The differences are mostly due to the fact that some accounts record the date the battle began as when the troops moved in, some use the date when the fighting began, etc. . . . Similarly, some record the end of the battle as when the fighting stopped, when the troops withdrew, etc. . . . You will also find that some battles are part of larger battles, which not only explains the differences in dates, but also the fact that you may have trouble finding some of the battles listed individually.
