### People of the Time of Henry VIII

Henry VIII was the king of England at the time the English Reformation began. Because of his focus on having a male heir to the throne, he married six times and, in the process, broke the religious ties of the monarchy to the Roman Catholic Church. In these years of changes for Britain, there were many well-known people who served in important positions and influenced the changes. Some of them are shown in the activity.

Below each fact in this activity there are lines with simple math problems under each. To learn the name of the person associated with the fact, read the fact and then do the math problem, using the key to decode which letter goes in the space.

### Queen Elizabeth and the Arts

The time of Queen Elizabeth's rule of England was known as the Elizabethan Age. One of the famous people who lived during that time was William Shakespeare. During the reign of Elizabeth, there was a general optimism that prevailed in England. She avoided wars as much as possible, and her court was a center for scholars, writers, and other artists. However, after her death, the feelings of the people changed. Shakespeare's work reflected the culture and beliefs of the time period and the change in the people's feelings after Elizabeth's death.

William Shakespeare was born in 1564 in Stratford-upon-Avon, England. He was exposed to a rural life in the countryside of Stratford-upon-Avon, along with the busy life of a market town. There were pageants and shows at the holidays, and two large fairs were held there each year. At some point before 1592, Shakespeare moved to London and started his life working in the theater as an actor and writer of plays. Because of frequent outbreaks of plague between 1592 and 1594, the theaters were often closed. At this time, Shakespeare began writing poetry.
