#### How to Use

This Rivers Around the World Compare and Contrast Notebook is designed to help students research and discover some of the many rivers found around the world. To get started, students need to locate the first two rivers they are working with. Once they've done so, they can fill out the first page that includes research questions and room to record things such as the types of animals found in or near these rivers, the length of each river, and other interesting facts.

The second assignment is to complete one or two Venn diagrams that illustrate some of the similarities and differences between the rivers such as what animals are present in each and what animals are unique to each. They can fill out the diagram with as much of the information learned as desired.


The third assignment is to draw a picture of one of the rivers, including some of its animals, and to note which animals they included.

The final assignment is for students to create four flashcards that can help them remember key information about animals they discover.

A blank set of worksheets are included at the end for comparing and contrasting additional rivers students are studying.
