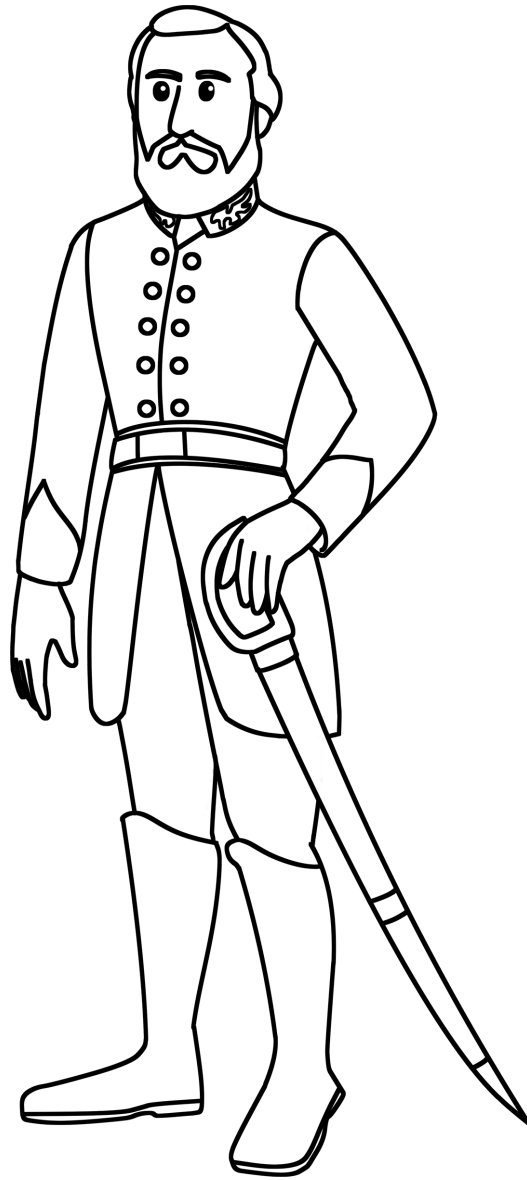

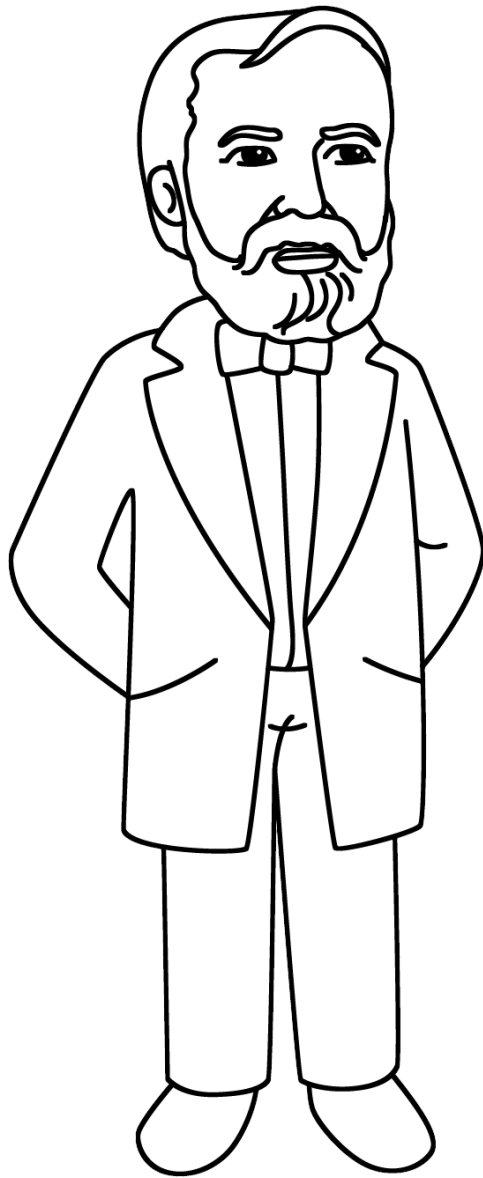

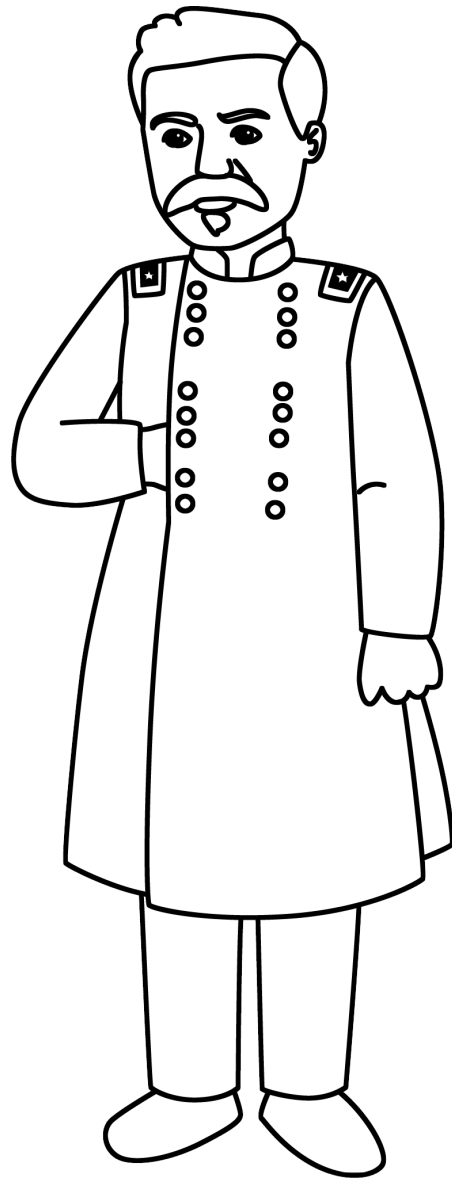
