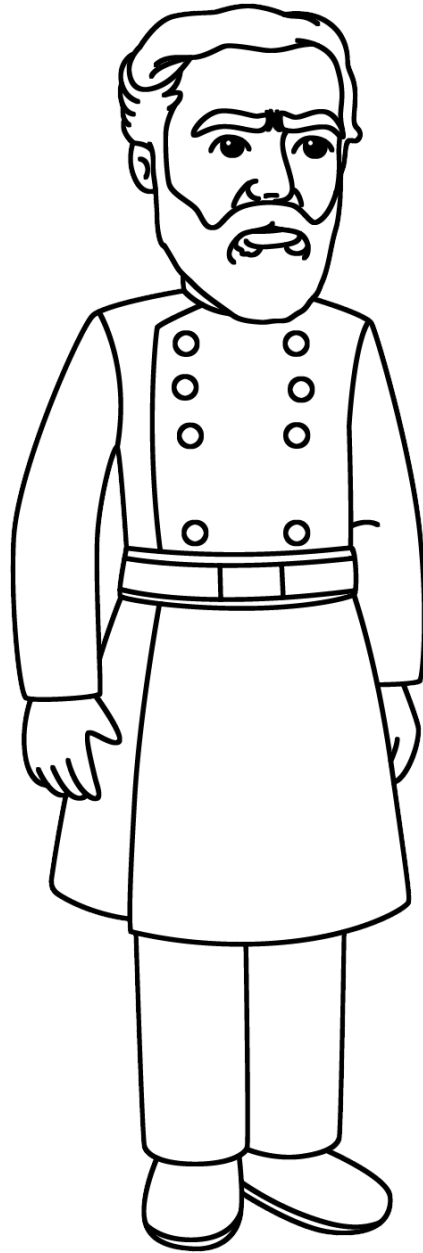


Confederate General P.G.T.

Fort Sumter.

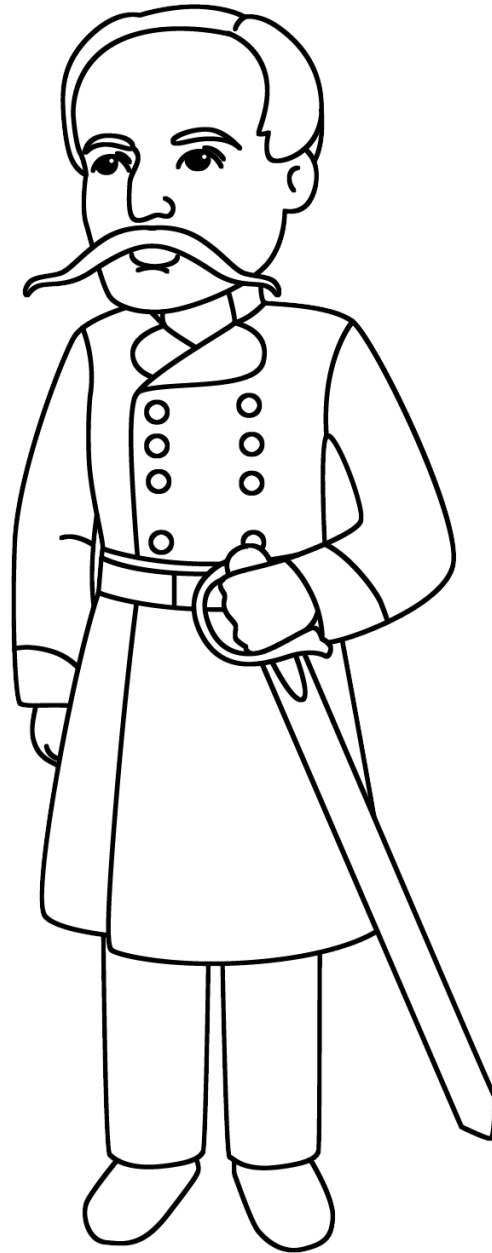


General Braxton Bragg

Battle of Vicksburg.

