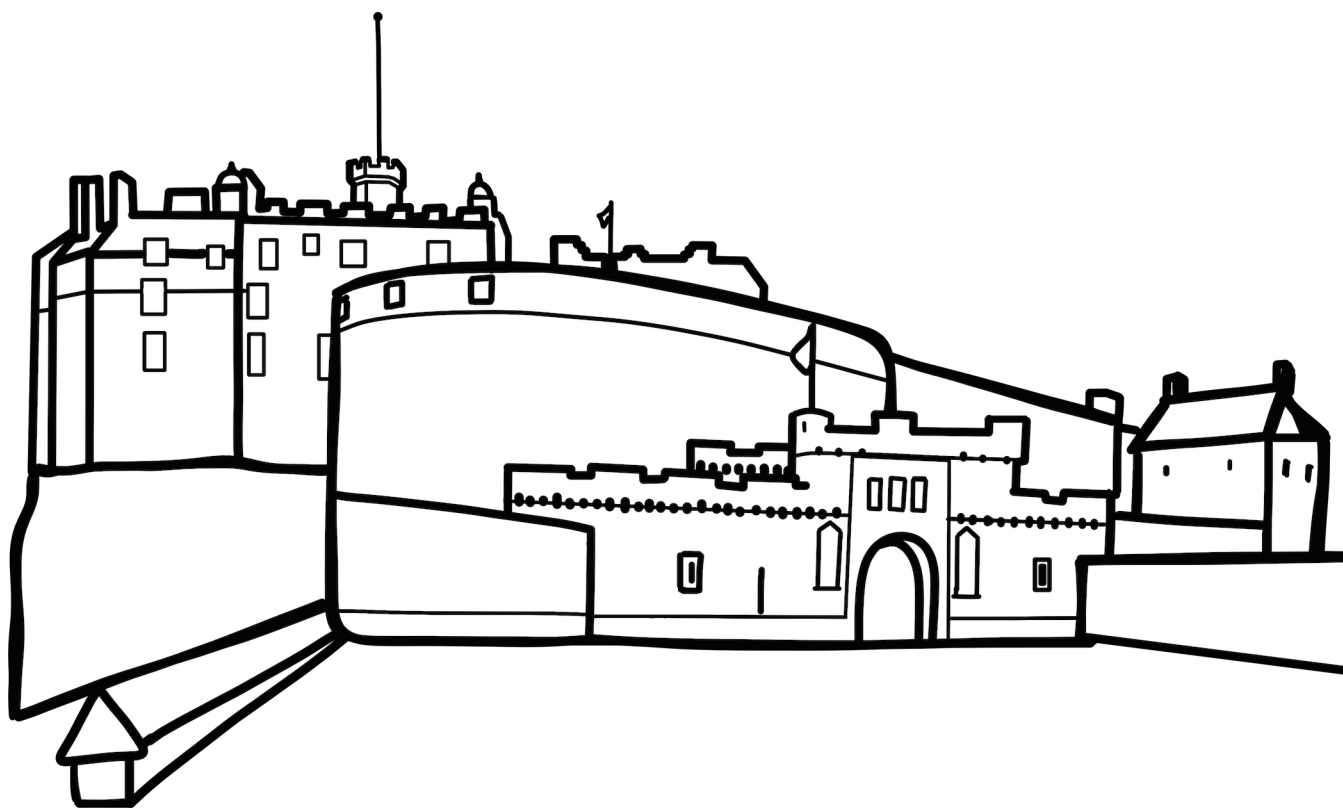


Christ the Redeemer

is used mainly as a

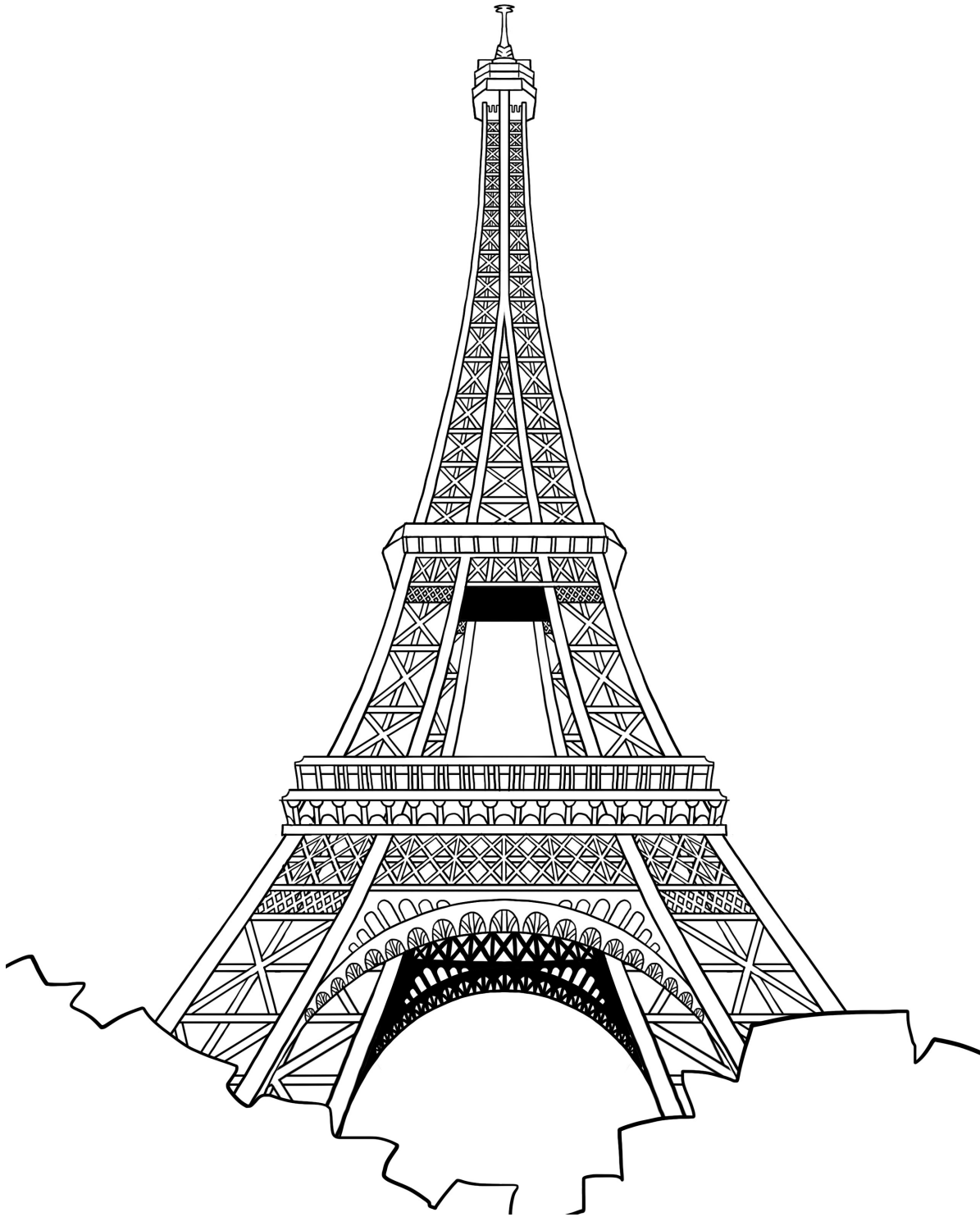
museum today. The

Edinburgh Castle.

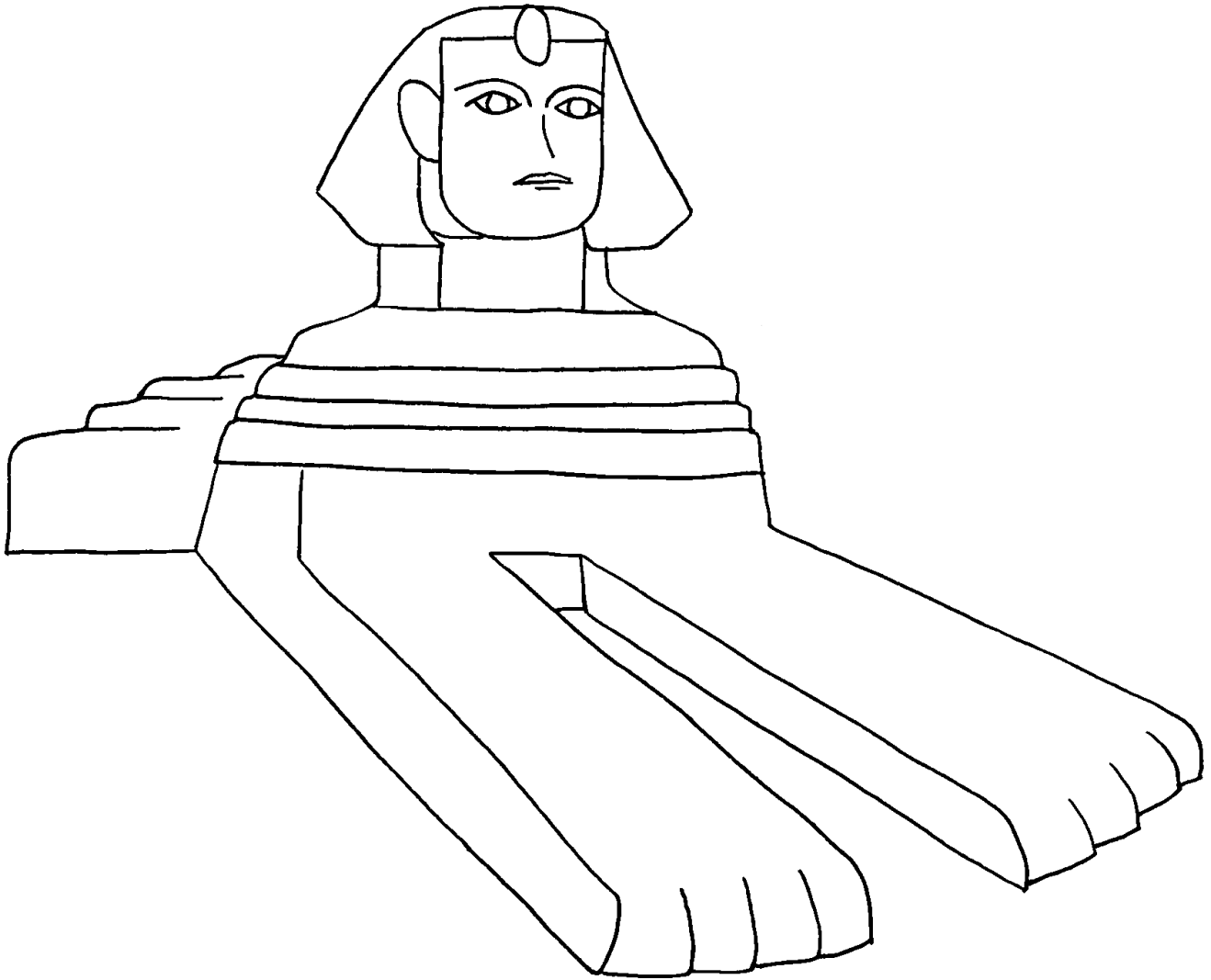




Eiffel Tower

River.

