

## Introduction

Exploring the United States: Timelines, Critical Thinking, and Map Work Volume 3 explores the states of Illinois, Alabama, Maine, Missouri, Arkansas, Michigan, Florida, Texas, Iowa, and Wisconsin. It's ideal for 9th-12th grade. A short introduction to each state is provided along with 20 facts that the students must arrange in a timeline. Five critical thinking questions are also included for each state, challenging the students to do independent research and form their own conclusions regarding important issues and events in the state's past as well as current events.

Each state's map work includes an outline of the state on which students can draw the location of major cities, bodies of water, mountains, and bordering states or bodies of water. The location of these places does not need to be exact; the exercise is meant to help students become familiar with the approximate location of the places and their relation to each other.

Each book concludes with 10 additional state chronology projects that combine timeline information for all 10 states covered in the unit.

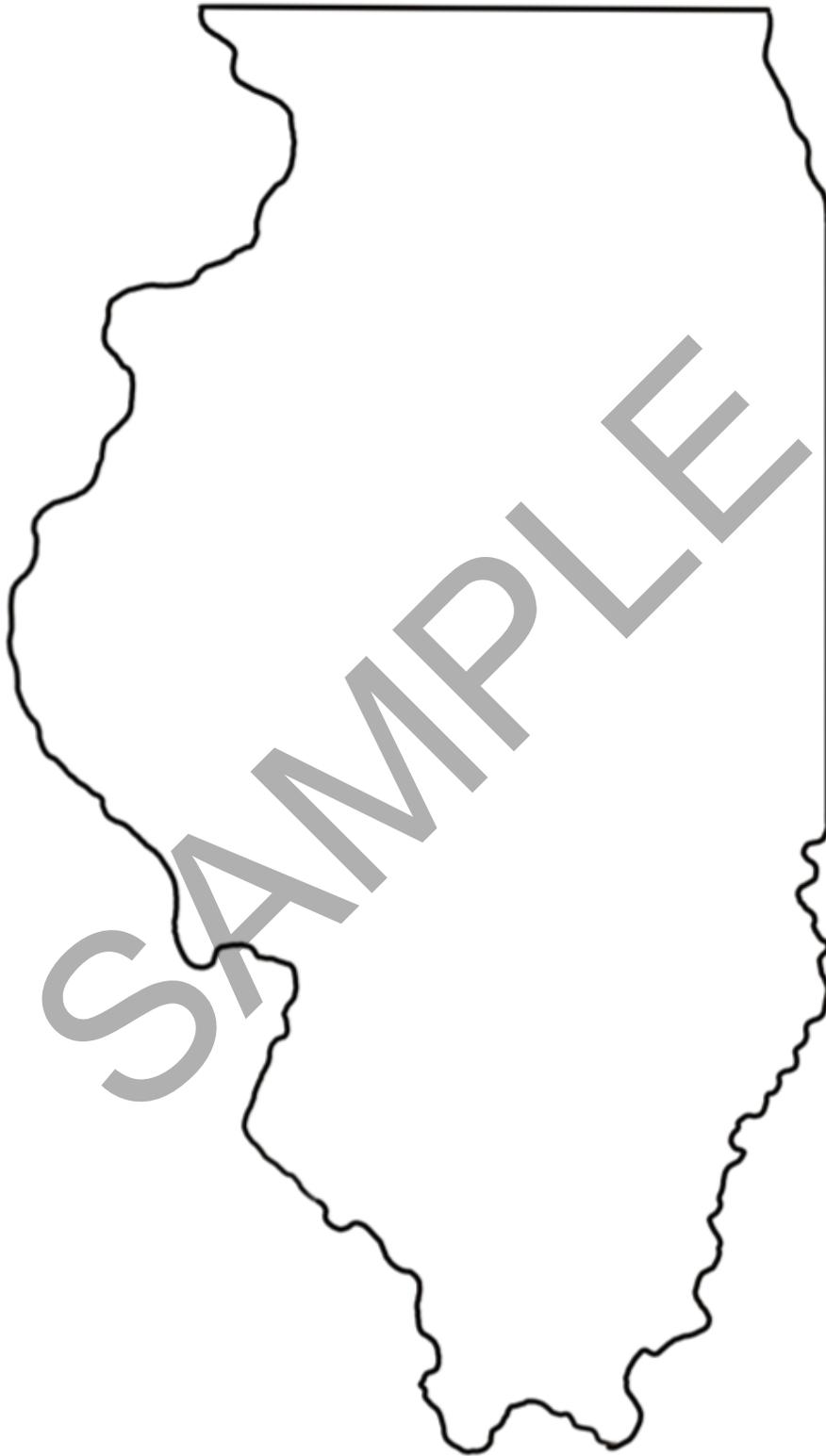
## December 3, 1818 Illinois Becomes a State

The state of Illinois has a long and interesting history. Illinois attracted many farmers in the days of the pioneers moving west. Eventually, the areas grew to the point that there was an adequate population to apply for statehood. Illinois officially became the twenty-first state of the Union on December 3, 1818. Abraham Lincoln lived in Illinois and became the nation's sixteenth president. The state sent many soldiers to fight for the Union in the Civil War, although there was some sympathy with the Confederacy in the southern part of the state. After the Civil War, Illinois grew quickly and became one of the most progressive states during the late 1890s through the early 1900s. Many famous people are from Illinois, including Ronald Reagan, Ernest Hemingway, Wyatt Earp, Carl Sandburg, Wild Bill Hickok, and Robert Todd Lincoln.

Look at the map of Illinois on the next page. Add the capital of Illinois to the map. Locate the cities of Chicago, Bloomington, Peoria, Rockford, Decatur, Danville, Joliet, and Aurora and add them to the map. Also, locate Lake Shelbyville, the Illinois River, Kaskaskia River, Mississippi River, Sangamon River, Spoon River, and the Illinois and Mississippi Canal and add them. Also add the Shawnee Hills (Illinois Ozarks). Lastly, label the states, provinces, or bodies of water that border Illinois.
