

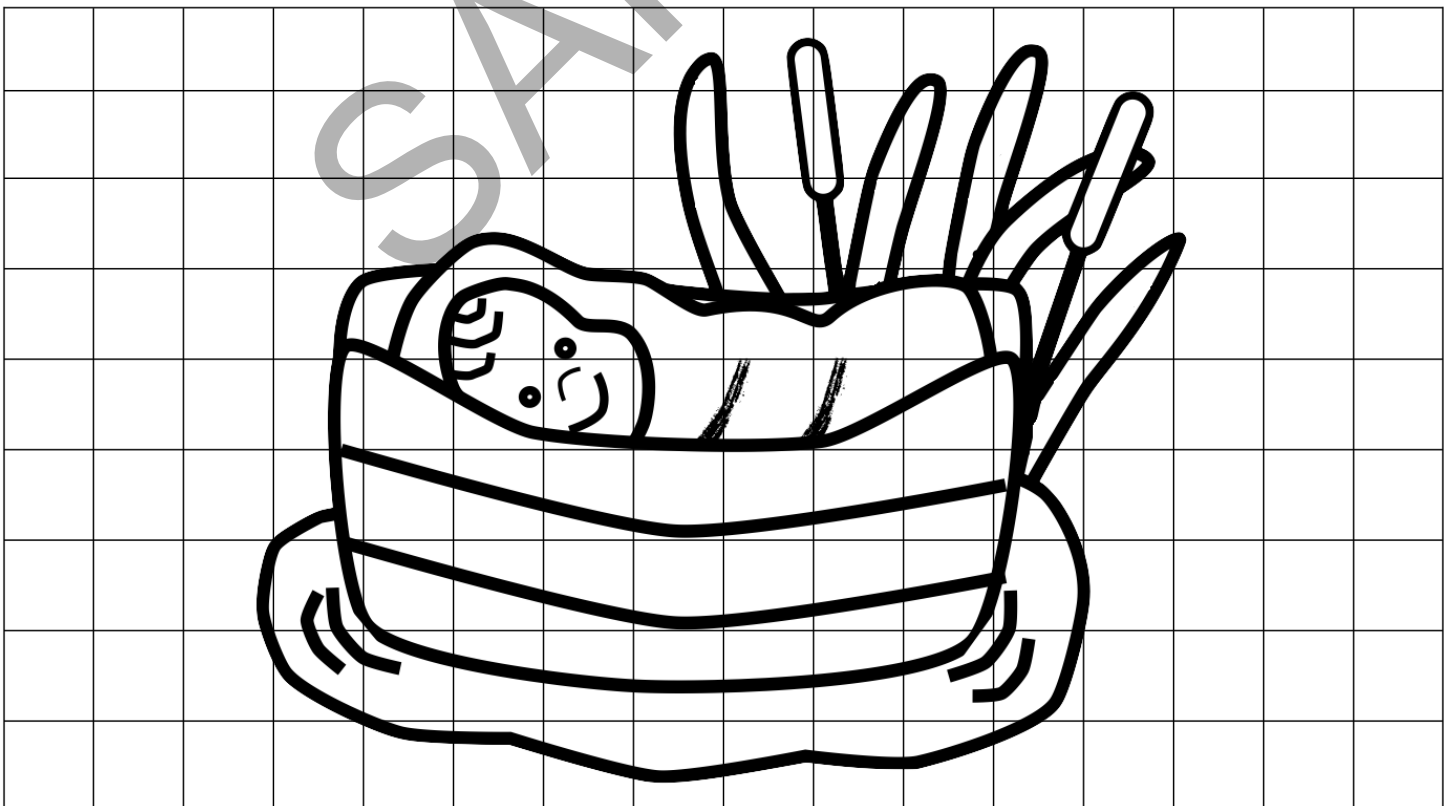
Moses is Born

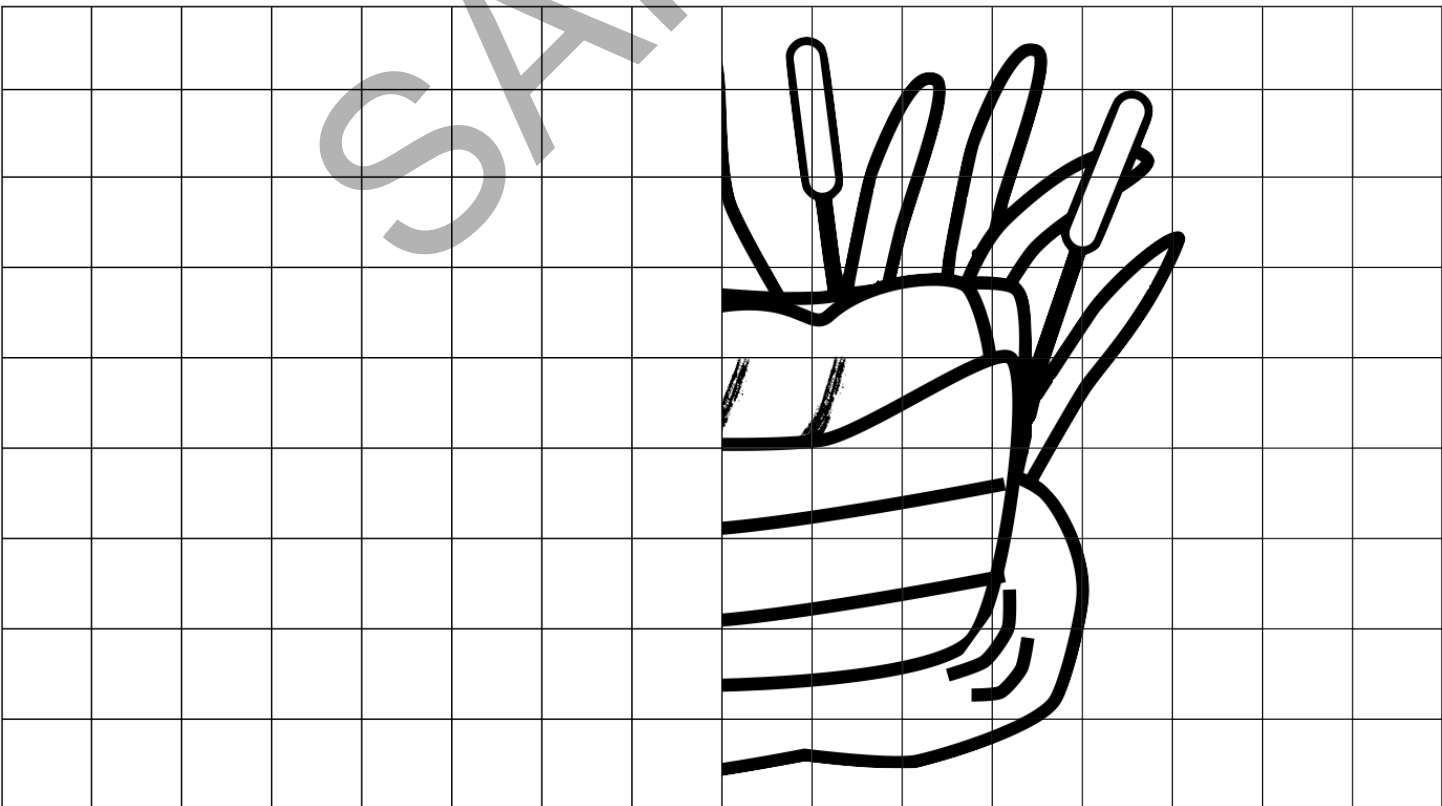
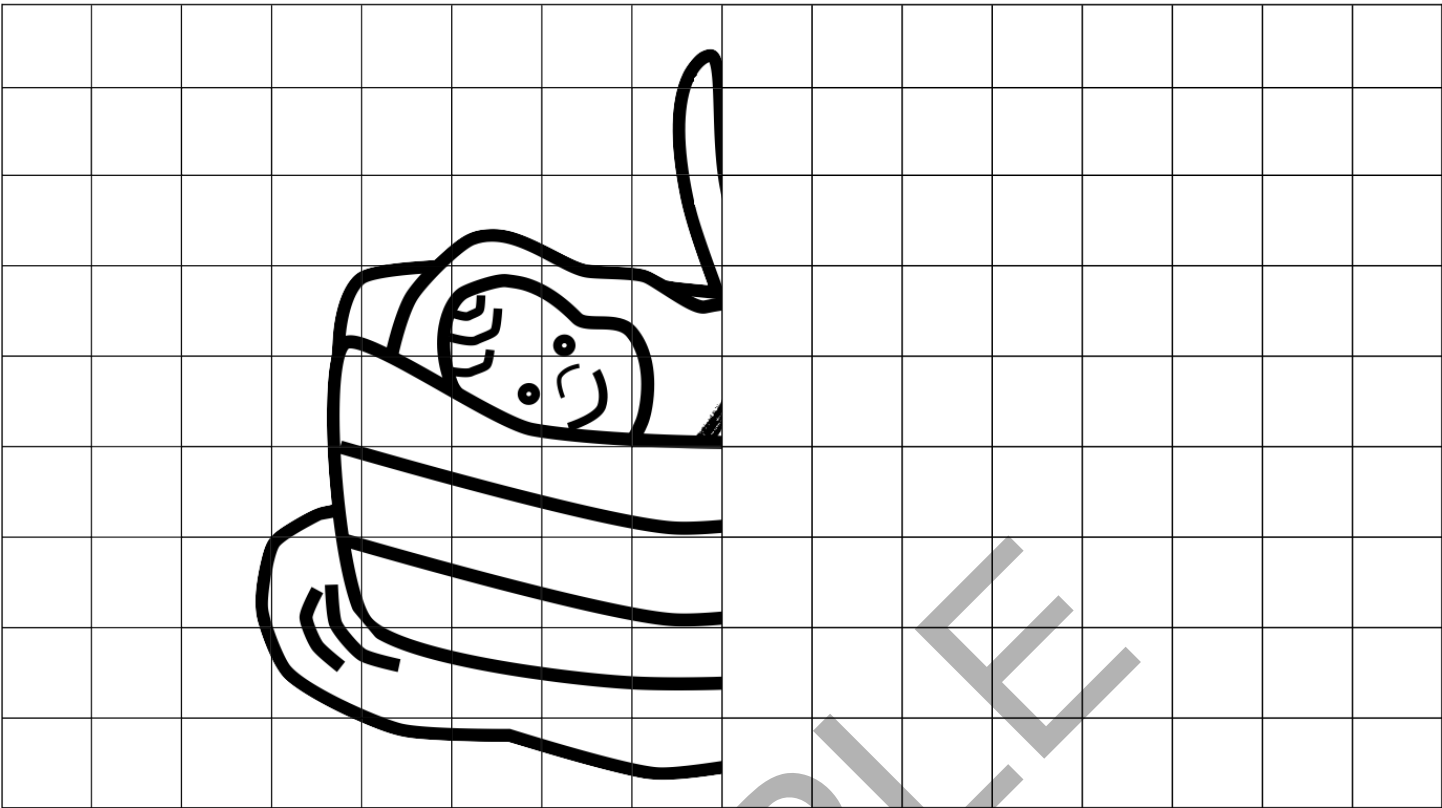
While Joseph's family was in Egypt, his brothers had families, who grew up and had families, who grew up and had families. It didn't take long before there were quite a few Israelites living in Egypt. The pharaoh, the king of Egypt, was afraid that the children of Israel would fight against the Egyptians if there was ever a war, so he made them slaves. Then, since he was still afraid of them, he ordered that whenever a baby boy was born, people should