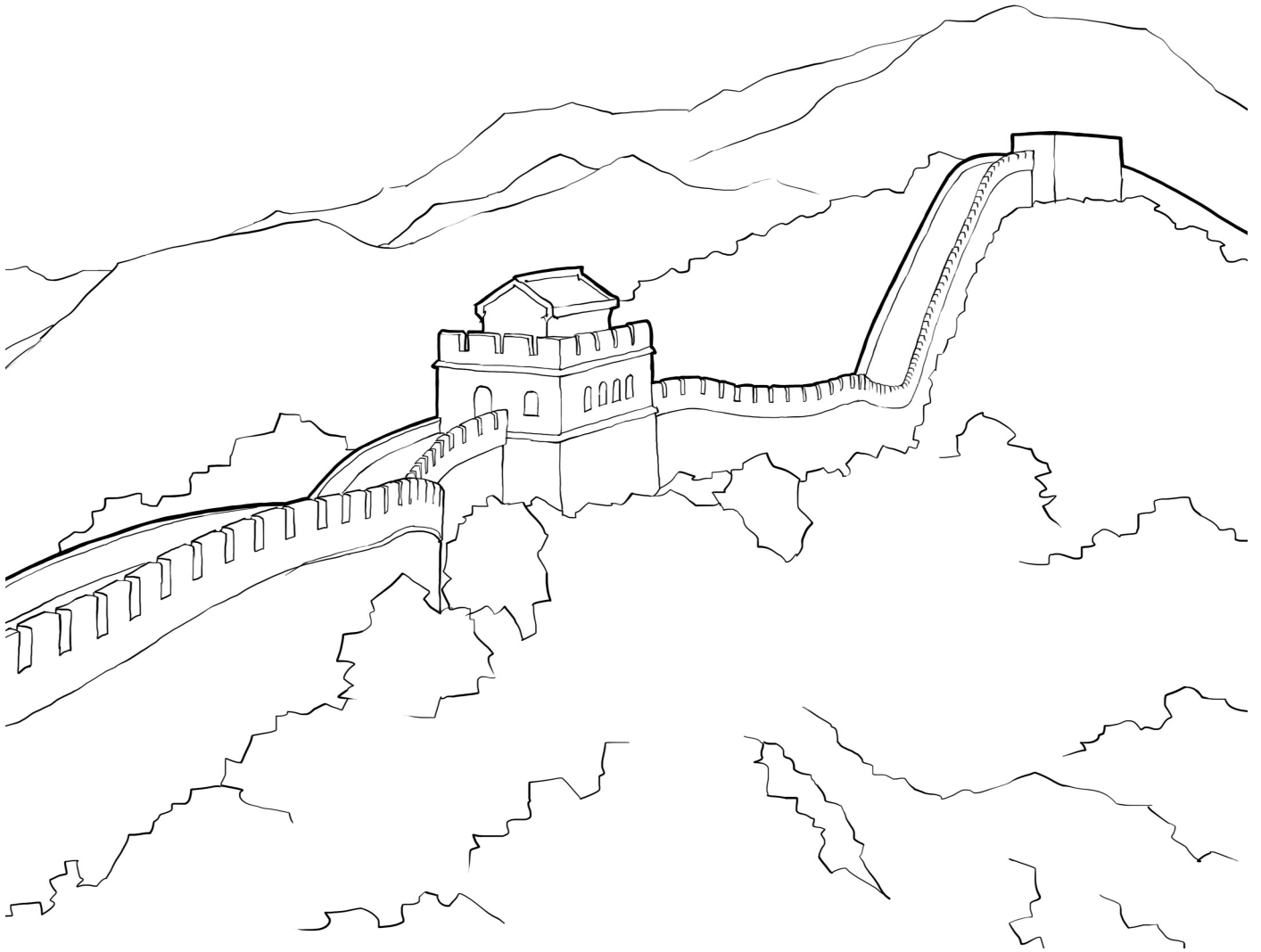




Great Sphinx

single piece of rock.



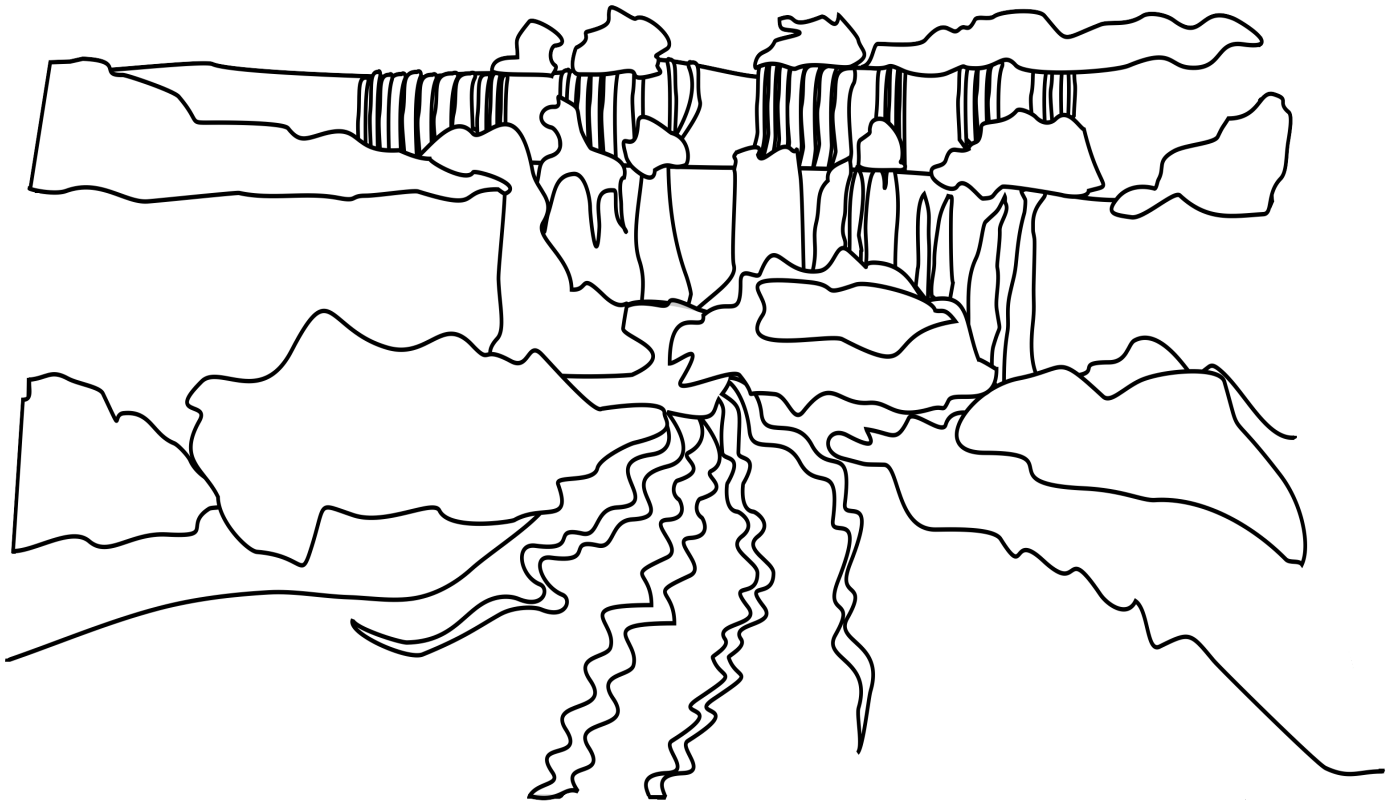


Great Wall of China

Ming Dynasty.

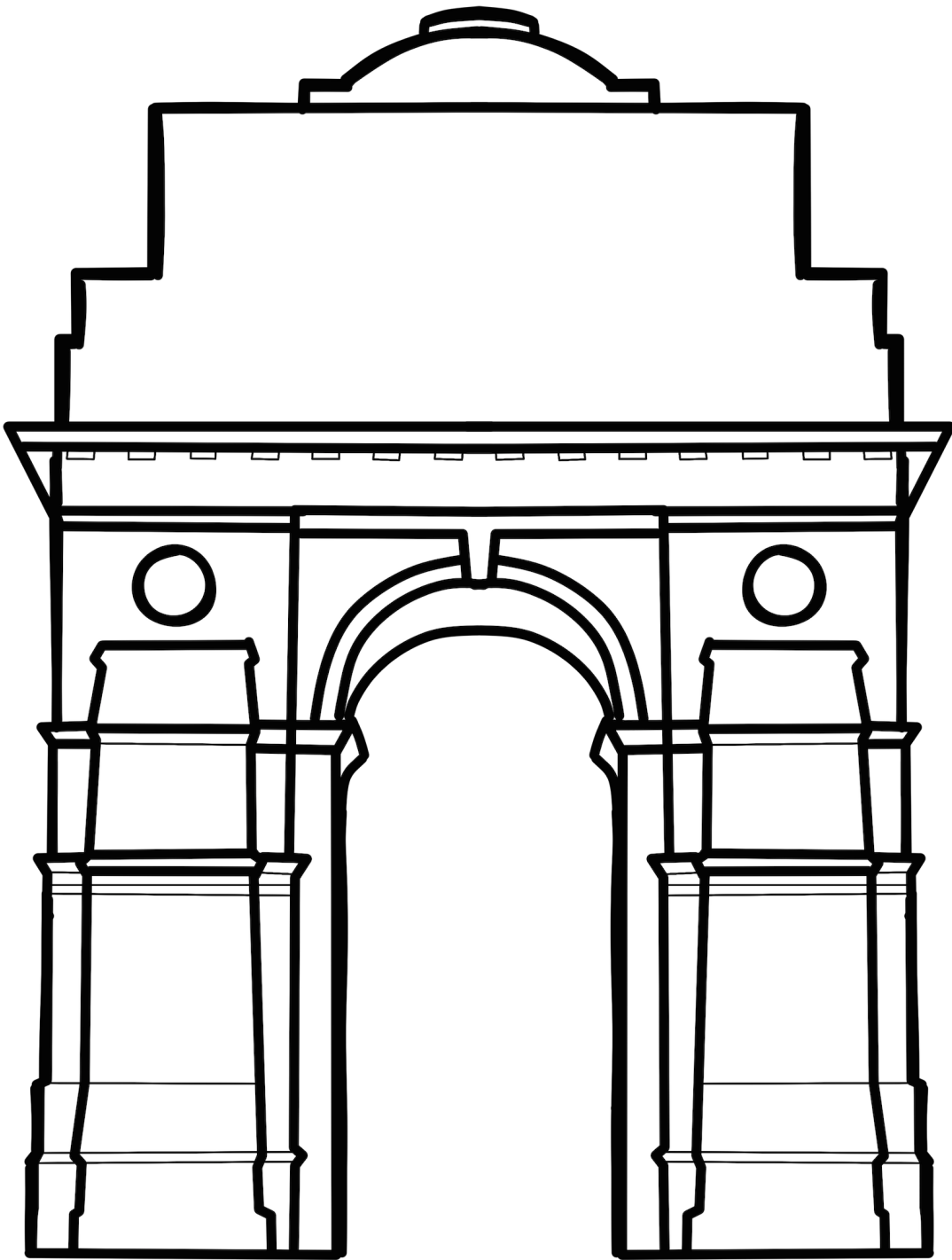




Iguazu Falls

Iguazu River.

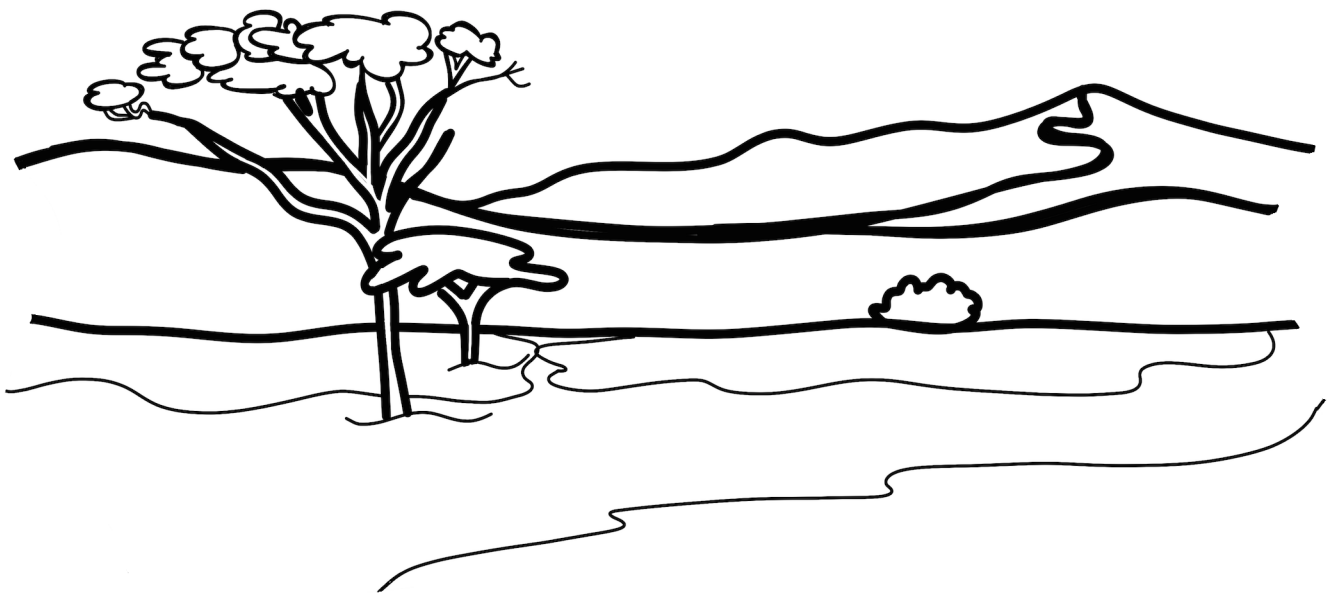




India Gate

completed in 1931.