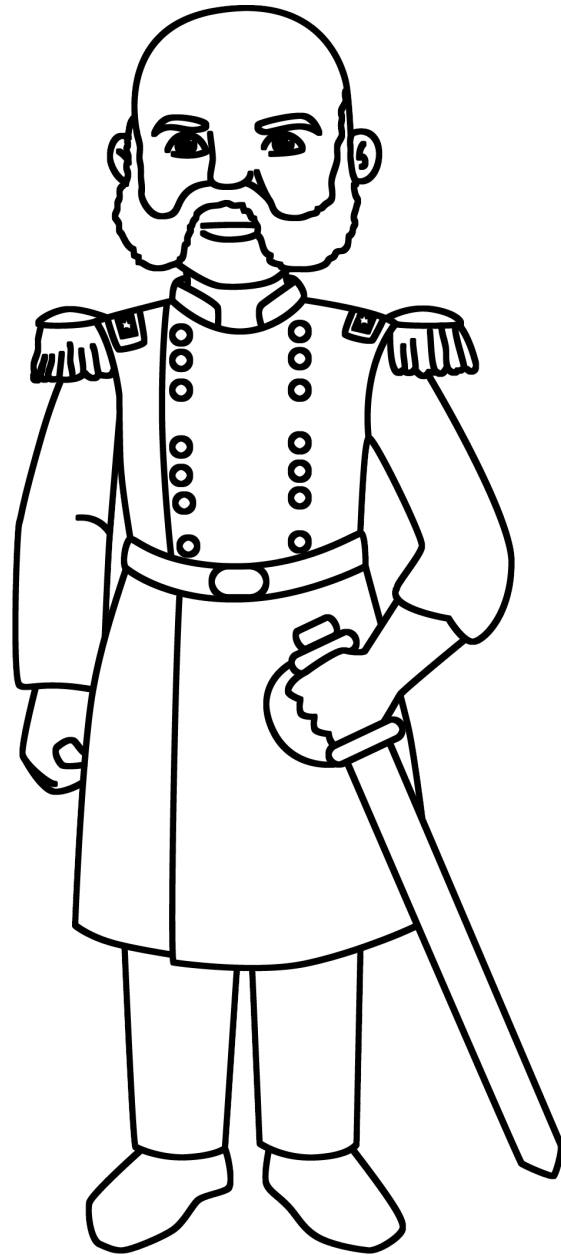


Union General John Buford

Battle of Gettysburg.

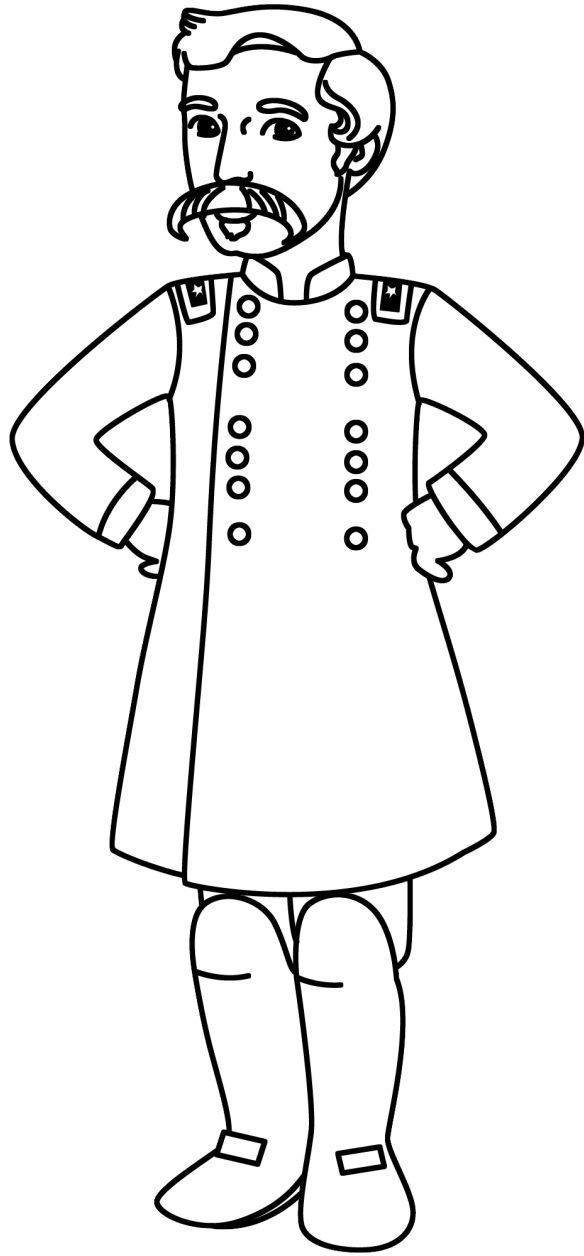


General Ambrose Burnside

at Appomattox.