kill the boy so he couldn't grow up and have a family. Baby Moses' parents did not want to kill their son, so his mother hid him for three months. When she couldn't hide him any longer, she put him in a little basket called an ark and put the ark in the river among the bulrushes, hoping someone would find him and take care of him.

And when she could not longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bulrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch, and put the child therein; and she laid it in the flags by the river's brink. And his sister stood afar off, to wit what would be done to him. And the daughter of Pharaoh came down to wash herself at the river; and her maidens walked along by the river's side; and when she saw the ark among the flags, she sent her maid to fetch it. Follow these instructions to draw a picture representing baby Moses like the one shown below:

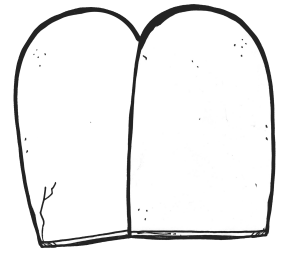
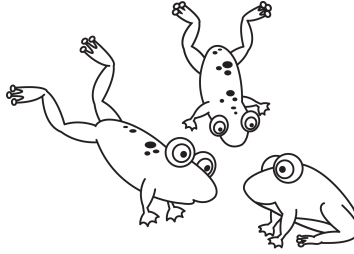

Look at the pictures below. They each represent an event in the life of Moses. Put a number on the line next to each event to show the order they happened in.

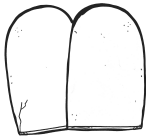