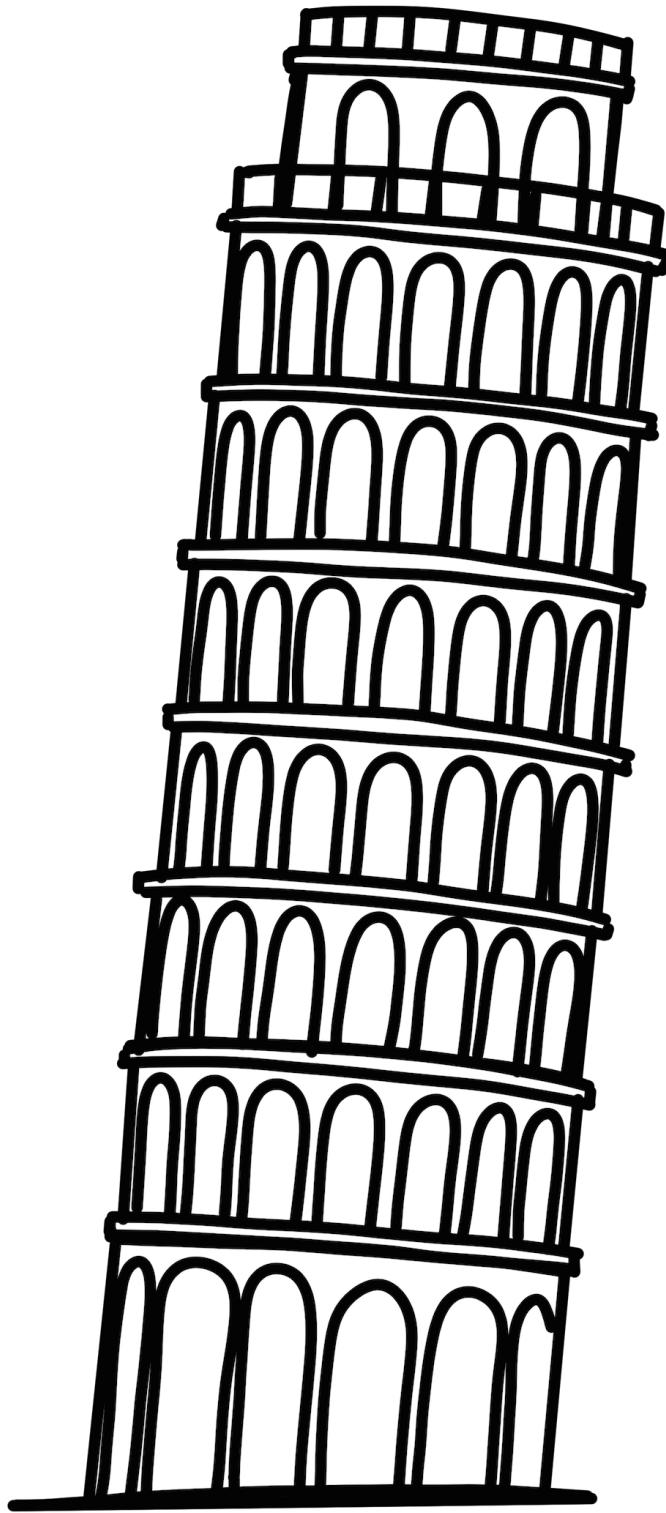


Kalahari Desert

Kalahari.

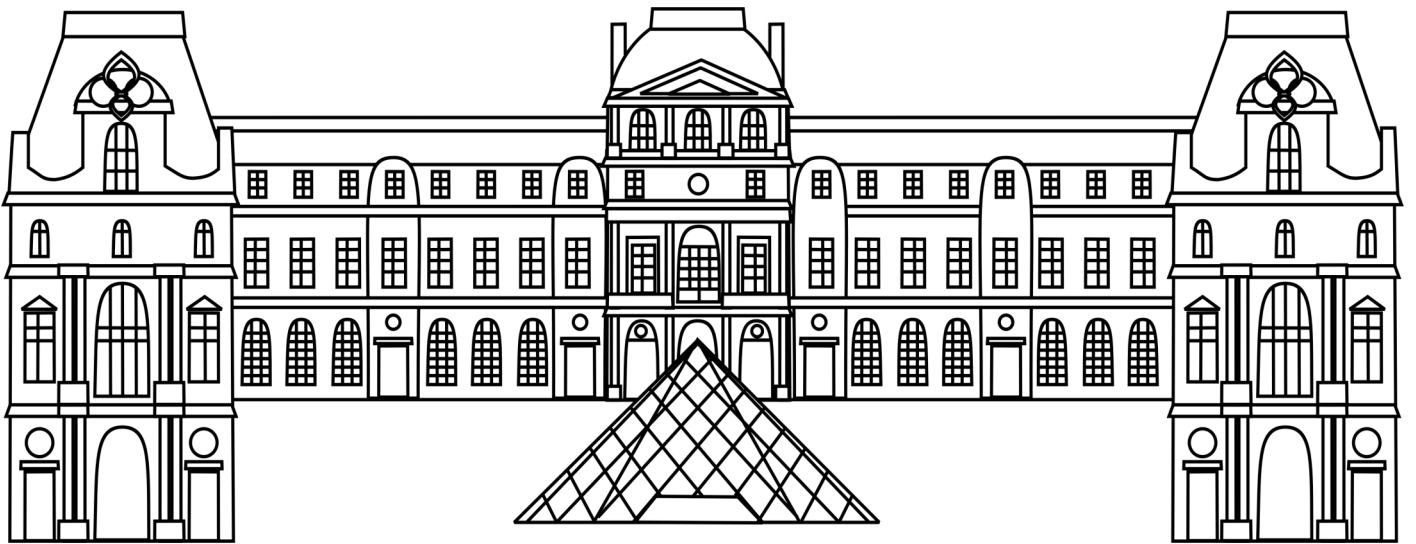




Leaning Tower

Cathedral of Pisa.



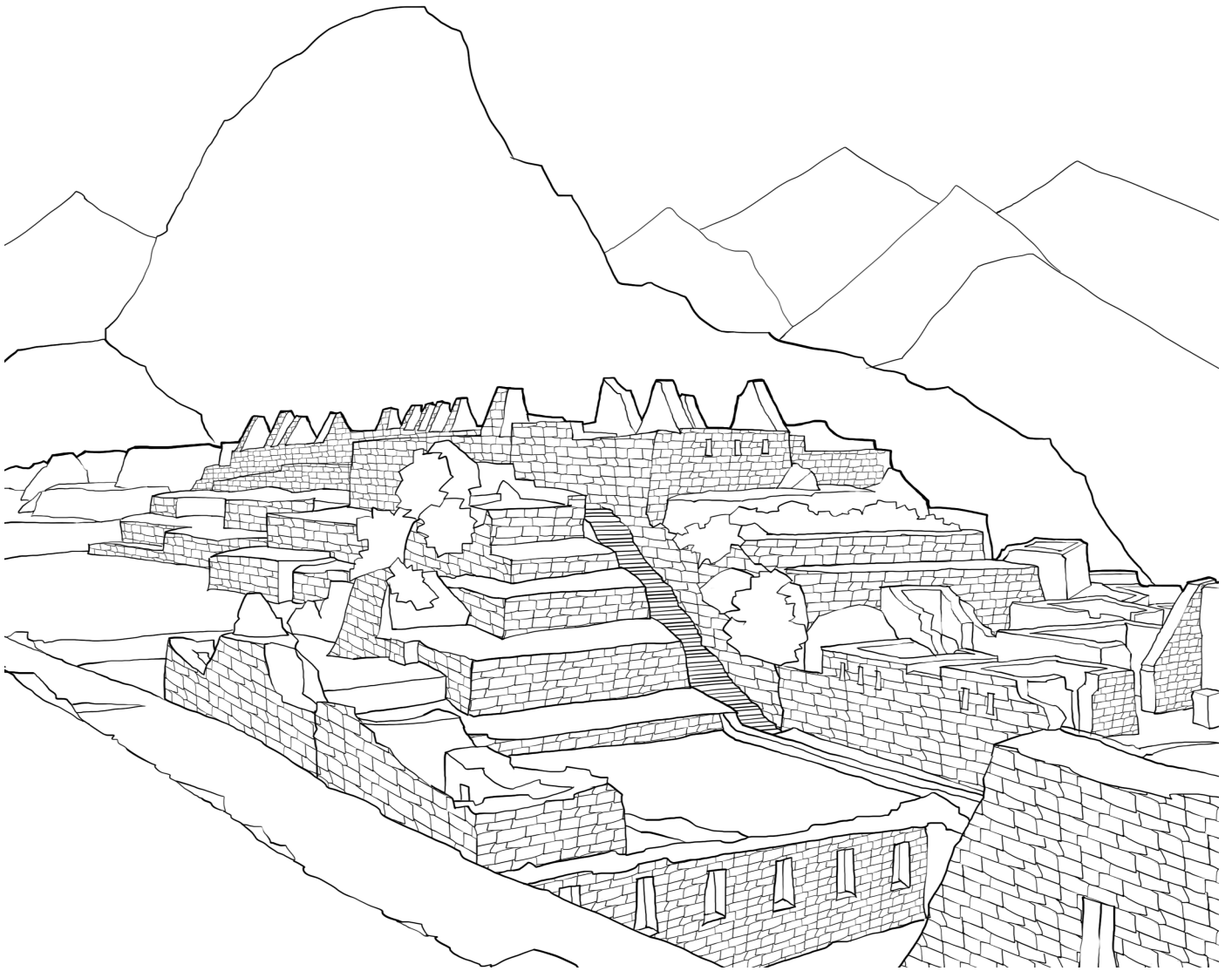


Louvre

was added in 1989.

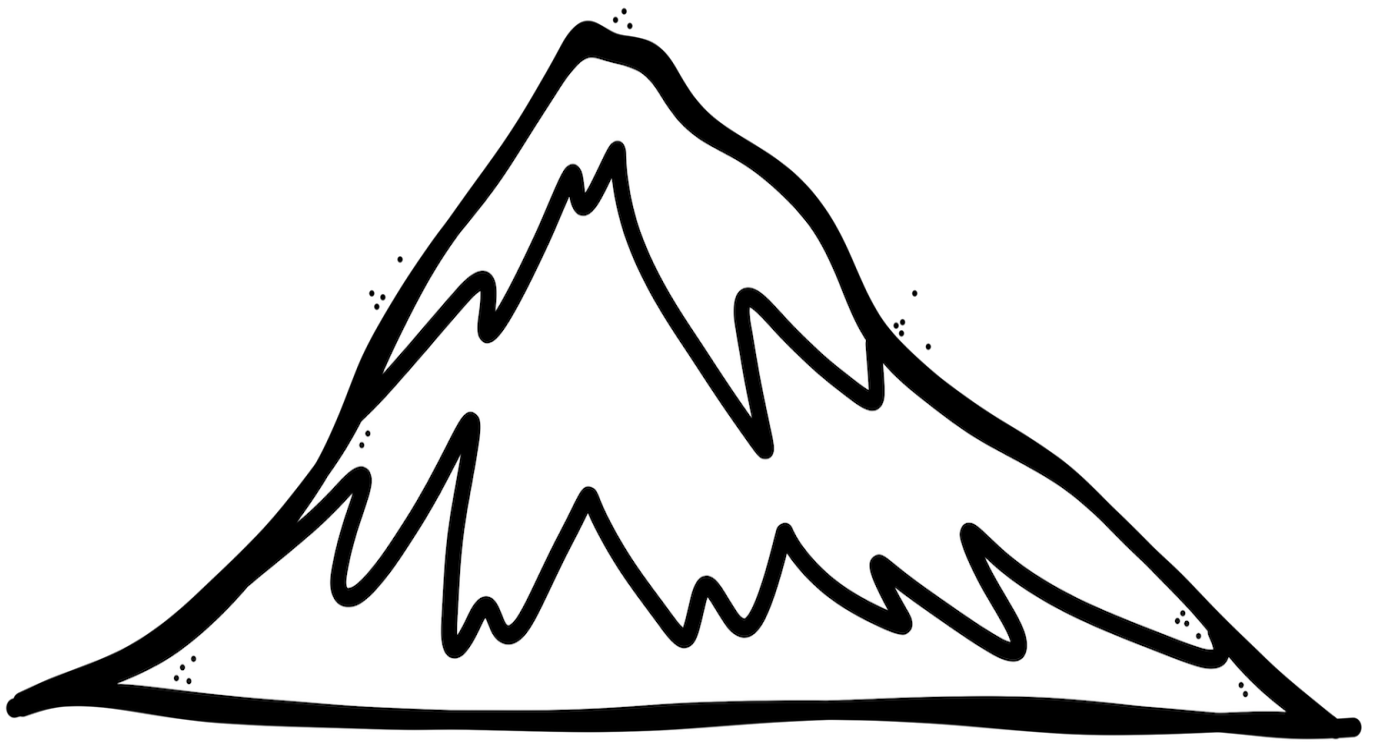




Machu Picchu

recorded since 1616.

