


Togo



Togo is a small country in Western Africa and is part of the region known as the Gulf of Guinea Coast. It is very narrow; its coast is only 31 miles (50 km) wide, and the country's widest point is only 87 miles (140 km) wide. But it is very long, stretching about 343 miles (552 km) inland. There is only one major city in the country, the capital of Lomé. The country borders the Gulf of Guinea, which is part of the Atlantic Ocean, as well as Benin, Burkina Faso, and Ghana.

Togo is usually fairly hot and wet. It produces many different crops including cassava, cocoa, coffee, corn, millet, rice, sorghum, and yams. Cattle, chickens, and pigs are also raised. Despite this, Togo is one of the poorest countries in the world, and more is imported into the country than is exported out of the country and sold.

Togo is home to people from more than 50 different ethnic groups, and cultures vary widely from place to place. The nation was also home to people from many different European nations and kingdoms in the past. Today, French is the country's official language.