Confederate General

Battle of Bull Run.



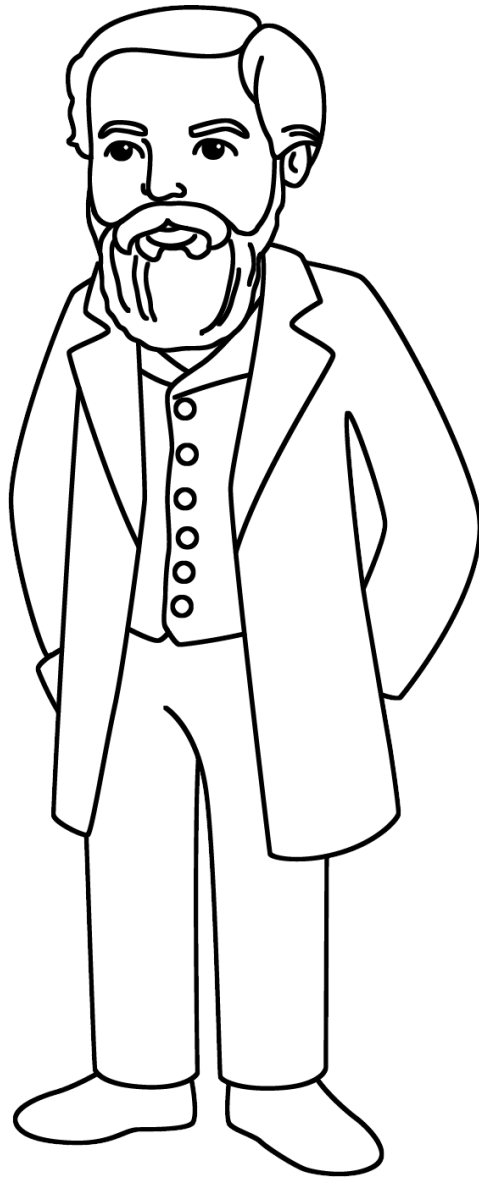
George Meade

Battle of Gettysburg.