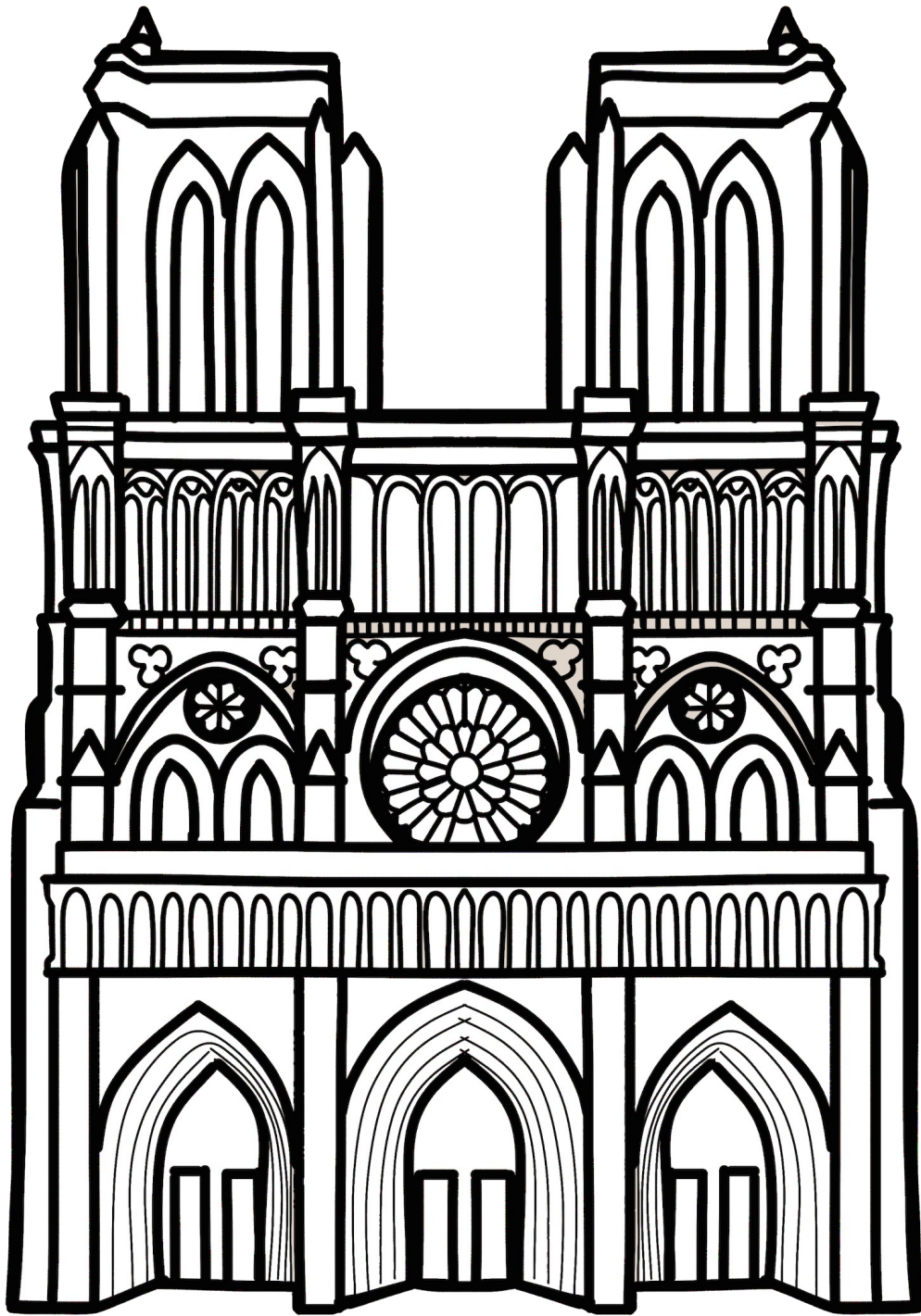




Nordkapp

island in the Seine

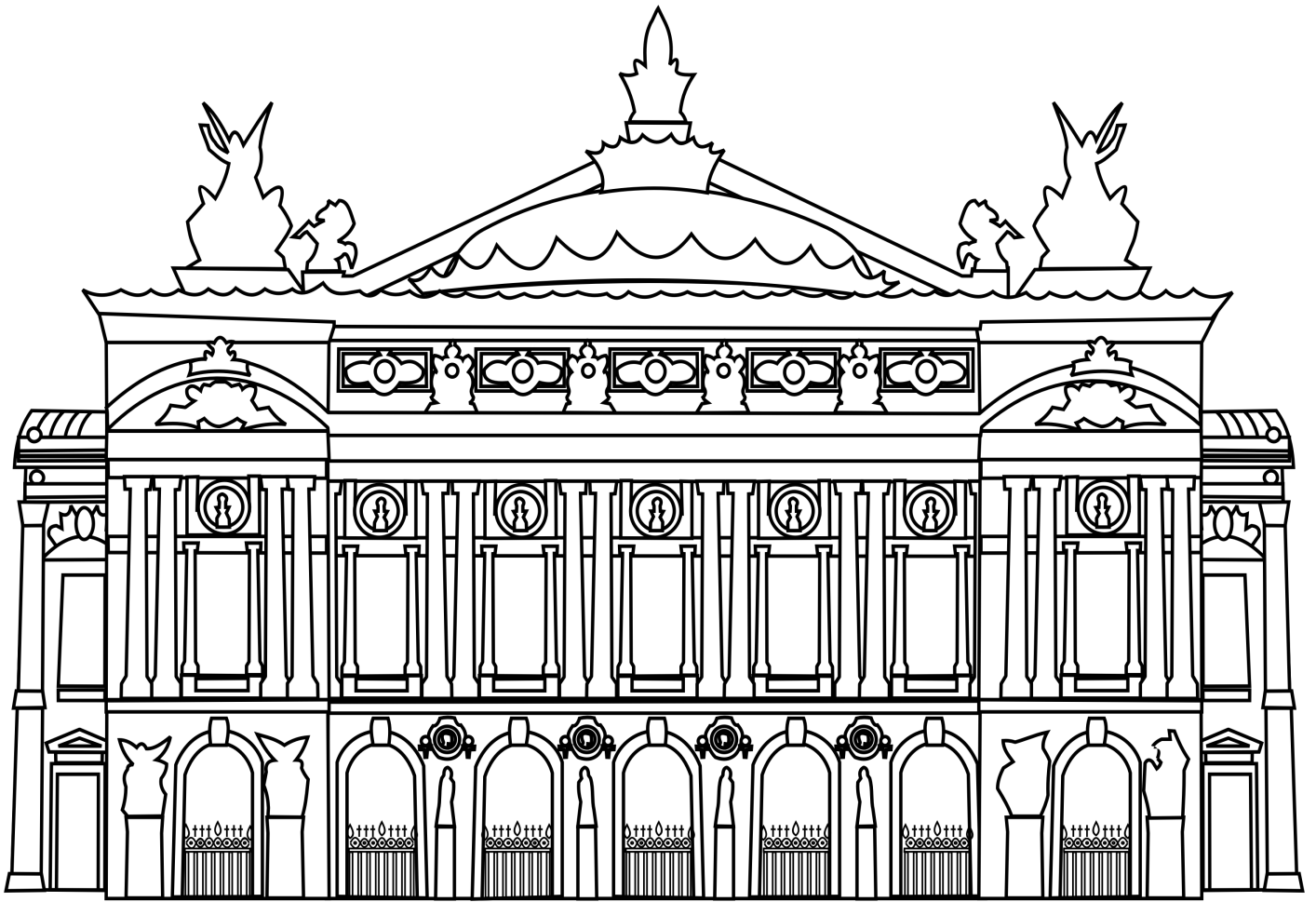
River. Construction

around 1163.

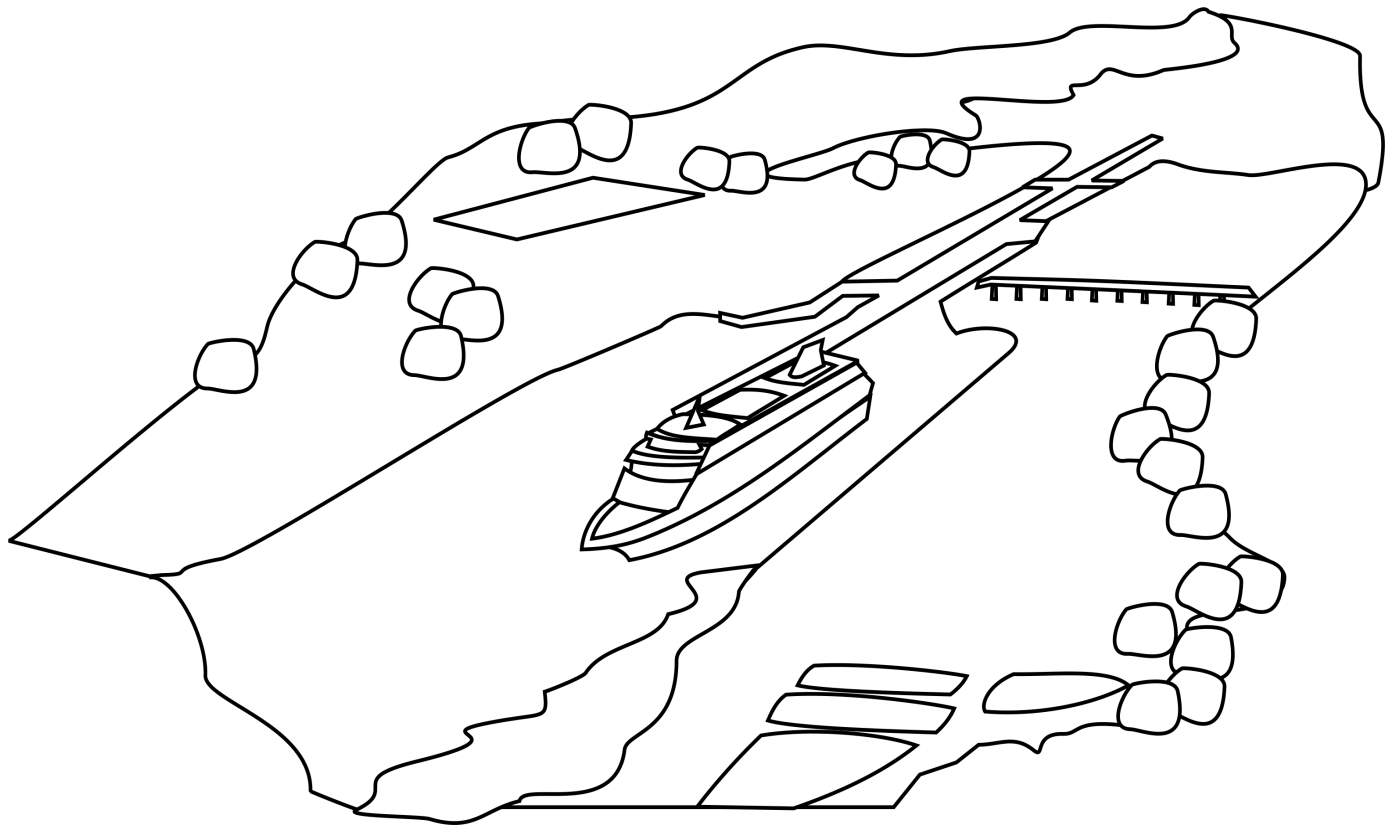




Palais Garnier

the Pacific Ocean.

