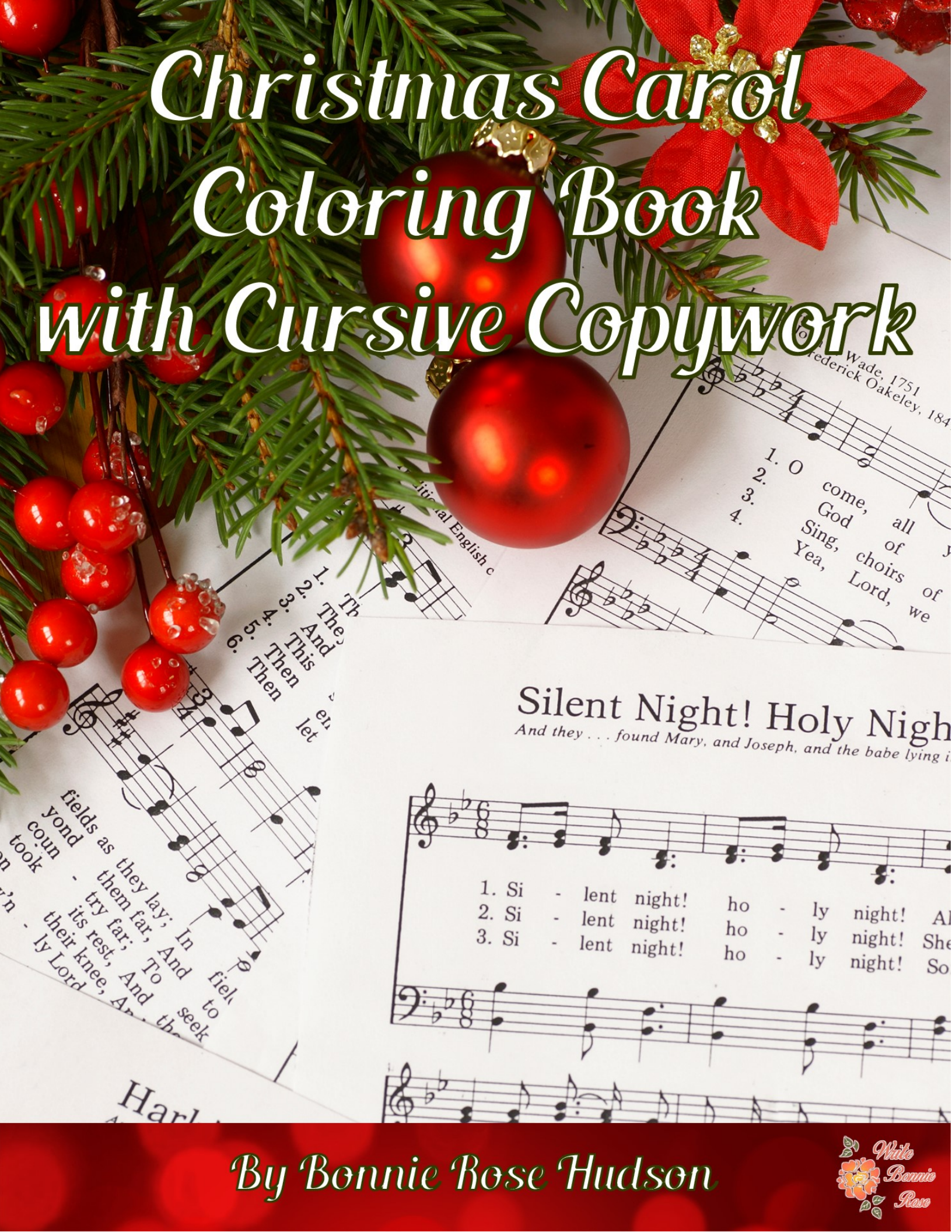

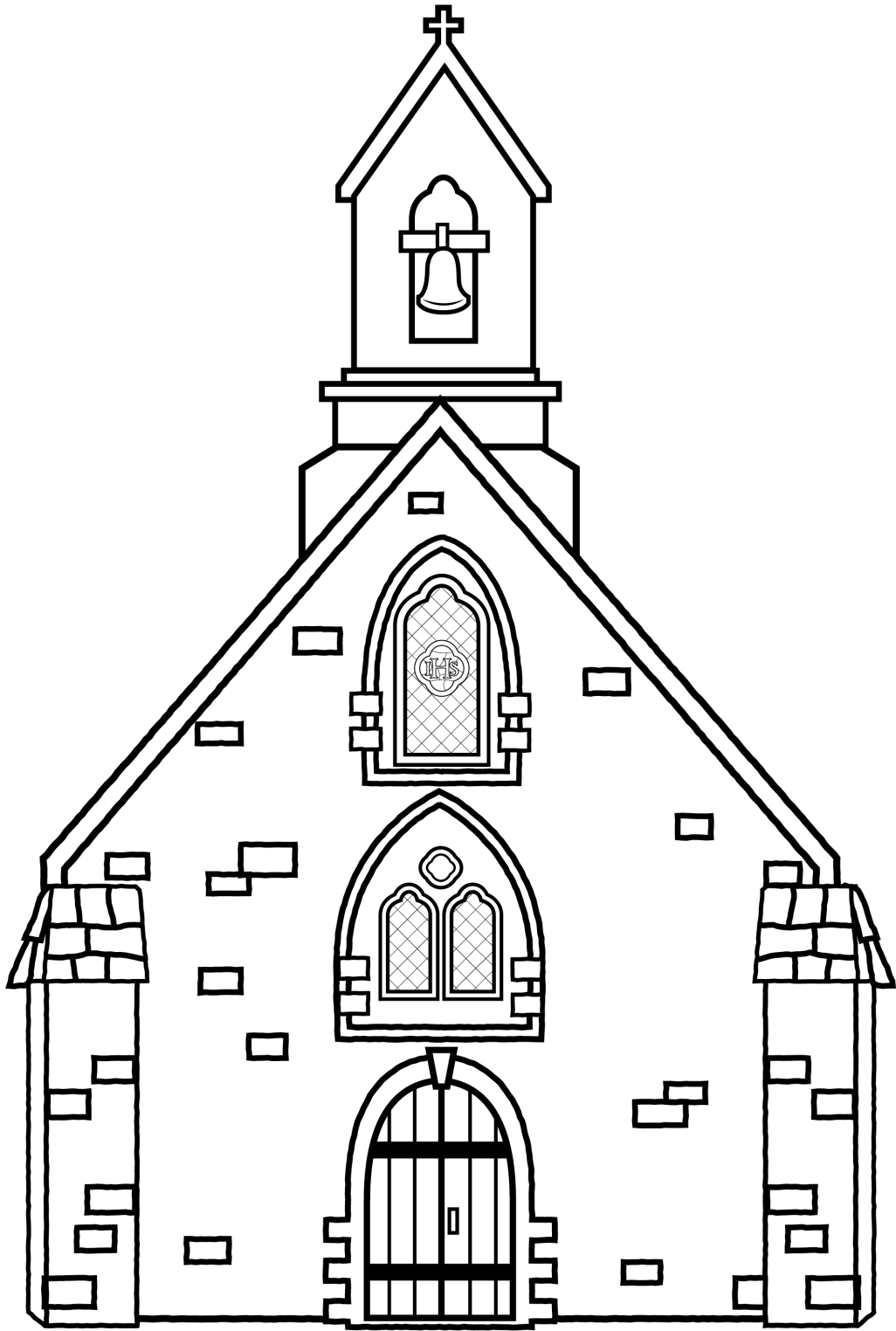

## Introduction

Singing Christmas songs is one of my favorite parts of getting ready for Christmas, and I love discovering verses I'm not familiar with in classic carols I've sung for years. This unit includes short excerpts from fifteen popular Christmas carols. Some of the excerpts are well-loved lines while others are from lesser-known portions of the songs. I wish space would have allowed me to include all the lines of these marvelous songs, but that would have led to an extraordinarily long book (not to mention cramping fingers for those doing the copywork). I encourage you to find the full lyrics to these songs and sing them with your children.
