
Introduction

30 Days of History is designed to give your students 4-6 weeks of daily work focused on a specific topic or time period. Each unit looks at significant terms and events and asks 7 questions on each that will draw your students into researching and learning more. 30 Days of History: War of 1812 looks at key terms, people, and 18 important battles. This can be used as a supplement to your history class, a tool to help develop research skills, or fun work to fill in as needed. Prelude to the War of 1812

The War of 1812 actually started because of events that were happening in Europe. When Napoleon was emperor of France, he tried to increase the size of his kingdom by conquering other countries in Europe. He very much wanted to conquer Britain, but Britain resisted. As these wars, called the Napoleonic Wars, continued, it began causing problems for other areas as well.
