porcupine quills,

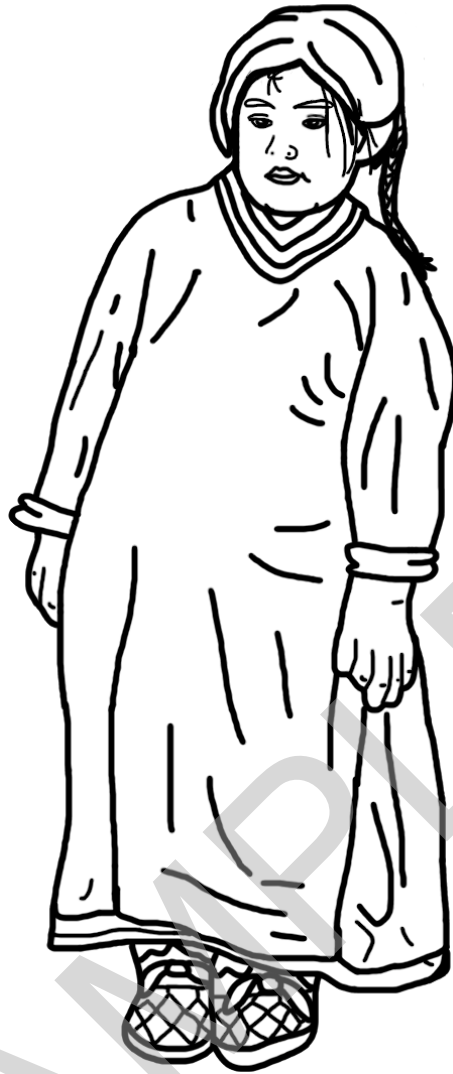
and beadwork.