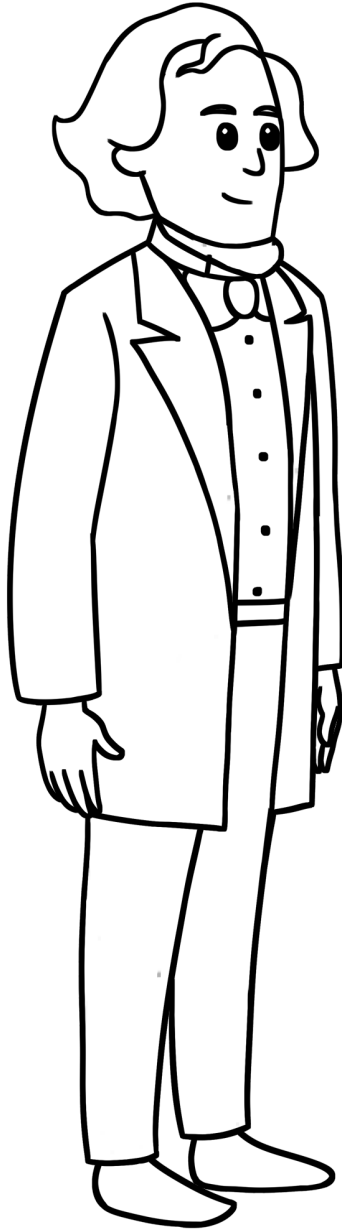

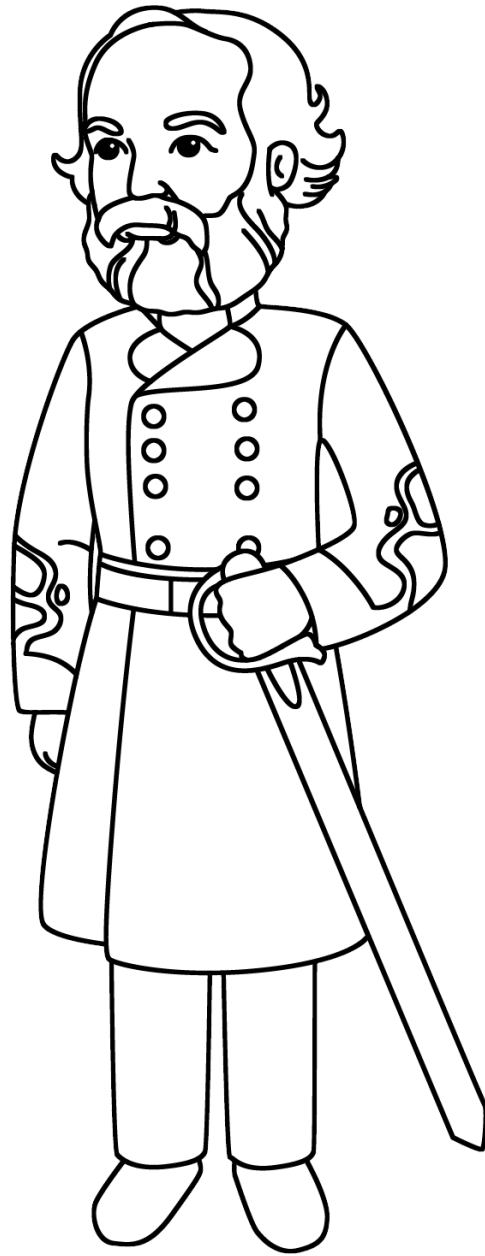
George Armstrong Custer

of America.

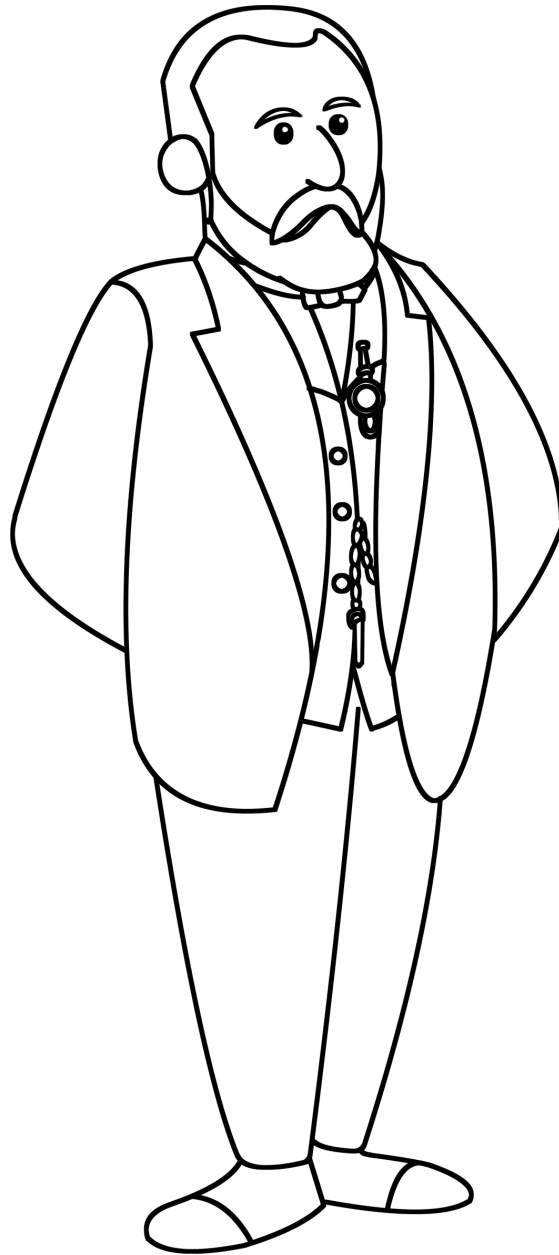


Jubal Early became a

First Battle of Bull Run.