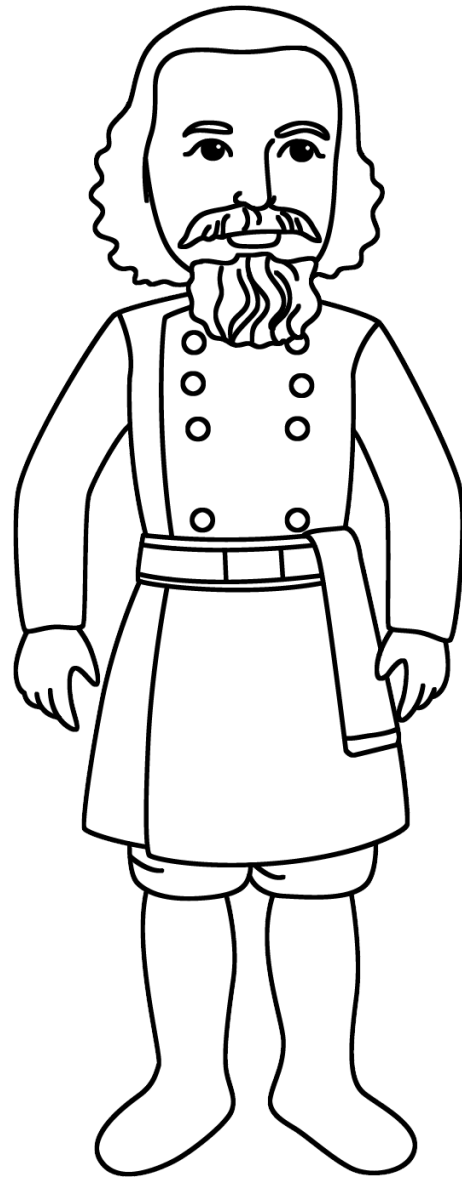
Confederate General

General Grant.



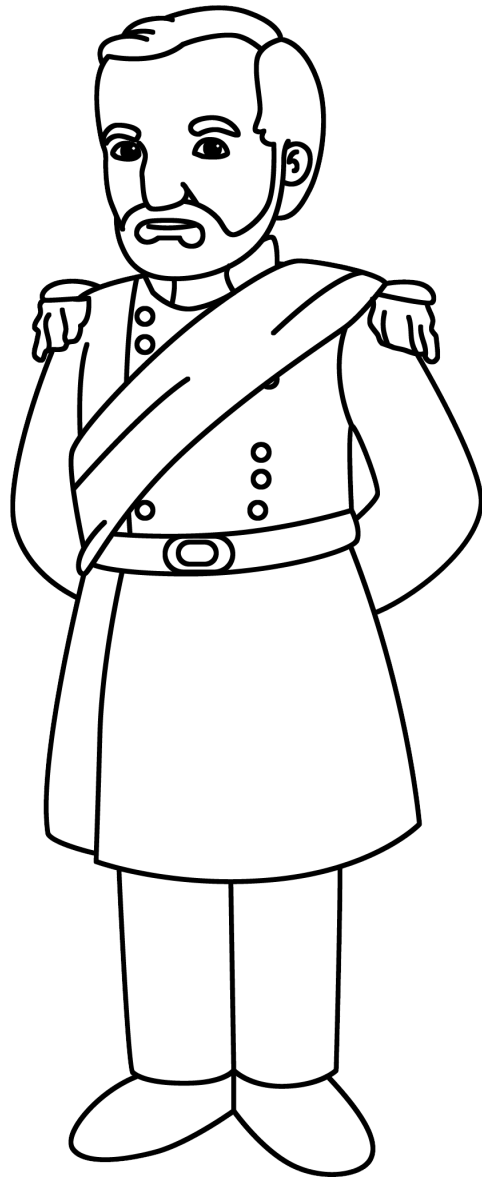

General Bragg.