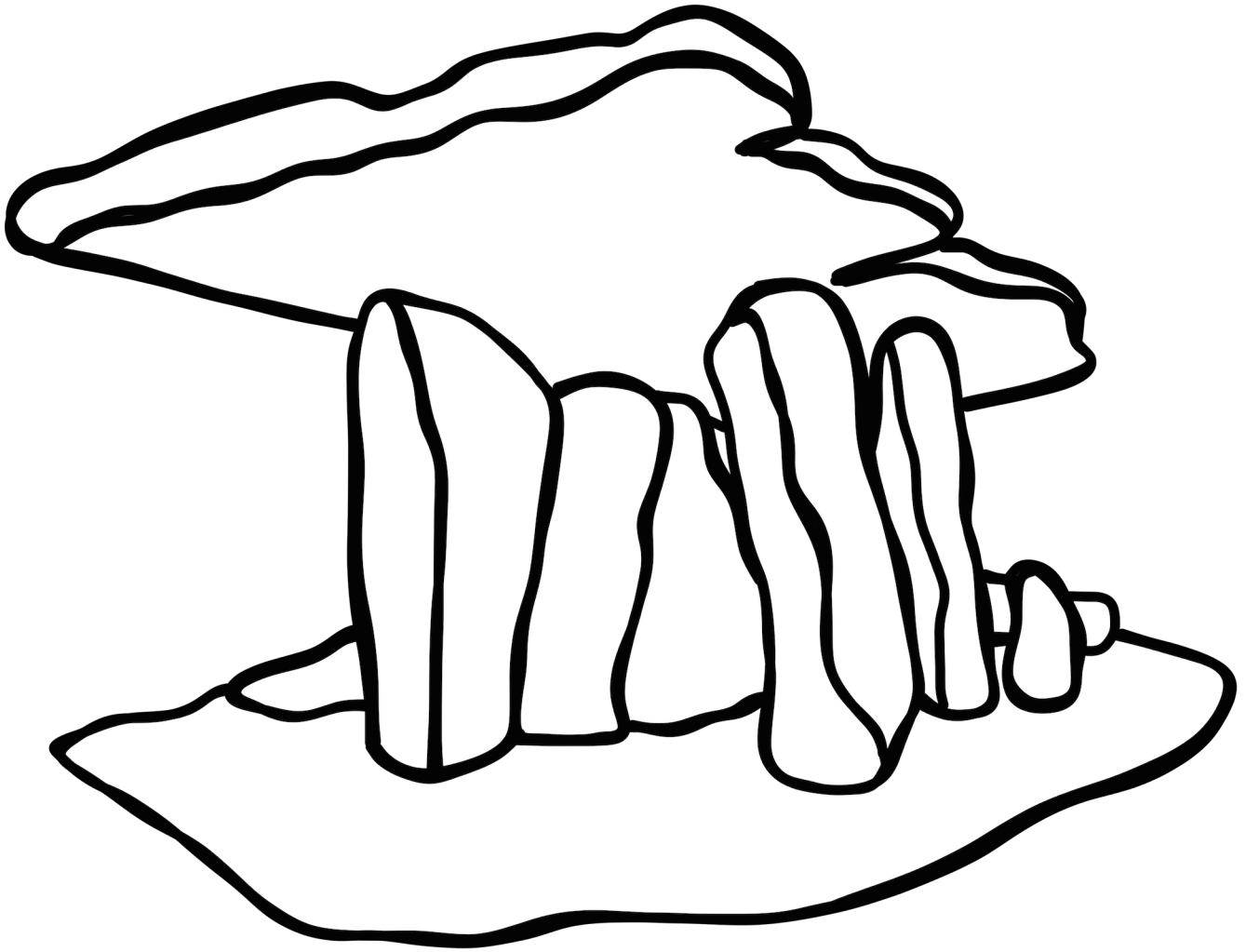




Petra

religious center.



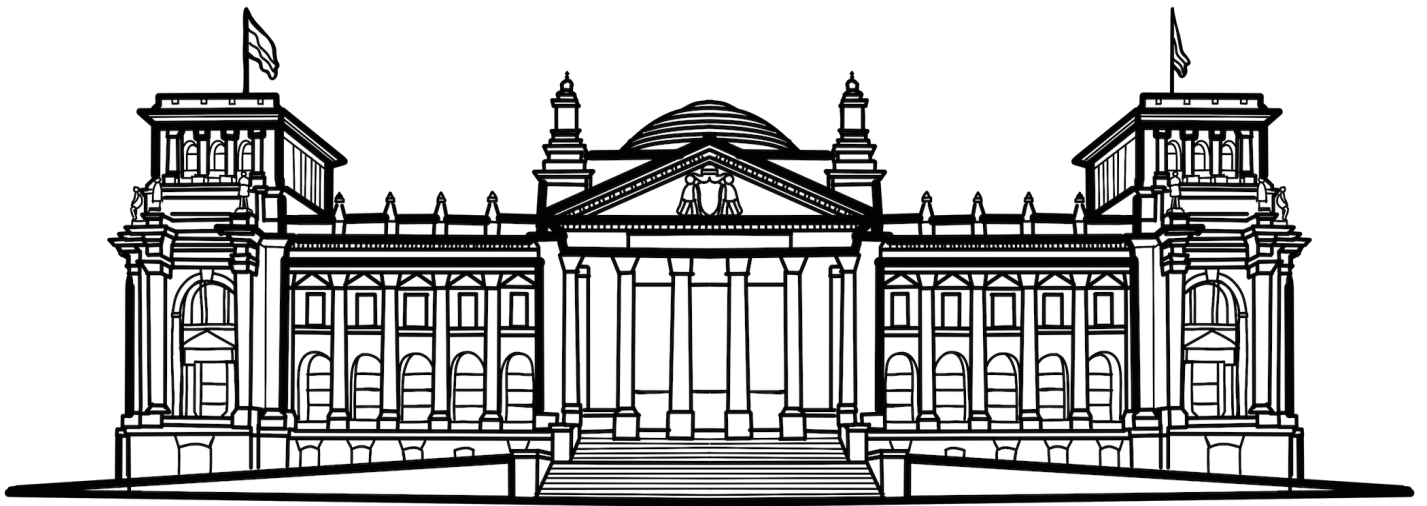


Poulnabrone Dolmen

Monument

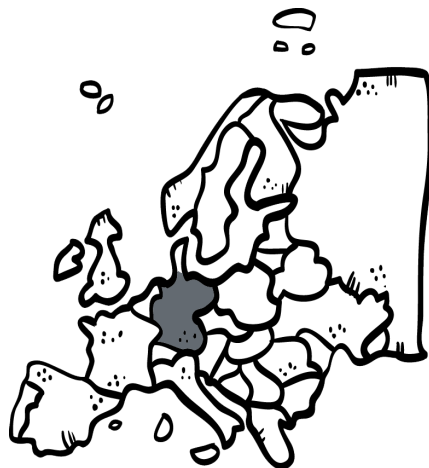
Poulnabrone Dolmen

National Park.

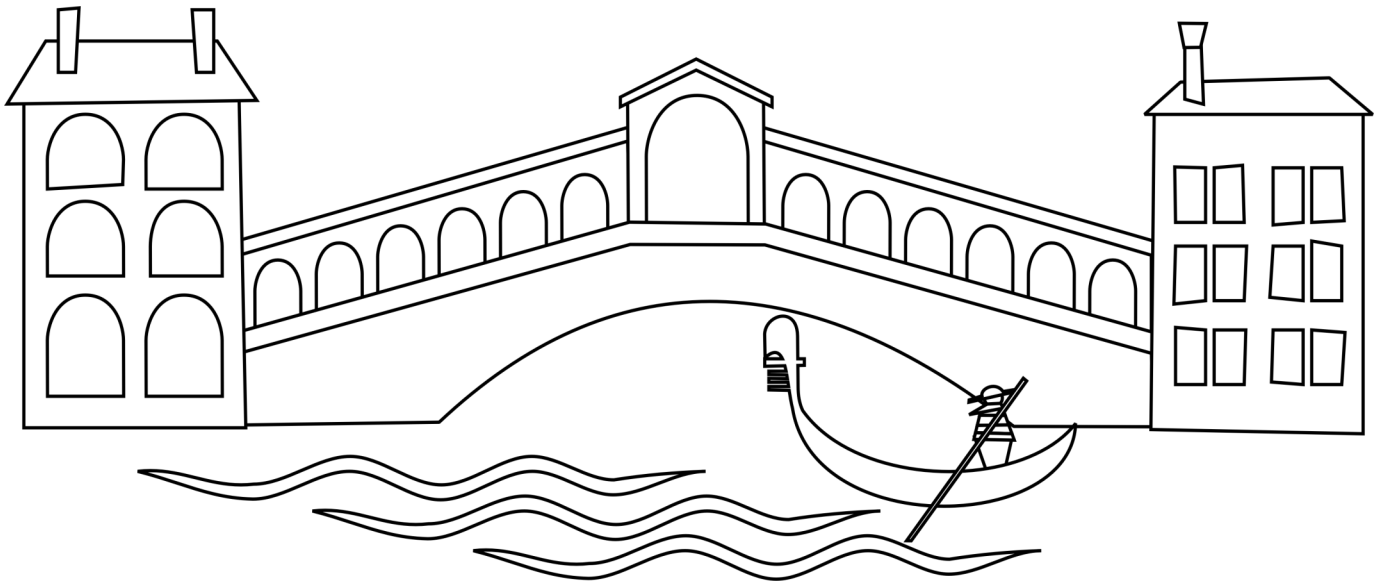




Reichstag

government business.

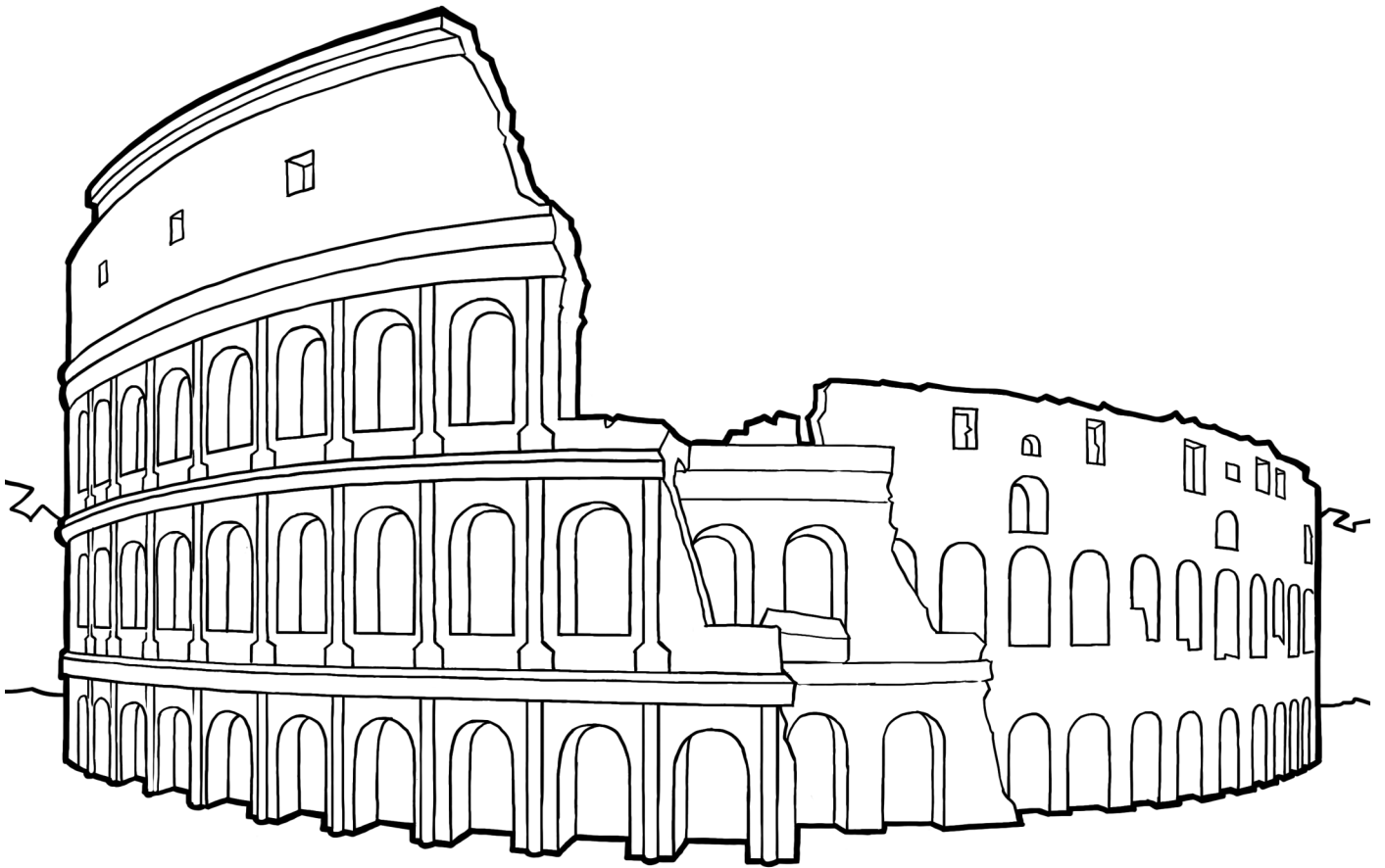




Rialto Bridge

gondola ferry.