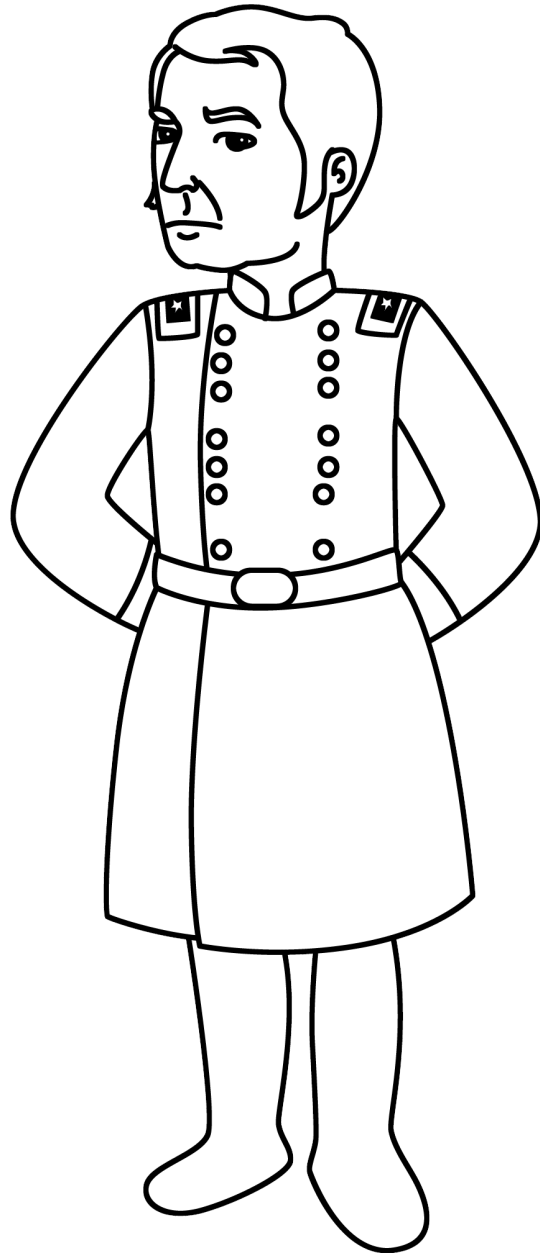


General Ulysses S. Grant

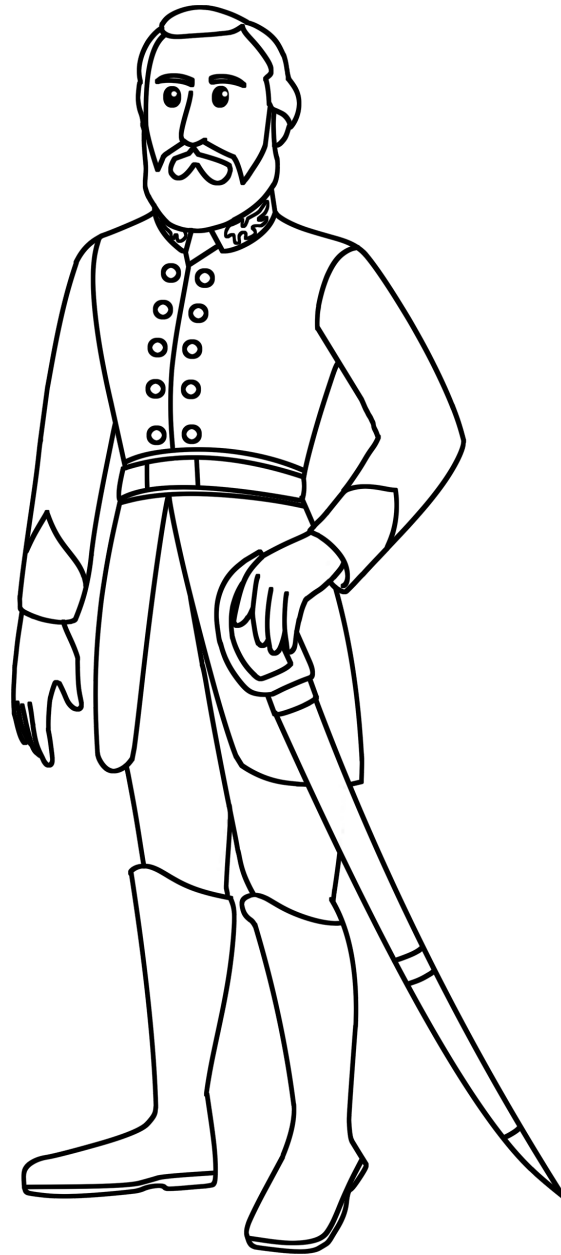
took General Lee's

Robert E. Lee

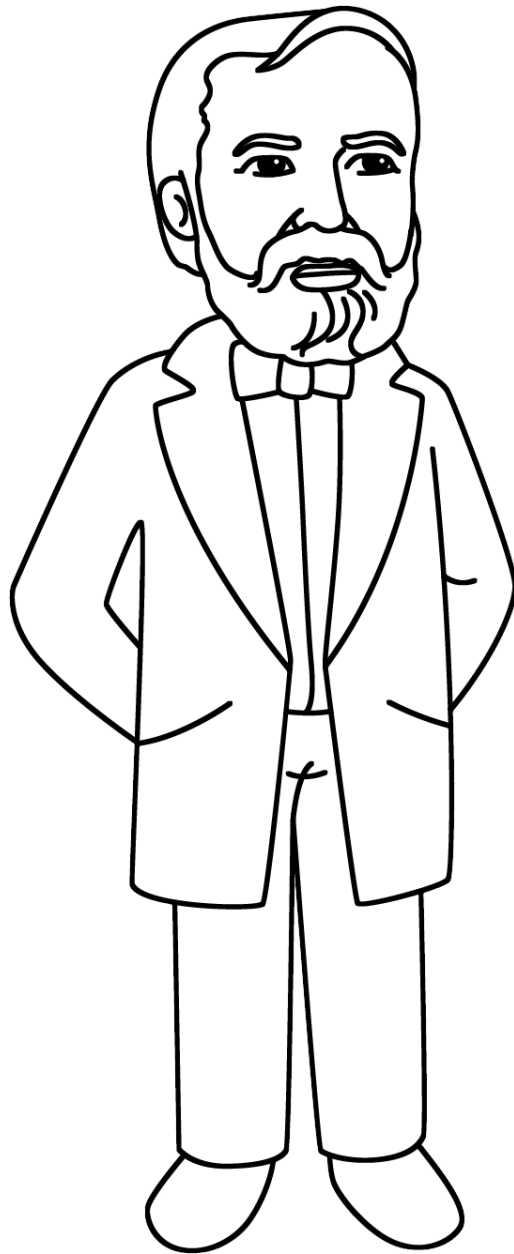
bravely led the

the Civil War.

