
Winston Churchill


Winston Churchill was born on November 30, 1874, in Oxfordshire, England. He was not a great student, but he loved the English language and was interested in the military. He attended the Royal Military College at Sandhurst and soon led his class in tactics and fortifications. He graduated high in his class, and in 1895, was appointed a second lieutenant. He resigned from the army in 1899 and ran for office but lost. He was sent to report on the Anglo-Boer War. He was captured but escaped and returned home. He was a hero, and when he ran for office again, he won. During World War I, Churchill was appointed first lord of the Admiralty. He was one of the few people who had expected war with Germany and modernized the Navy in preparation for it. After 1932, he tried to alert the people to the build-up of Nazi Germany. Unfortunately, not many listened, and he was called a warmonger.

In 1940, at the age of 65, Churchill became prime minister of Great Britain. During the Battle of Britain, while Germany was bombing London, Churchill was involved in every aspect of the country. He visited victims of the air raids, visited coastal defenses, and toured RAF headquarters. Churchill joined with President Roosevelt of the United States, and later, Joseph Stalin of the Soviet Union, in meetings concerning the war and how to defeat Nazi Germany. During the Potsdam Conference in 1945, while discussing the fate of Germany after their surrender, Churchill lost his reelection campaign for prime minister. He remained active in politics until 1955. He had a stroke in January 1965, and died nine days later at the age of 90.