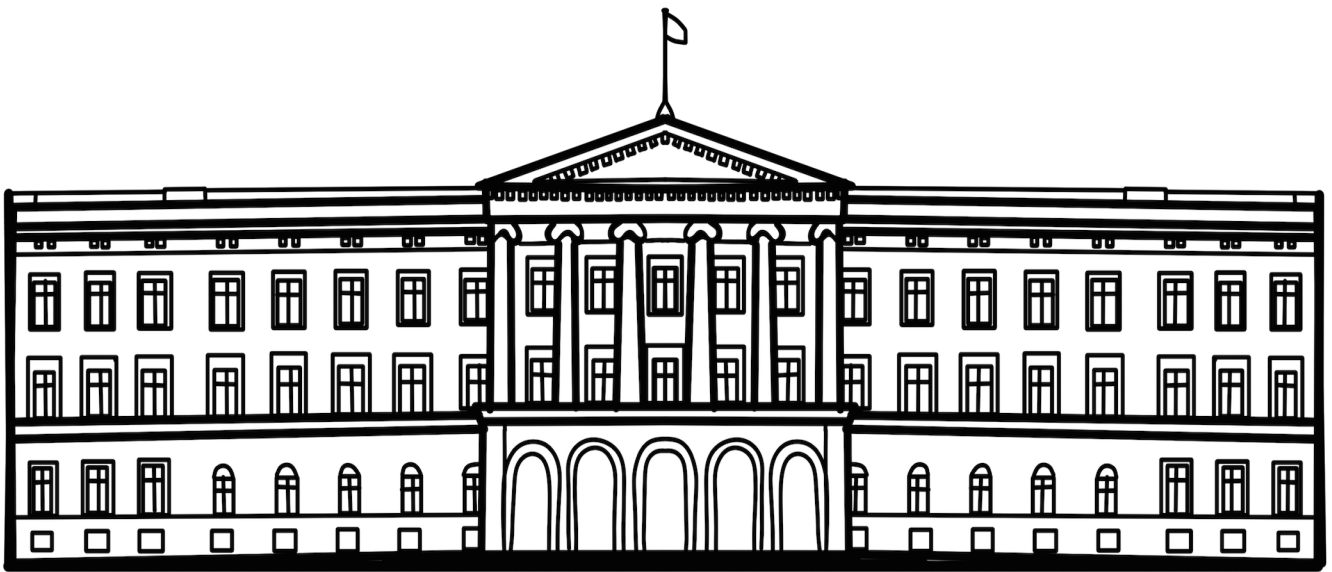
Roman Colosseum

built.



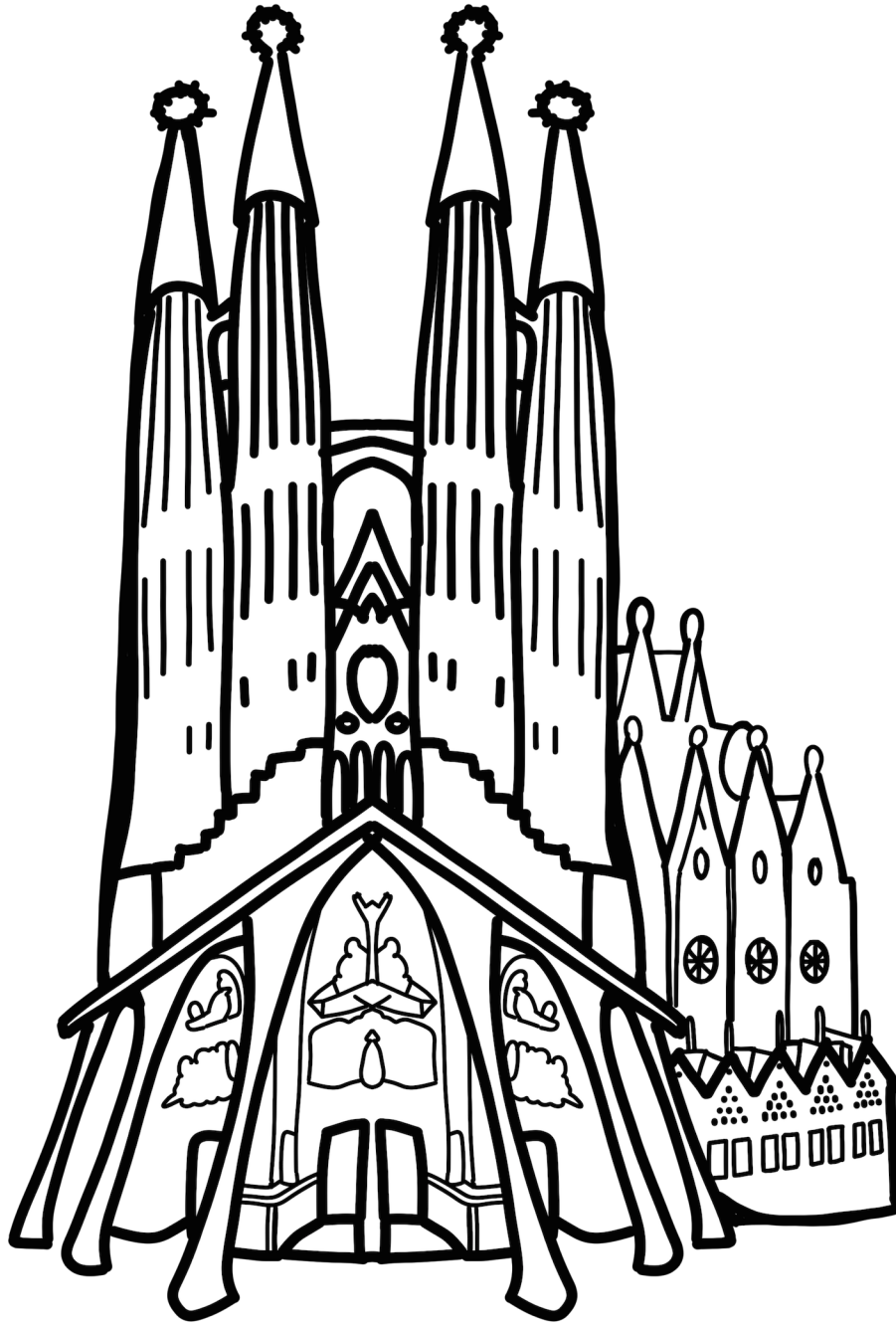


Royal Palace

in Barcelona, Spain.

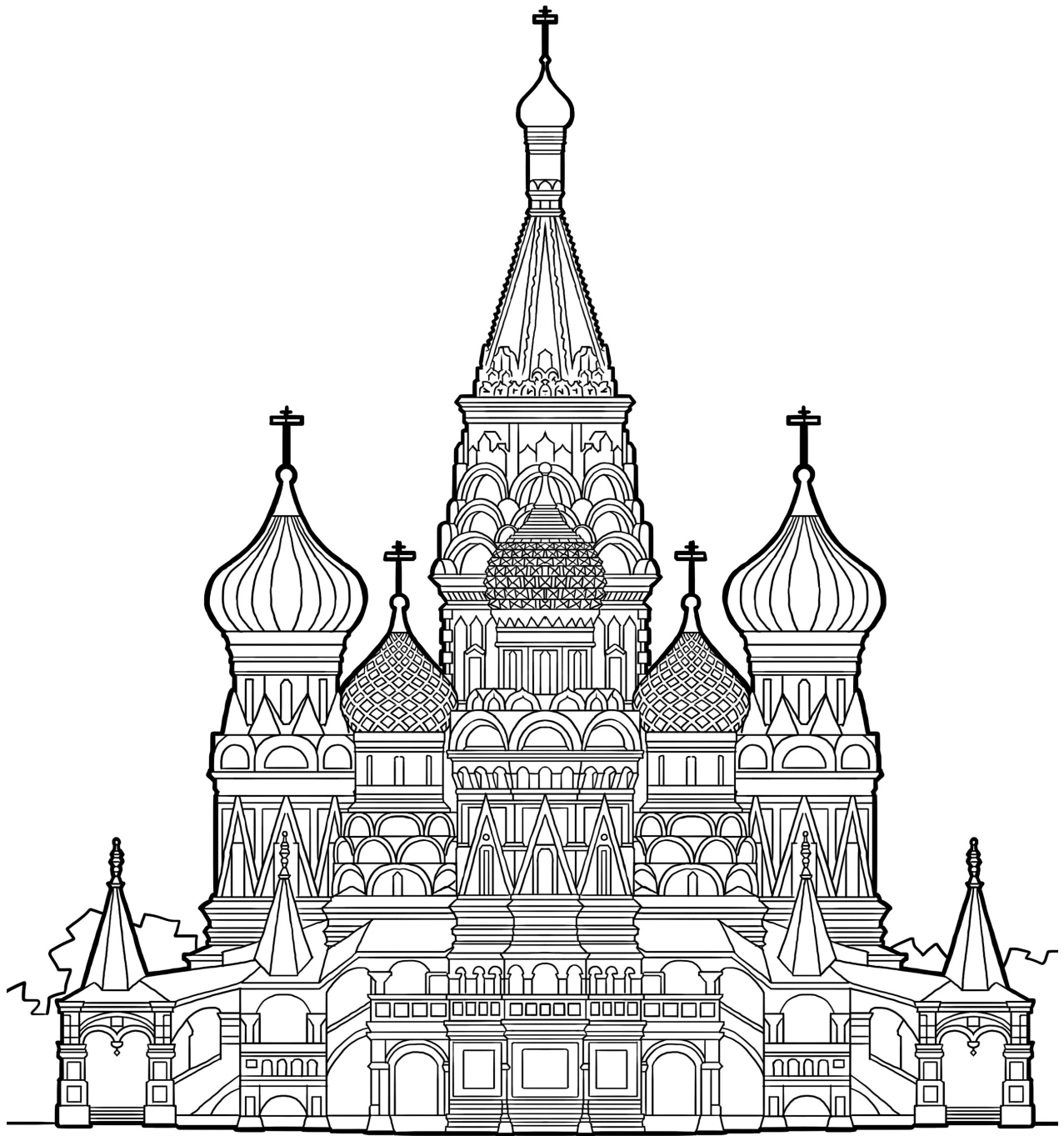
The church was

in 2010.