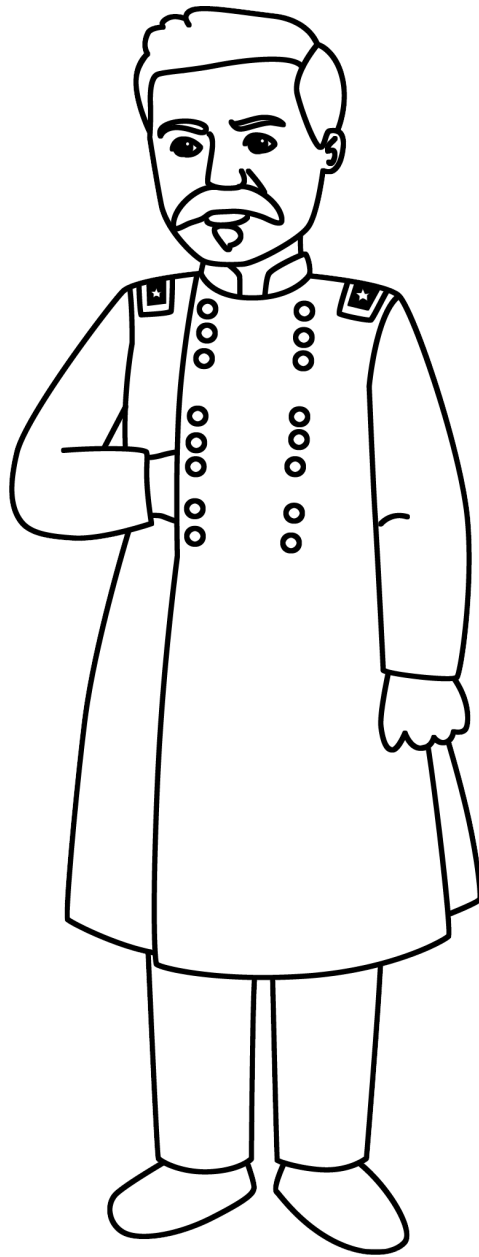


Confederate General

George McClellan

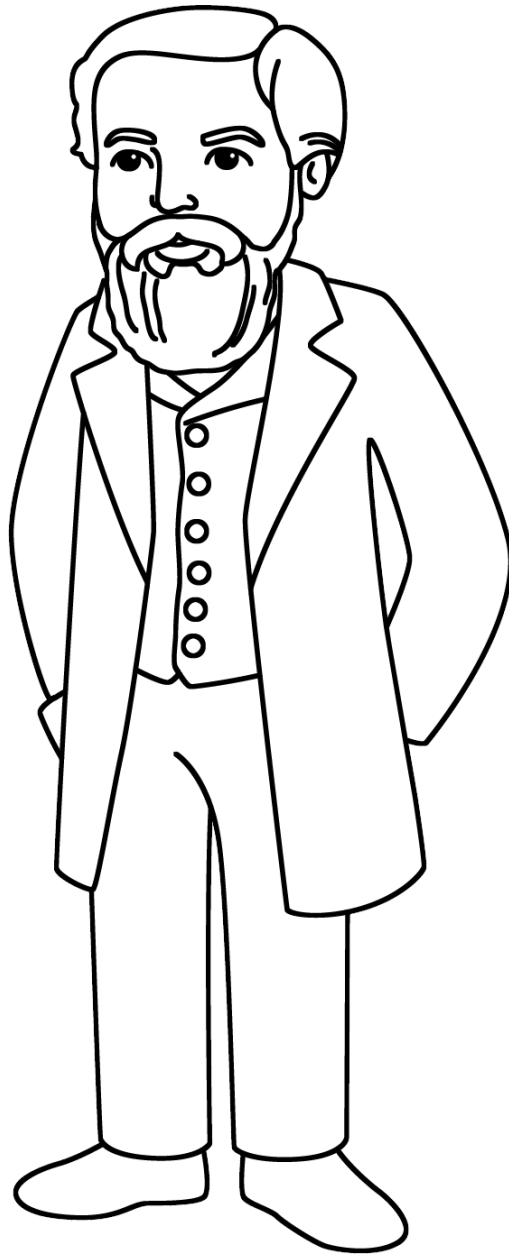
commanded the Army of

Battle of Gettysburg.