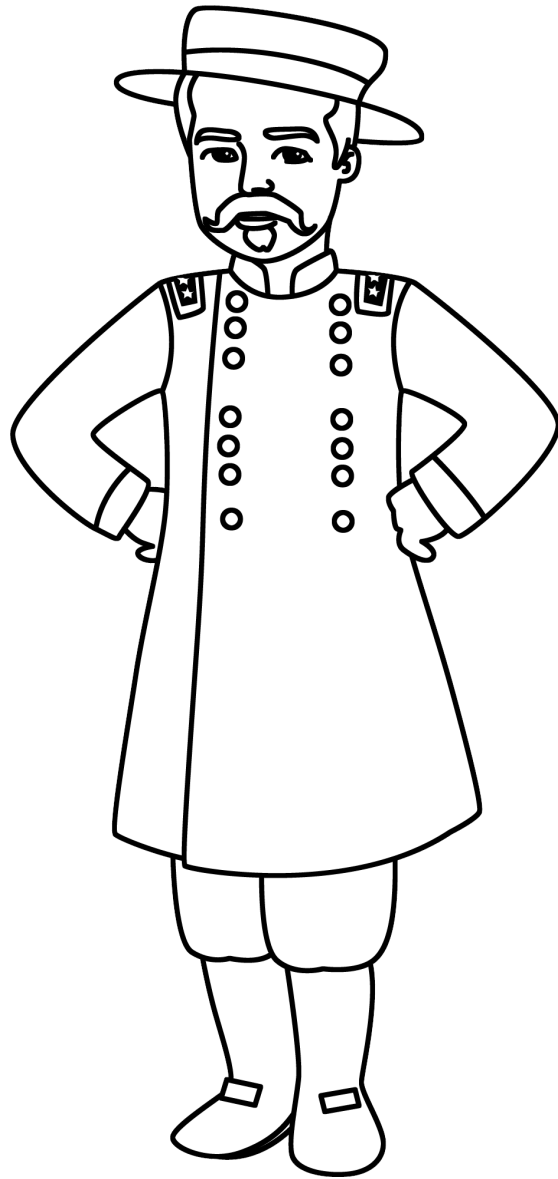

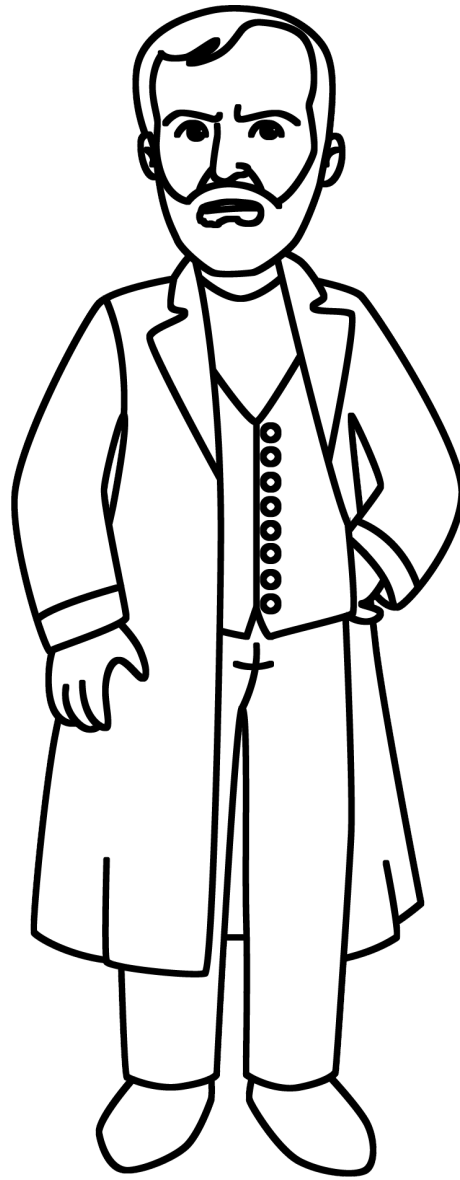
Philip Sheridan led a

General J.E.B. Stuart.



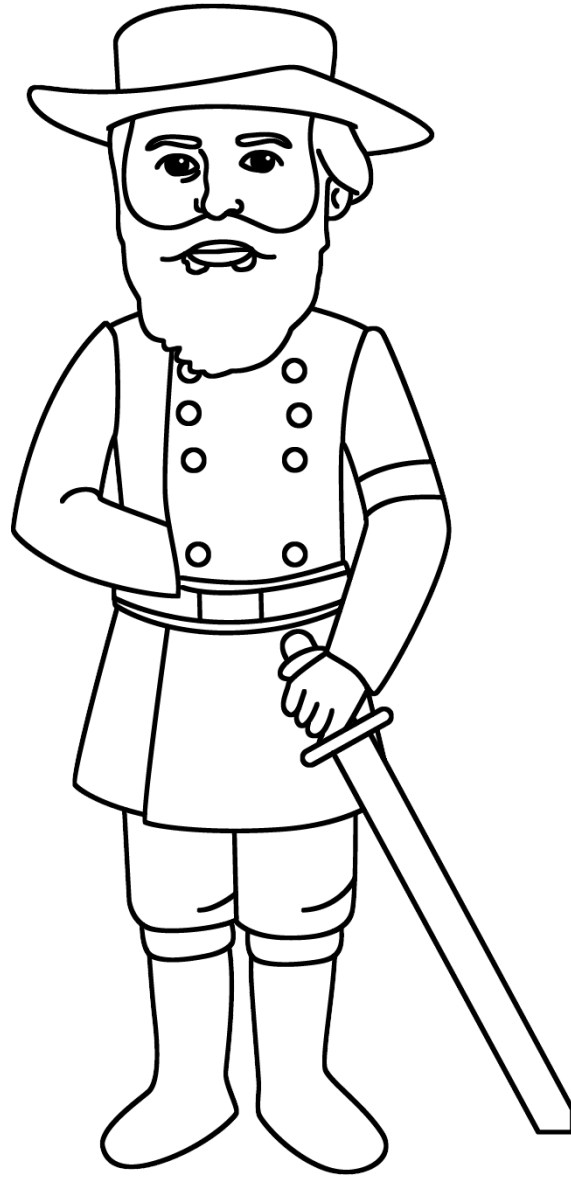
Union General