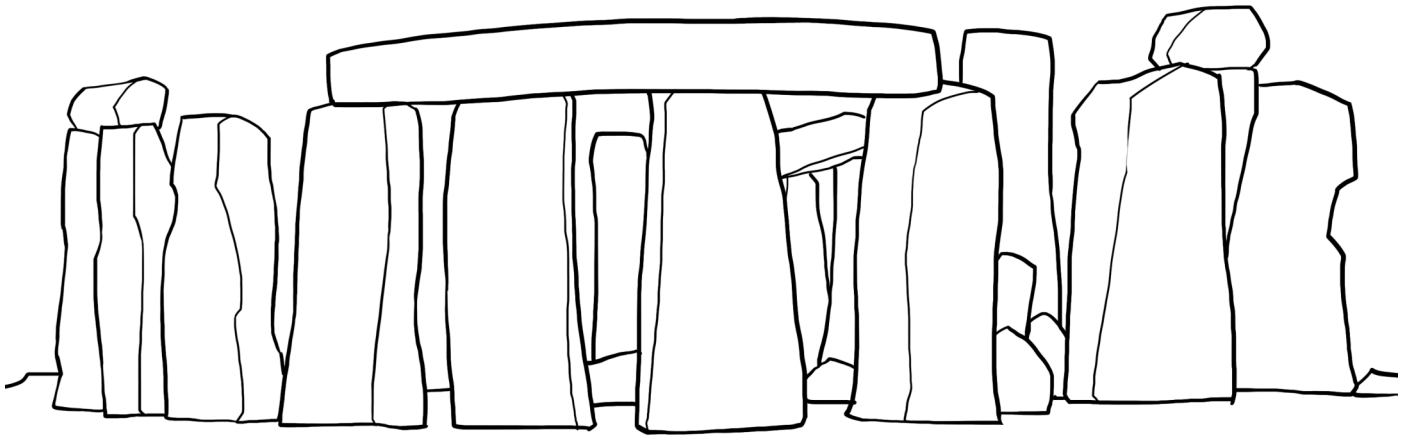




St. Basil's Cathedral

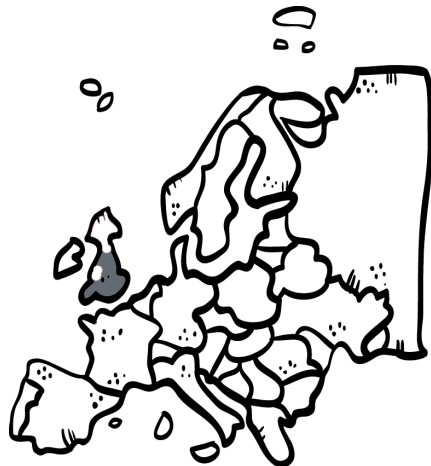
St. Basil's Cathedral

and 1560.

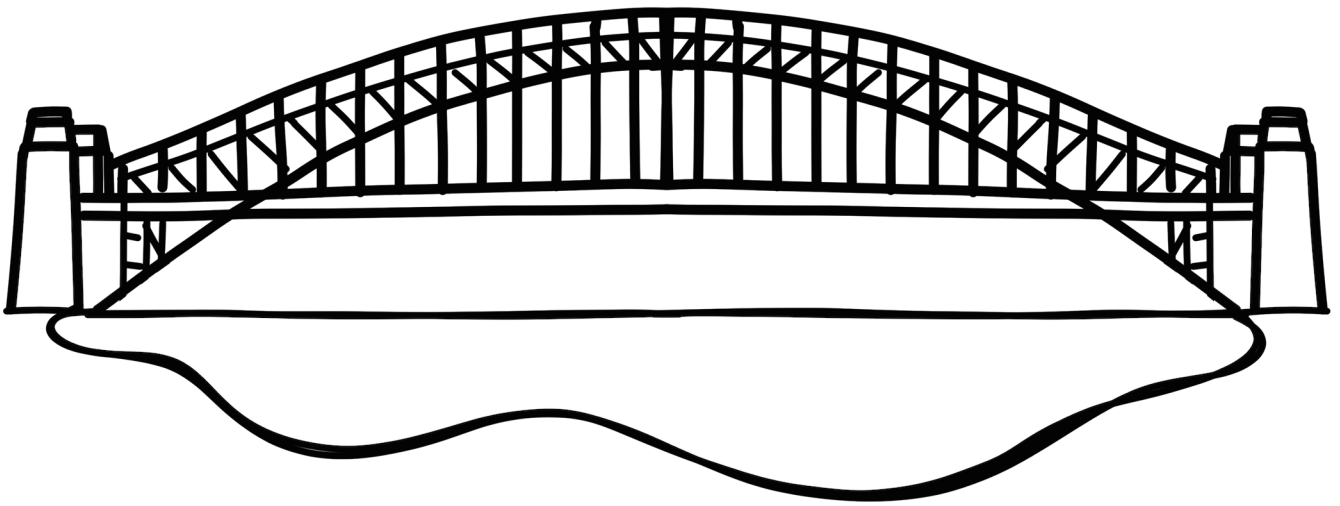




Stonehenge

in 1959, and its

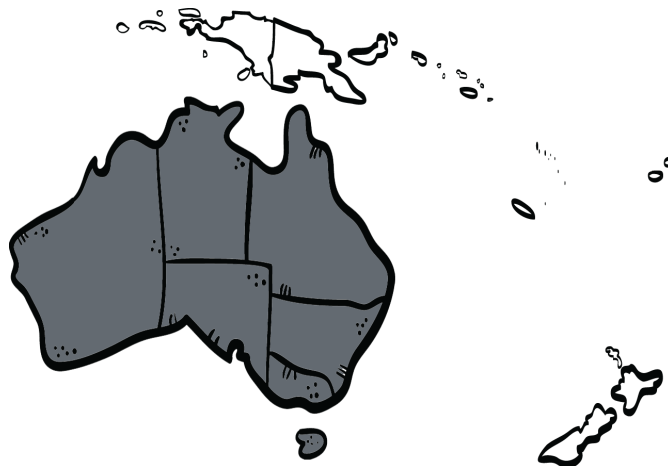
grand opening was

to recognize.



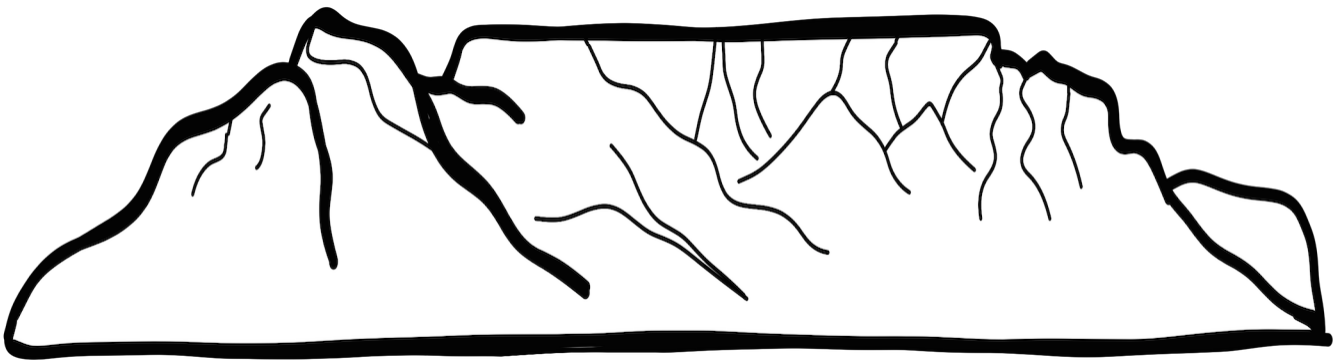
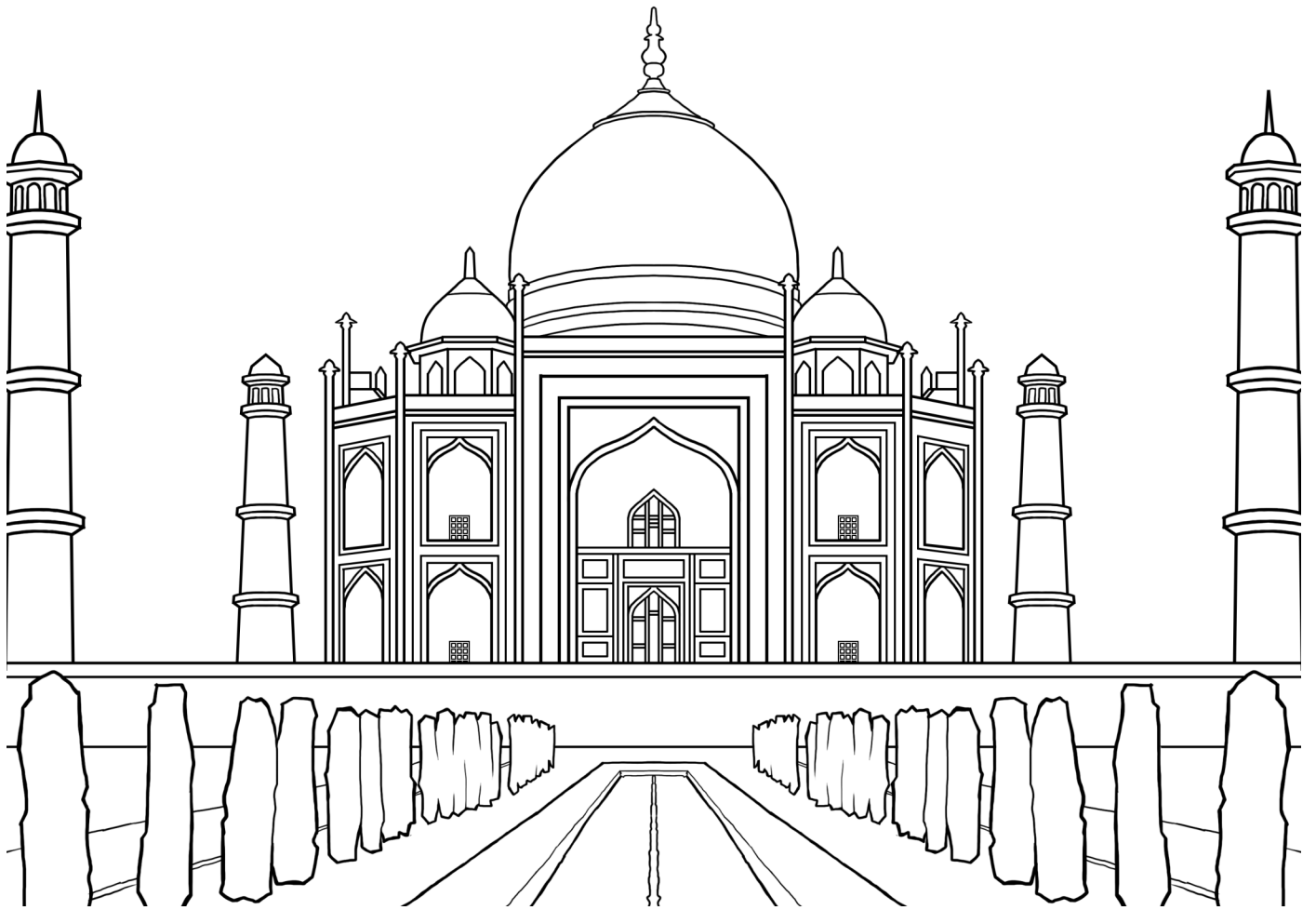


Table Mountain

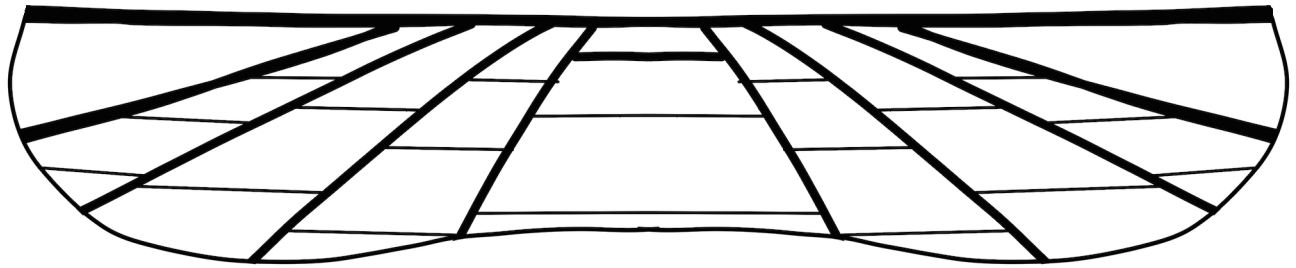
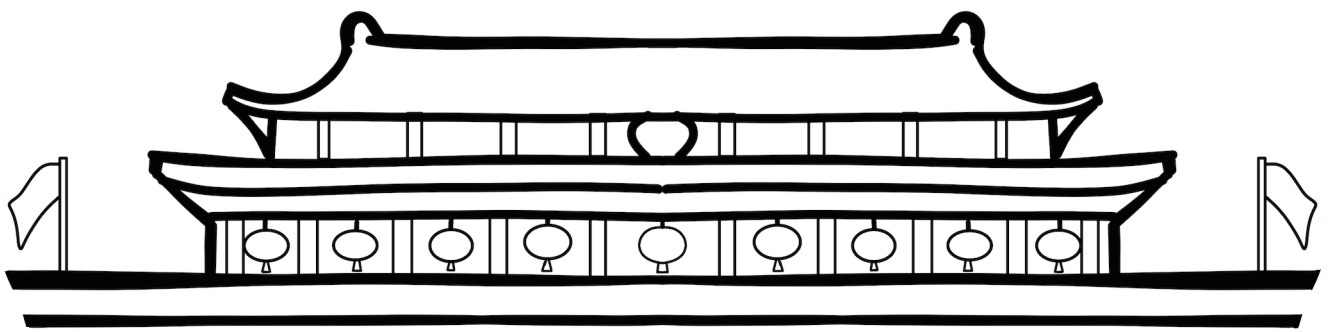




Taj Mahal

1630 and 1650.