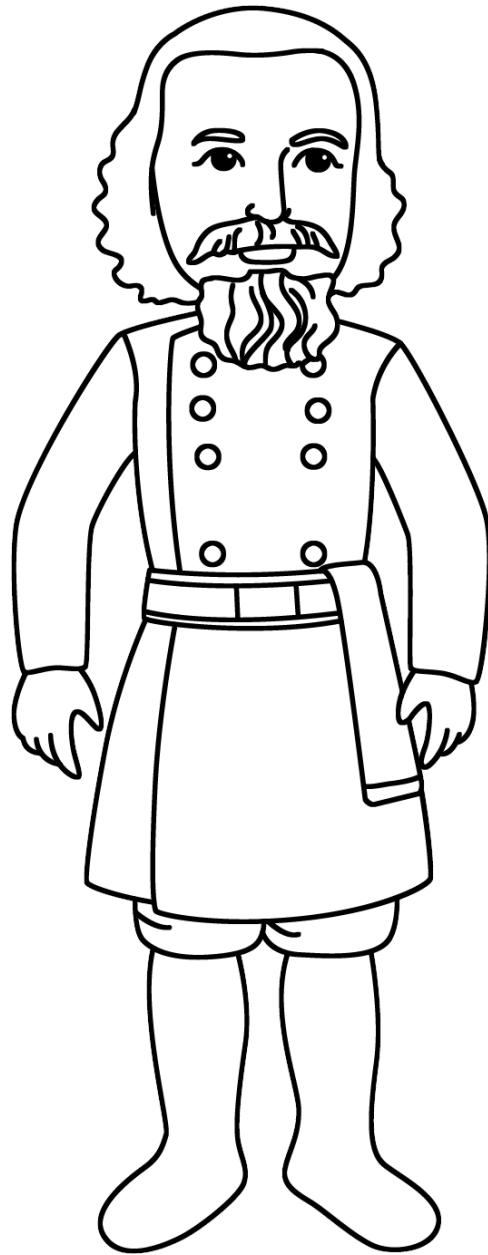


Confederate General

Union General Grant.

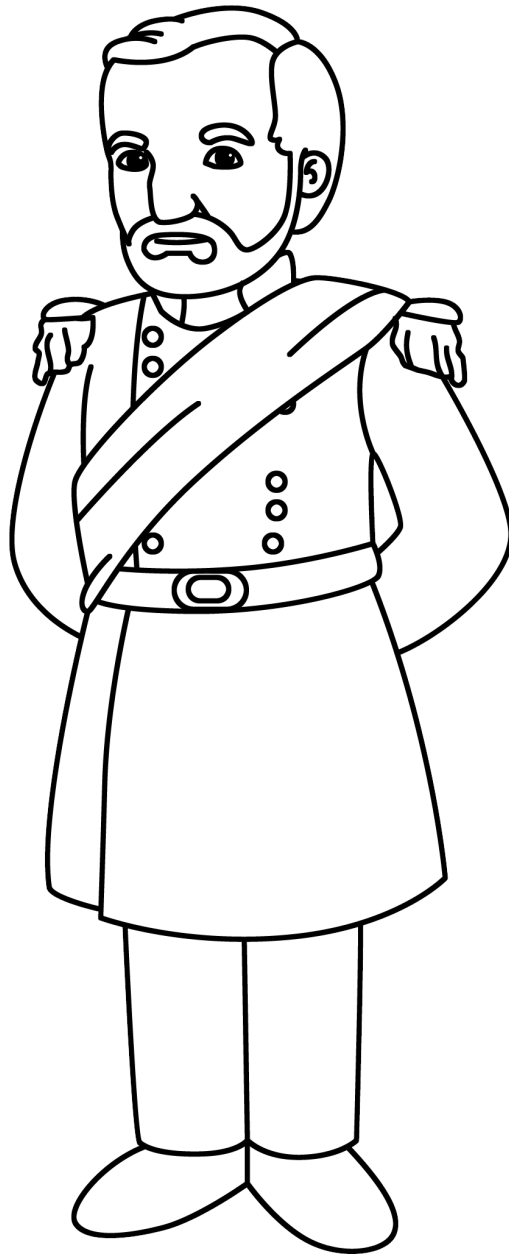


Confederate General

Battle of Gettysburg.

