

Namibia



Namibia is a country on the southwestern coast of Africa that borders Angola, Botswana, South Africa, and Zambia. It used to be called South West Africa, and it was ruled by Germany and South Africa at different times in its history. It has large areas of hot, dry land and often suffers droughts. It has beautiful beaches along the Atlantic Ocean, but the sand dunes of the Namib Desert aren't far away. Walvis Bay is the nation's most important port and is a great place to spot flamingos. Pelican Point at the bay is home to seals. Some

parts of Namibia's long coast are very dangerous because of reefs, which have earned it the nickname the "Skeleton Coast."

Namibia's official language is English. Farming, fishing, and raising livestock used to be important parts of the nation's economy, but today, mining is one of the most important parts. Diamonds, copper, lead, uranium, and zinc are all found in Namibia.