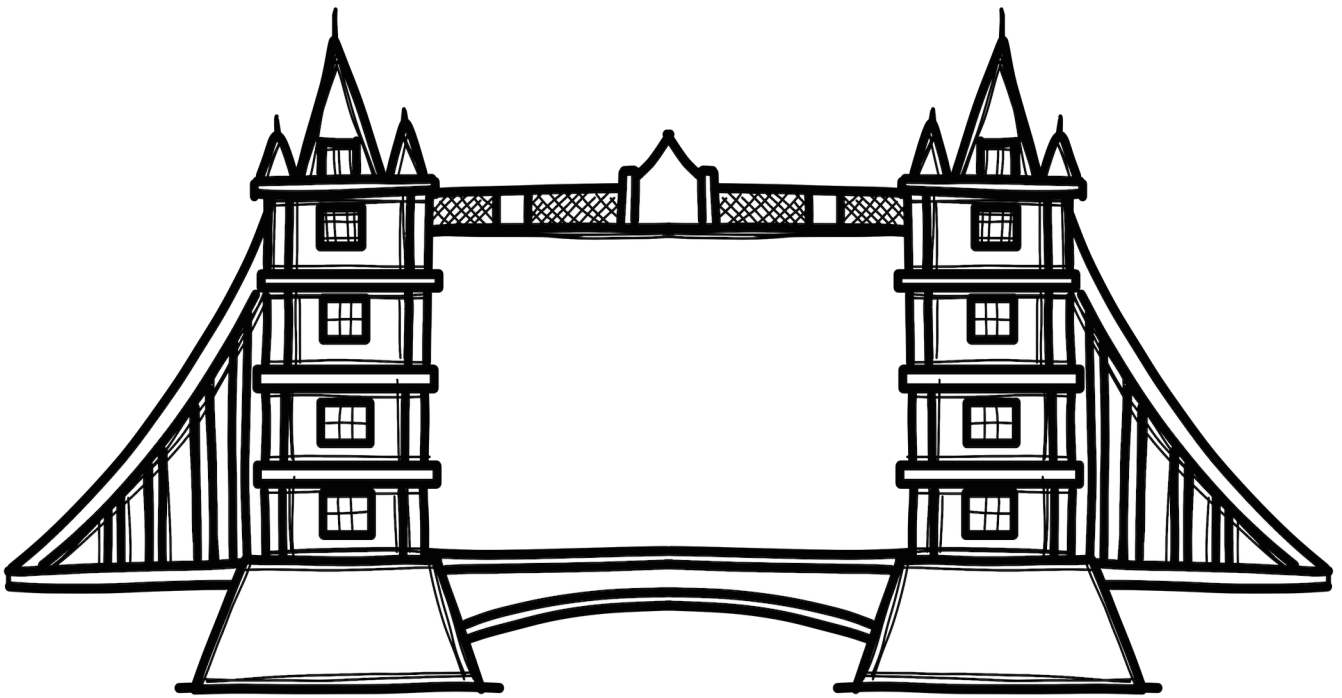




Tiananmen Square

entrance.

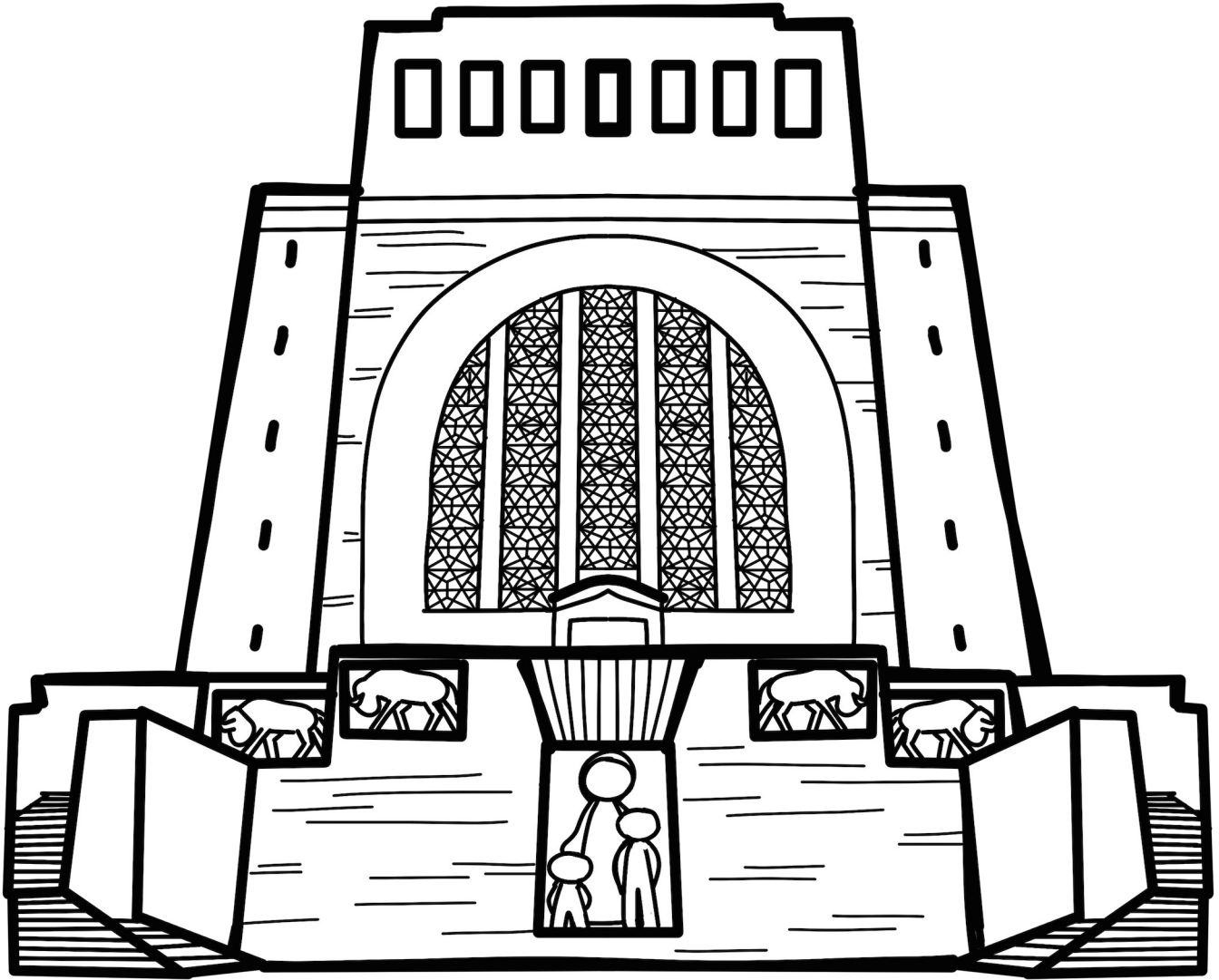




Tower Bridge

a monument to the

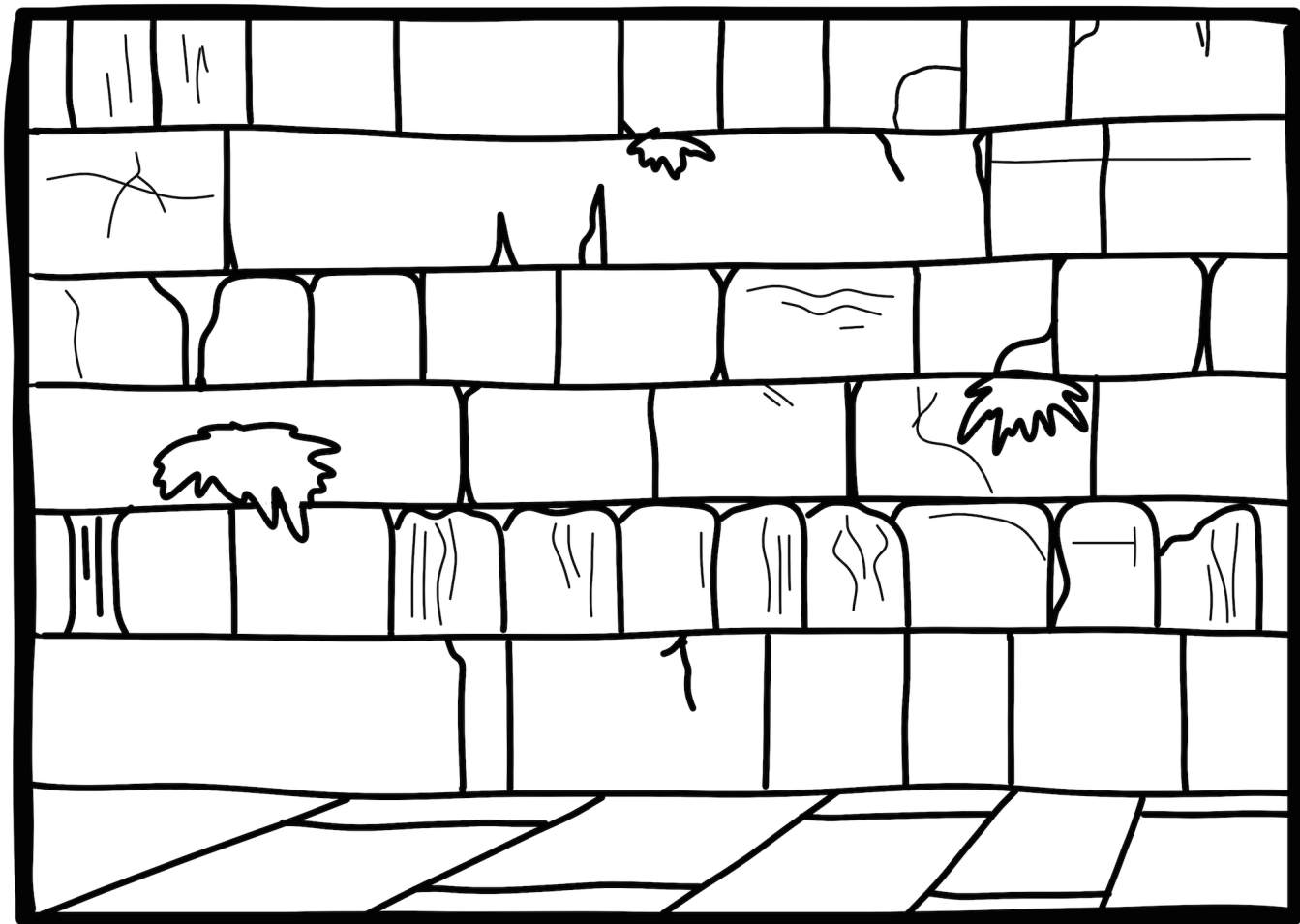
pioneer history of