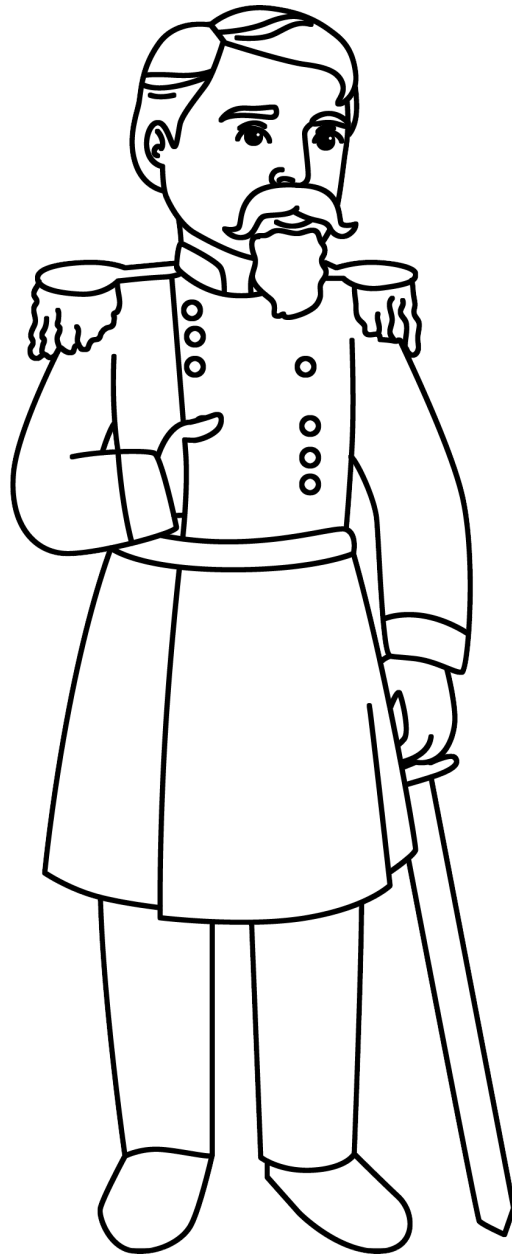


Union General

to General Bragg.

