

Types of Animals Terminology

Amphibian — Anapsid — Annelid
Aquatic — Arachnid — Arboreal — Arthropod
Artiodactyl — Bivalve — Bovine

Amphibian	a cold-blooded vertebrate; lives in water when young and mostly on land as an adult
Anapsid	a type of reptile with a shell
Annelid	a segmented worm
Aquatic	an animal that grows or lives in or near the water
Arachnid	a type of arthropod with eight legs
Arboreal	an animal that lives in trees
Arthropod	an animal with jointed legs, no backbone; made of sections; exoskeleton made of chitin
Artiodactyl	a hoofed mammal that has an even number of toes on each foot
Bivalve	an animal with a shell that is divided from front to back; has left and right valves
Bovine	a type of wild or domestic cattle
