




# Atomium

The Atomium was constructed for EXPO 58, the Brussels World's Fair of 1958. Touring the Atomium, visitors walk through tubes and spheres. There are several levels. On levels one and two, visitors can see documents, photographs, videos, and models that show the history of the Atomium. On level seven, it is possible to compare the view of Brussels seen today with the view that would have been seen in 1958. While it was not intended to be used after the 1958 World's Fair, it was restored at the beginning of the 2000s as a way of showcasing over 60 years of history.

Follow these instructions to draw the Atomium on the next page like the picture shown below:




- Decide if you want to draw the right half of the picture or the left half of the picture and draw it in one of the first two grids. You can draw both if you'd like.
- Now, using a blank grid from the back of the book, try drawing the whole picture.









1. Which picture shows Big Ben? Circle it.






