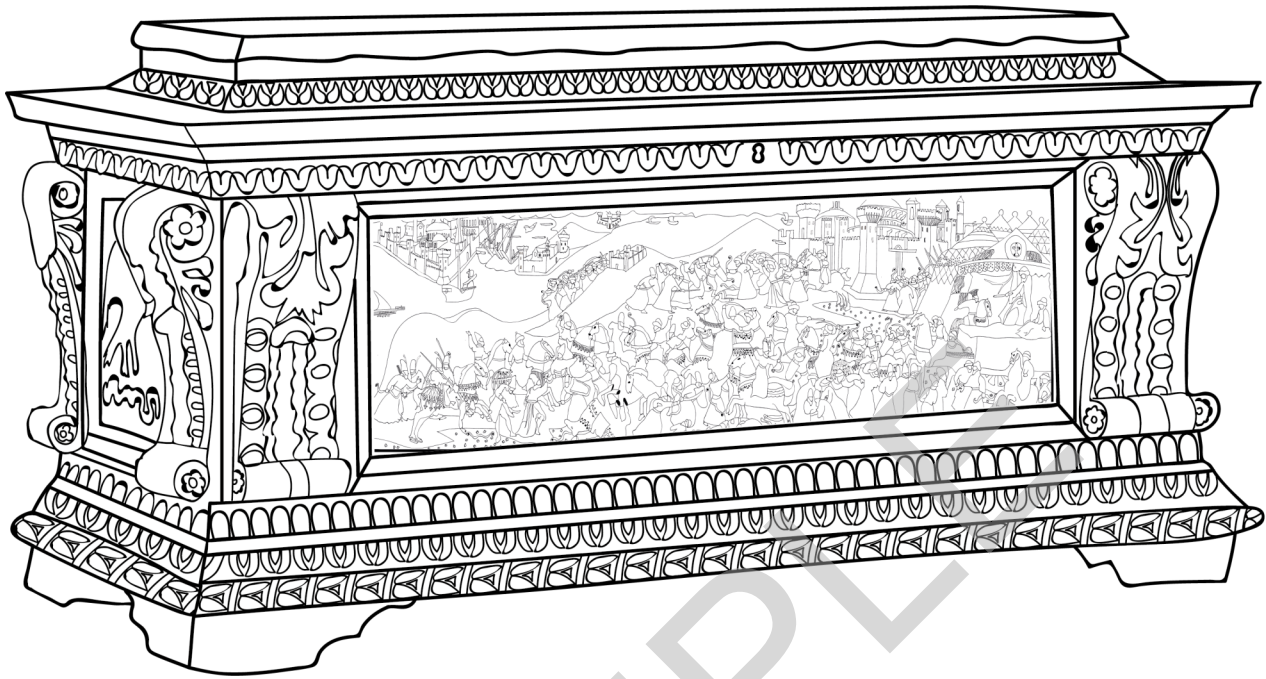
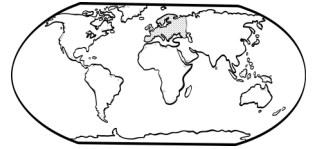




The Ming built much