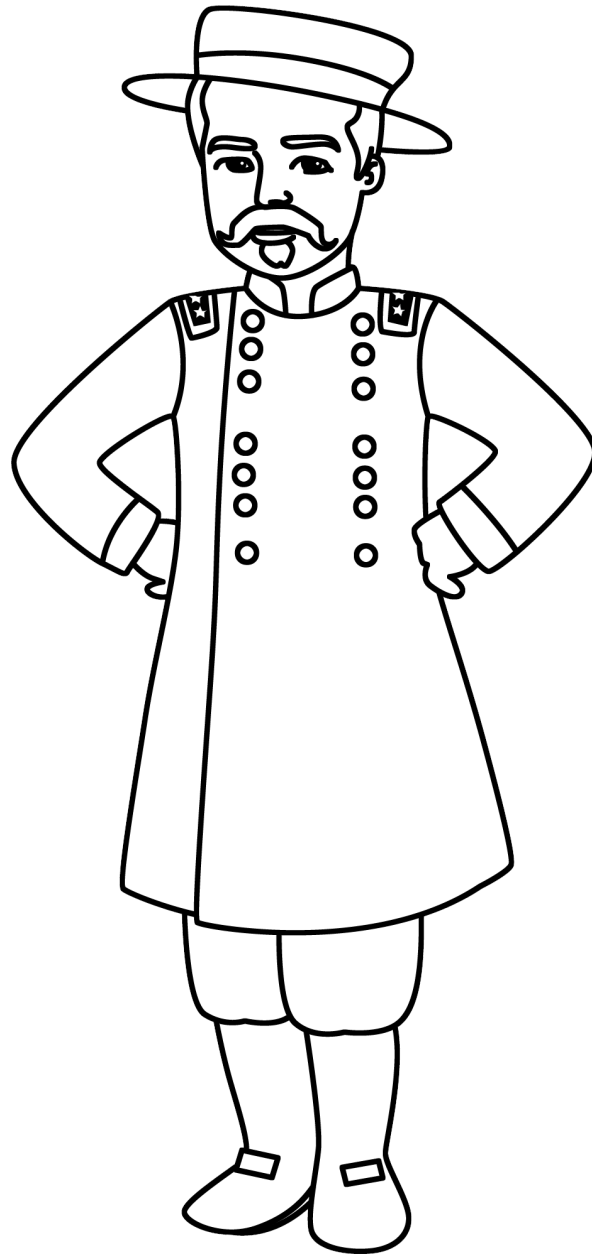

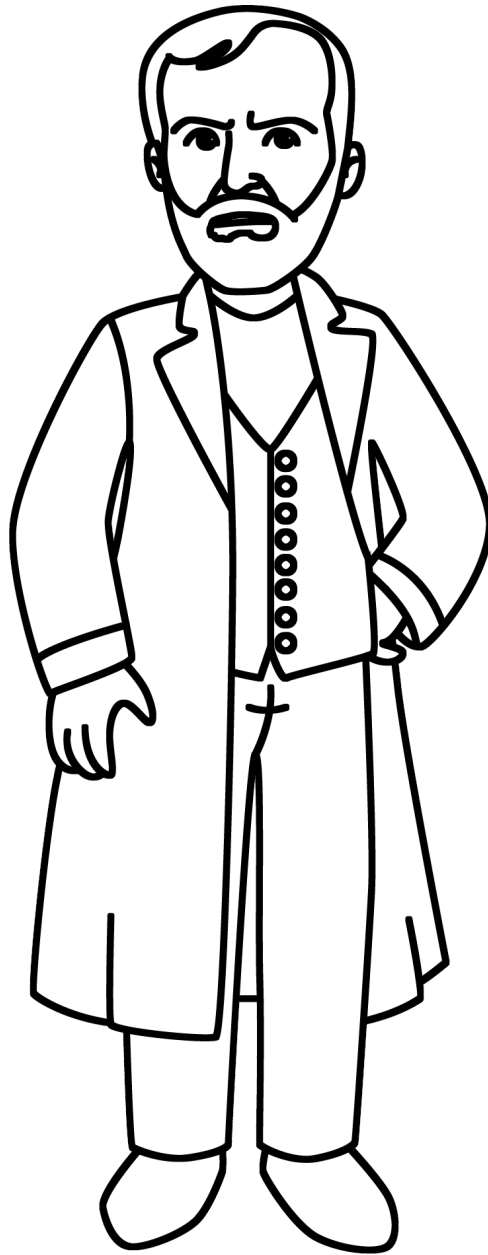
Winfield Scott

General J.E.B. Stuart.

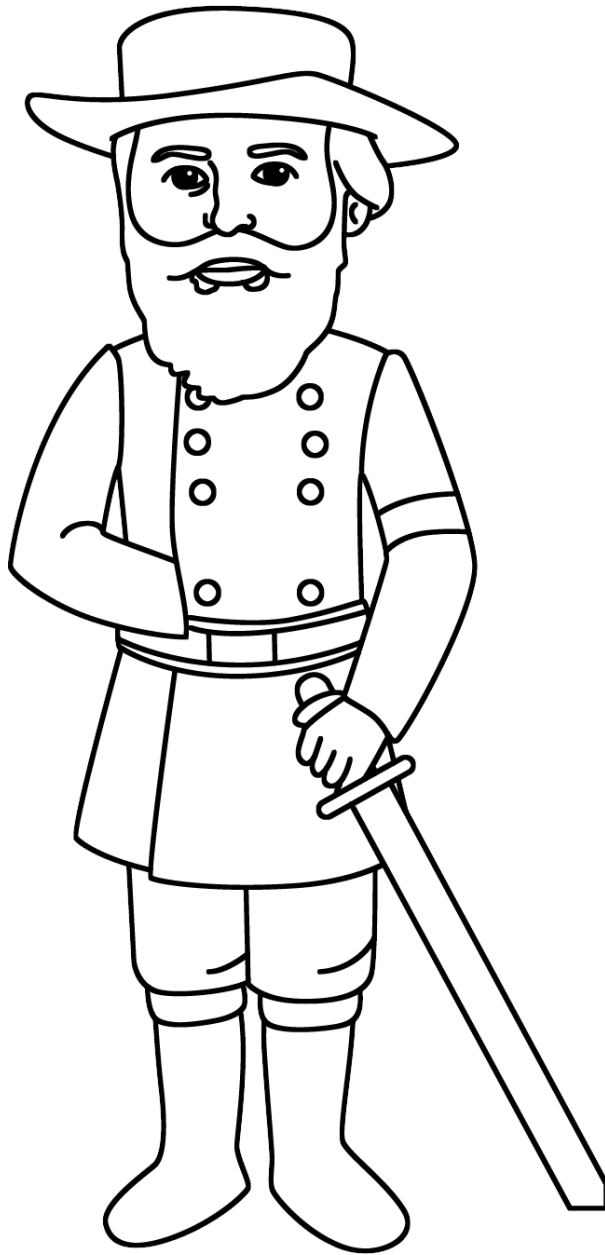


Union General William
